Invenergy has completed development on 12 energy projects in Wisconsin and is pursuing additional opportunities in the state.

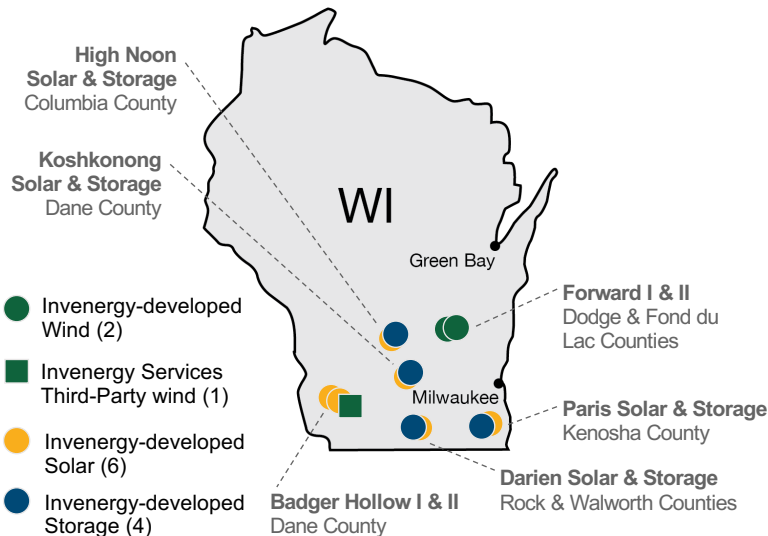


Did You Know:
