

Community Spotlight: Gratiot County Wind Projects

Since 2012, Invenergy has completed development on four wind energy centers in Gratiot and Isabella Counties. These projects have brought significant economic benefits to the area, and we are proud to be a long-term community partner.

Local Economic Impact

The four Invenergy-developed wind projects have brought significant local economic investment to Gratiot County. Since 2012, the Invenergy projects have invested **\$58M** in total local tax revenue including:



\$29M to local and intermediate school districts



\$19M to County operations and millages



\$6.9M to local townships and cities

Project Spotlight: Calhoun Solar Energy Center

Invenergy's first solar project in Michigan, Calhoun Solar Energy Center (200 MW), reached commercial operations in 2023 and continues to deliver economic benefits to the county, townships, local landowners, and businesses and organizations in the area.

As of 2025, Invenergy has completed development on 4 solar projects and provides operations & maintenance services at 9 more across the state.

Throughout the project's lifetime, the Calhoun Solar Energy Center will bring continued investment to Calhoun County, including:
