Odour mitigation

Following a review by an independent environmental consultant, we are in the process of implementing enhancements to continue our efforts to mitigate odour at the terminal.

Work will commence in May to reduce the amount of waste that enters the oily water sewer system from the gasoline storage tanks at the northern boundary, minimising vapour release.

An odour abatement system will also be installed at the oily water separators and is designed to draw in vapours which will then then be processed in a twostep "scrubbing" system, minimising residual odour. Equipment and material for this project have been ordered and installation will commence once the current Stormwater Improvement Project has been completed.

A new odour neutralising misting system has been installed at the retention basin and we are now conducting final testing before it becomes fully operational.

We continue to work closely with the EPA on these enhancements and will communicate project updates regularly.

Terminal Updates

Stormwater upgrades - Preparation works are progressing well as we await final approvals from Council. 13 new pumps will be installed to enhance stormwater management across the terminal. Offsite testing of these pumps will be carried out over the coming month. A levee wall will also be constructed around the oily water separators and retention basin to provide additional protection. We anticipate completion by December this year.

Terminal siren - As part of our commitment to provide a safe workplace for our employees and contractors, a new terminal siren will be installed along the Ampol Wharf. The terminal siren is sounded in the event of an incident and alerts Ampol employees and contractors of the need to assemble at the nearest emergency muster location.

Wharf maintenance - You may notice an increase in activity towards the end of the Ampol Wharf over the coming weeks as our contractors progress with inspections and remedial works on under water assets and pipelines.



Amenity upgrade

Following a recent grant from the Ampol Kurnell Terminal, a new footpath has now been constructed at St James Kurnell, providing improved access for the community.

Kurnell strategic review

A strategic review into the Kurnell Terminal is identifying opportunities to create value for Ampol and the community with the activation of unused land, whilst enabling further investment into future energy solutions. One option is the Kurnell Battery Energy Storage System.

To allow the site to potentially accommodate these opportunities, we are planning to relocate, remove and demolish infrastructure currently on the redundant land within the terminal footprint. Further information will be provided as we progress.

In 2024, the Stingrays will field 30 teams from U6's through to over 35's, featuring more than 500 participants.
