FREE Community CPR course

Ampol is proud to continue supporting the Kurnell community through the Heart Start Kurnell initiative.

We are once again providing an opportunity to learn how to administer Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) to help build confidence within the community to step in and assist during an emergency.

When a cardiac event occurs, the first few minutes matter.

Early CPR and use of a defibrillator can make a real difference while emergency services are on the way.

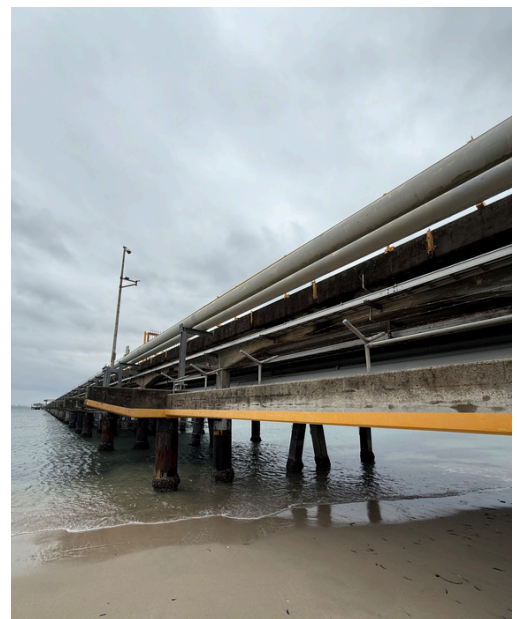
Ampol wharf maintenance

Ampol will soon commence maintenance of pipelines on the Ampol wharf located near the Silver Beach shoreline. This work supports pipeline integrity and safe operations at the terminal.

You may see mobile scaffolding and access platforms along the shoreline to enable safe access to the work area. Spotters will be in place to support pedestrian movement and assist members of the public where required.

The work will be subject to weather and tidal conditions, and is expected to take three to four weeks to complete.

We thank the community for its understanding while this important maintenance is completed.

New child pads added to public access defibs

We have recently taken another step to support community safety with the addition of paediatric pads to the public access defibrillators located at the Silver Beach Cafe & Post Office and the whale watching platform in Kamay Botany Bay National Park.

These pads are designed for use on children aged 0 to 8 years. In an emergency, you can quickly switch from the adult pads by removing them and plugging in the child pads.

The paediatric pads are stored inside each defibrillator unit, to ensure they're ready as required.

TERMINAL SIREN:

Our siren is tested every day at 12 noon with a 1 x 10 second blast, and 2 x 10 second blasts on Monday. The siren is for on-site personnel only and people in the community do not need to take action.

In the unlikely event of a major incident, that has potential to impact the community, Ampol will provide initial alerts and information via its community notification platform. Residents are advised to always follow and direction from emergency services.
