

Notice of Proposed Major Utility Facility

Sloopy Solar Energy, LLC (Sloopy Solar Energy), an affiliate of Invenergy, is proposing to construct the Sloopy Solar Energy Project, a solar-powered generation facility of up to 180 megawatts on approximately 3,153 acres located in Harmony Township, Clark County, Ohio (solar equipment will be located within an area that is less than 1,897 acres). The general purpose of the facility is to produce clean, renewable, reliably-priced, low-cost electricity to the Ohio bulk power transmission grid operated by PJM Interconnect LLC or under a power purchase agreement.

Sloopy Solar Energy filed its application with the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) for a certificate to construct, operate, and maintain the proposed facility in OPSB Case No. 25-636-EL-BGN on December 23, 2025. The application is currently pending.

On February 13, 2026, the OPSB established the procedural schedule in this case. The public hearing in Sloopy Solar Energy's OPSB case shall consist of two parts:

- (1) A local public hearing, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (R.C.) 4906.08(C), where the OPSB shall accept written or oral testimony from any person, on March 26, 2026, at 5:00 p.m., at the School of Innovation Cafeteria, 601 Selma Road, Springfield, OH 45505.
- (2) An adjudicatory hearing commencing on April 16, 2026, at 10:00 a.m., Hearing Room 11-A, at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. The purpose of the evidentiary hearing is for applicant, Staff, and any intervenors to provide evidence regarding the application.

The public will be given an opportunity to comment on the proposed facility. 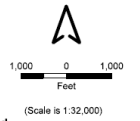
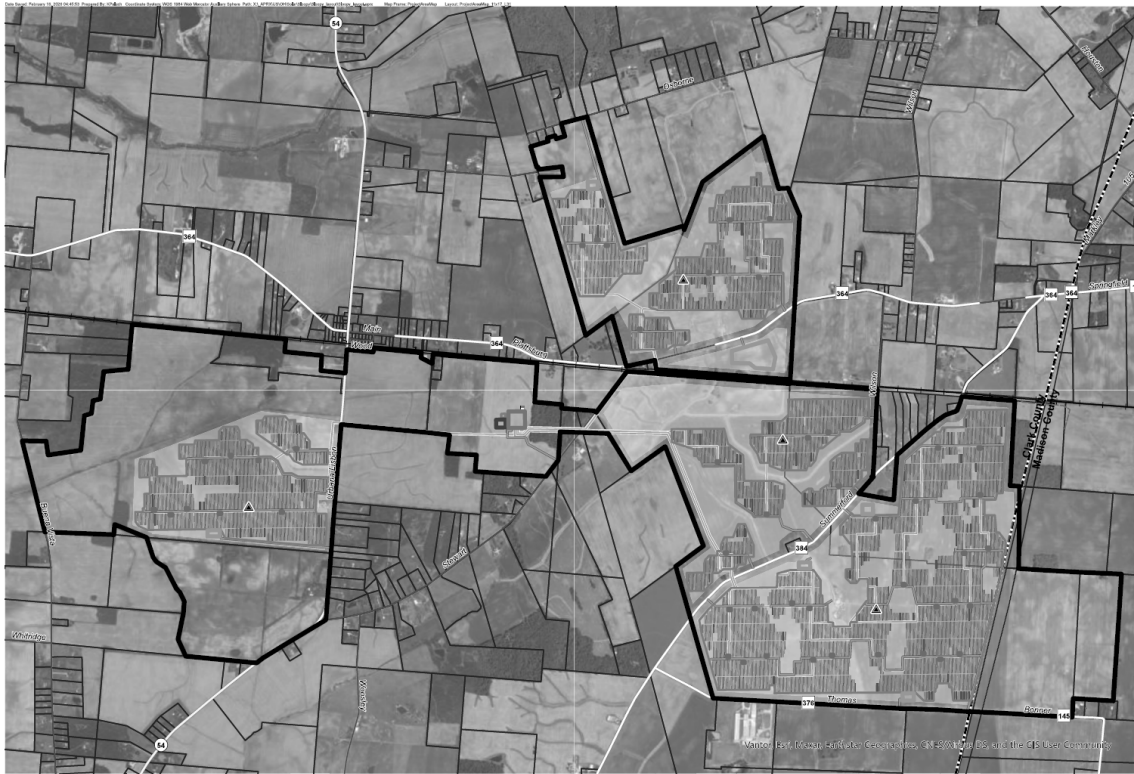
The following officials have received electronic copies of the accepted complete application filed with the OPSB: Clark County Commissioners; Clark County Engineer; Harmony Township Trustees; and Clark County Planning Commission. In addition, an electronic copy of the application, as well as a notice to post regarding the application, was sent to the Clark County Public Library, 201 South Fountain Ave., Springfield, OH 45506. In reviewing an application to construct, operate, and maintain a generation facility, such as the facility proposed by Sloopy Solar Energy, the OPSB considers the following criteria set forth in R.C. 4906.10(A): (1) the nature of the probable environmental impact; (2) that the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives, and other pertinent considerations; (3) that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability; (4) that the facility will comply with R.C. 3704, 3734, and 6111 and all rules and standards adopted under those chapters and under R.C. 1501.33, 1501.34, and 4561.32; (5) that the facility will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity; (6) what the facility's impact will be on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under R.C. 929 that is located within the site and alternative site of the proposed major utility facility; and (7) that the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the OPSB, considering available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives.

R.C. 4906.07(C) provides that the chairperson of the OPSB shall cause each application filed with the OPSB to be investigated and shall, not less than 15 days prior to the date any application is set for hearing submit a written report to the OPSB and to the applicant. A copy of such report shall be made available to any person upon request. Such report shall set forth the nature of the investigation, and shall contain recommended findings with regard to R.C. 4906.10(A) and shall become part of the record and served upon all parties to the proceeding.

In accordance with R.C. 4906.08(C), the OPSB shall accept written or oral testimony from any person at the public hearing, but the right to call and examine witnesses shall be reserved for parties. However, the OPSB may adopt rules to exclude repetitive, immaterial, or irrelevant testimony. Petitions to intervene in the adjudicatory hearing will be accepted by the Board by March 10, 2026. However, the Board strongly encourages interested persons who wish to intervene in the adjudicatory hearing to file their petitions as soon as possible.
