Value Stream: Special Pathogen Unit (SPU)

The Corewell Health Special Pathogen Unit is located on 9C at Butterworth. All PPE outlined in this SW may not be available to team members outside of the SPU.

Introduction: The doffing process is conducted under the guidance and supervision of a Hot Zone Boss (HZB), who confirms visually that all steps of the procedure are performed successfully. The Hot Zone Boss uses verbal commands and this written checklist to verify each step in the doffing process. The person doffing will acknowledge each command given by the HZB as an indication of their understanding of the step. The HZB may assist in the doffing process, as required. If the HZB touches any potentially contaminated PPE they will immediately sanitize their outer gloves, remove them, and replace them before continuing with the doffing checklist.

If Team Member makes any error in process the HZB will use critical thinking and open communication to instruct on the best course of action. Often this will require sanitation of the team members hands/gloves, the HZB's hands/gloves or the environment. For example, if team member steps in wrong zone while doffing either the team member or HZB will use a disinfectant mop to clean the area prior to continuing the doffing process.

Finish Doffing single-use coveralls with shoe covers still attached With suit inside out still secure around wrists, push coveralls down to floor, only touching the inside of the suit. Use the inside of suit to assist in loosening footwear for ease of removal. Pull arms completely out of coveralls being careful to keep suit in the Yellow Zone. Step out of the coveralls, one foot at a time, placing clean foot in the green zone. Finish removing other foot from the coveralls, placing both feet within the green zone.
