### **Upton Foundation Supports Local Recovery Efforts**

We're pleased to share that we received a \$50,000 grant from the Frederick S. Upton Foundation to expand access to addiction medicine services in Berrien County. This one-year initiative focuses on underserved communities in Niles and Benton Harbor and includes Peer Recovery Coaches, harm reduction strategies, enhanced trauma-informed care, and strengthened coordination through the Behavioral Health Consortium.

### **Cooking for Better Health – Diabetes and Hypertension**



With Foundation funding, additional sessions of *Centered: Cooking for Better Health* are now available. This six-week program, led by a registered dietitian and chef, helps adults managing hypertension, prediabetes, or type 2 diabetes learn practical cooking skills and nutrition strategies for better health. Caregivers are welcome to join.

#### **Success Story:**

Barbara joined the class after an injury left her homebound and struggling with weight and a high AIC. Through hands-on learning and community support, she regained control of her health — lowering her AIC from 9.8% to 6.6%, losing 40 pounds, and improving her blood pressure. "This class helped me turn things around — I can still enjoy food!"

### **Advocating for Home-Based Care on Capitol Hill**

In September, Angela LaBarca, Business Development Specialist for Corewell Health Hospice & Palliative Care Southwest Michigan, attended the 2025 National Alliance for Care at Home's inaugural Advocacy Week in Washington, D.C., thanks to a grant from the Foundation. As Michigan's sole ambassador, she met with over 275 congressional offices to advocate for expanded access to home-based care, ensuring our region's voice was heard on key policy decisions impacting our communities.
