How Do We Know?

AVID develops intentional readiness by exposing students to rigorous instruction and supporting them in exploring, preparing for, and navigating their chosen postsecondary pathways.

83% took at least one course of rigor.

93% completed the 4 years of rigorous coursework necessary for college admission.


88% submitted the FAFSA.
