Planned tank maintenance and asset upgrades

As part of Ampol's ongoing asset maintenance program, planned works will soon commence on one of the terminal's fuel storage tanks. The project is expected to begin in late August and will involve routine maintenance and upgrades designed to support the long term safe and reliable operation of the facility.

During the works, Tank 102 will be temporarily taken out of service while a range of maintenance activities are completed, including internal preparation works, upgrades to supporting systems and renewal of the tank's external protective coating.

The project will be delivered by experienced specialist contractors and managed in accordance with strict safety and environmental requirements. We do not expect any significant impacts to the community and will continue to provide updates as the project progresses.

These planned works are part of Ampol's commitment to maintaining its infrastructure to a high standard and supporting safe, reliable operations for the future.

Ampol supports first aid training for Kurnell Public School students

More than 50 Kurnell Public School students recently took part in a St John NSW First Aid Course that was made possible by the Ampol Heart Start Kurnell initiative.

The training gave Year 5 and Year 6 students practical skills to help provide first aid and understand how to respond safely in an emergency.

During the session, students learned key skills including bandaging techniques, snake and bee bite treatment, DRSABCD, including CPR and AED awareness.

There are now over 50 little first aiders in our community, who understand how to potentially save a life - a great outcome for Kurnell.

Ampol renews lease agreement with Kurnell Recreation Club

Ampol has renewed its lease agreement with the Kurnell Recreation Club board for a further four years, continuing a partnership that has supported local sport, recreation and community connection for decades.

The Kurnell Recreation Club was first built by Ampol in 1979 and has remained an important meeting place for local residents, sporting groups and community organisations.

Under the renewed agreement, Ampol will continue to provide the facility at a highly subsidised rate, helping ensure more funds can be directed towards community activities, facilities and local groups.

Kurnell Recreation Club Executive Secretary Manager Peter Cavdarovski said the renewed lease gives the club certainty and supports its role in the local community.

“Ampol’s continued commitment helps the club keep serving and supporting Kurnell and the broader community,” Mr. Cavdarovski said.

“The Reccas is a place of community connection. We look forward to continued growth thanks to Ampol’s commitment.”

Ampol replaces stolen shark bite kit



Ampol has moved quickly to replace the contents of a local shark bite kit that was recently stolen in Kurnell.

The theft is disappointing, given the important role these kits can play in supporting emergency response and community safety.

Early this year, we installed four shark bite kits along the Kurnell peninsula. These kits contain equipment that can support rapid response to serious incidents, including shark attacks.

A shark bite kit was recently used following a shark attack at Coogee, where it helped support the emergency response and contributed to saving the person’s life.

TERMINAL SIREN:

Our siren is tested every day at 12 noon with a 1 x 10 second blast, and 2 x 10 second blasts on Monday. The siren is for on-site personnel only and people in the community do not need to take action.

In the unlikely event of a major incident, that has potential to impact the community, Ampol will provide initial alerts and information via its community notification platform. Residents are advised to always follow and direction from emergency services.
