MOD-7 & Kurnell Energy and Industry Precinct updates

In February 2026, Ampol completed its review of agency and community submissions received during the public exhibition of Modification Application SSD-5544 MOD-7.

A Submissions Report was then provided to the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI), addressing the key issues raised.

Ampol also continued community and stakeholder engagement providing information and updates on the projects.

Ampol has since received comments from DPHI and relevant government agencies and is currently reviewing the matters raised.

Once this work is completed, the Modification Application is expected to be referred to the Independent Planning Commission (IPC) for determination.

Alongside this work, Ampol is progressing the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Kurnell Energy and Industry Precinct application (SSD-86799993).

Ampol will be coordinating community information sessions in the coming months. These sessions will focus on key topics raised, including hazards and risk, traffic, noise and flooding.

Further details on session locations and timing will be shared when available.

FREE Community CPR course - last chance

We received a strong response from the community to the Heart Start Kurnell program that provides an opportunity to participate in free CPR and defibrillator training.

Registrations exceeded expectations, with courses quickly filled. A fourth and final course date has now been added, providing another opportunity for community members to take part.

The final course will be held on **Monday 10 August**, with a limited number of places still available.

These sessions provide practical training in CPR and the use of a defibrillator, helping build local capability and confidence to respond in an emergency.

Our siren is tested every day at 12 noon with a 1 x 10 second blast, and 2 x 10 second blasts on Monday. The siren is for on-site personnel only and people in the community do not need to take action.

In the unlikely event of a major incident, that has potential to impact the community, Ampol will provide initial alerts and information via its community notification platform. Residents are advised to always follow and direction from emergency services.
