## **Emergency Preparedness**

The terminal recently hosted a crew from Fire and Rescue NSW – Riverwood Station, on a site familiarisation visit to strengthen local emergency response.

The session gave a detailed overview of terminal operations, layout and safety systems. It also provided an opportunity to discuss how FRNSW and terminal staff can work together in the unlikely event of a major incident.

This proactive approach supports community safety and ensures that in the event of an emergency, all parties are better prepared to respond quickly and effectively.



## MOD - 7 update

Ampol is continuing to progress with a Response to Submissions Report for our Mod-7 application and preparing to lodge our EIS Report for the Kurnell Energy and Industry Hub development application.

As these reports are finalised, we'll share more details and fact sheets to keep you informed. We remain committed to providing regular updates and ensuring the community stays engaged as these projects progress.

## **Heart Start Kurnell**

As part of our continued commitment to safety and connection to our local communities, Ampol has commenced a rollout of public access defibrillators across the Kurnell area, as well as providing CPR training for the local community. This initiative was launched in response to an Ampol employee who was involved in a medical emergency in the local area and recognised the need for more accessible defibrillators.

The program, called Heart Start Kurnell, aims to equip residents with both the tools and knowledge needed to act quickly in an emergency. Public access defibrillators have been deployed, including at Silver Beach Cafe Post Office and Cape Solander.

Since the program commenced, one defibrillator has already been used on a member of the public, providing support before paramedics arrived.

Cardiac arrest can happen without warning and affects more than 9,000 people in NSW each year. That's why we are encouraging locals to register with GoodSAM – an app that alerts trained volunteers when someone nearby needs CPR before paramedics arrive.

This safety initiative, funded by Ampol, provides ready access to critical safety equipment and empowers the local community to feel greater confidence in their ability to respond when it matters most.

#### **TERMINAL SIREN**

Our siren is tested everyday at 12noon with a 1 x 10 second blast, and 2 x 10 second blasts on Monday.

The siren is for on-site personnel only and people in the community do not need to take action.

In the unlikely event of a major incident, that has potential to impact the community, Ampol will provide initial alerts and information via its community notification platform.

Residents are advised to always follow and direction from emergency services.


