

# Instructions for Changing Language Settings in Web Browsers

## Google Chrome

1. Click the three-dot menu icon (⋮) in the top-right corner.
2. Go to **Settings**, then navigate to the **Languages** section. A shortcut is to type `chrome://settings/languages` into the address bar.
3. Under "Preferred languages," click **Add languages**.
4. Check the box next to your desired language and click **Add**.
5. Click the three-dot menu (⋮) next to your newly added language.
6. Select **Move to the top** to make it the default for websites, or select **Display Google Chrome in this language** to change the browser's interface language (Windows only).
7. Restart Chrome to apply the changes.

## Mozilla Firefox

1. Click the three-line menu icon (☰) in the top-right corner and select **Settings**.
2. In the "General" panel, scroll down to the **Language** section.
3. Click the dropdown menu and select a language that is already listed, or click **Search for more languages...** to add a new one.
4. If adding a new language, choose it from the list and click **Add**, then **OK**.
5. Use the **Move Up** button to move your preferred language to the top of the list.
6. Click **Apply and Restart** to save your changes.

## Microsoft Edge

1. Click the three-dot menu icon (⋮) in the top-right corner and select **Settings**.
2. Click **Languages** from the menu on the left.
3. Click **Add languages** to find and add your desired language.
4. Click the three-dot menu (⋮) next to the language you just added.
5. Select **Move to the top** for websites, or choose **Display Microsoft Edge in this language** and then click
6. **Restart** to change the interface language.

## Safari (Desktop)

Safari's language is controlled by your macOS system settings, so changing it will also change the display language for other apps.

1. Click the **Apple menu** in the top-left corner and select **System Settings** (or **System Preferences** on older macOS versions).

2. Click **General**, then **Language & Region**.
3. Drag your preferred language to the top of the "Preferred languages" list.
4. Confirm the change in the prompt that appears.
5. Restart Safari for the changes to take effect.

### **Safari (Mobile)**

Similar to macOS, the language in Safari on an iPhone or iPad is controlled by the system-wide settings.

1. Go to **Settings**, then **General**.
2. Tap **Language & Region**.
3. Drag your preferred language to the top of the **Preferred Language Order** list.
4. Restart Safari to apply the changes
