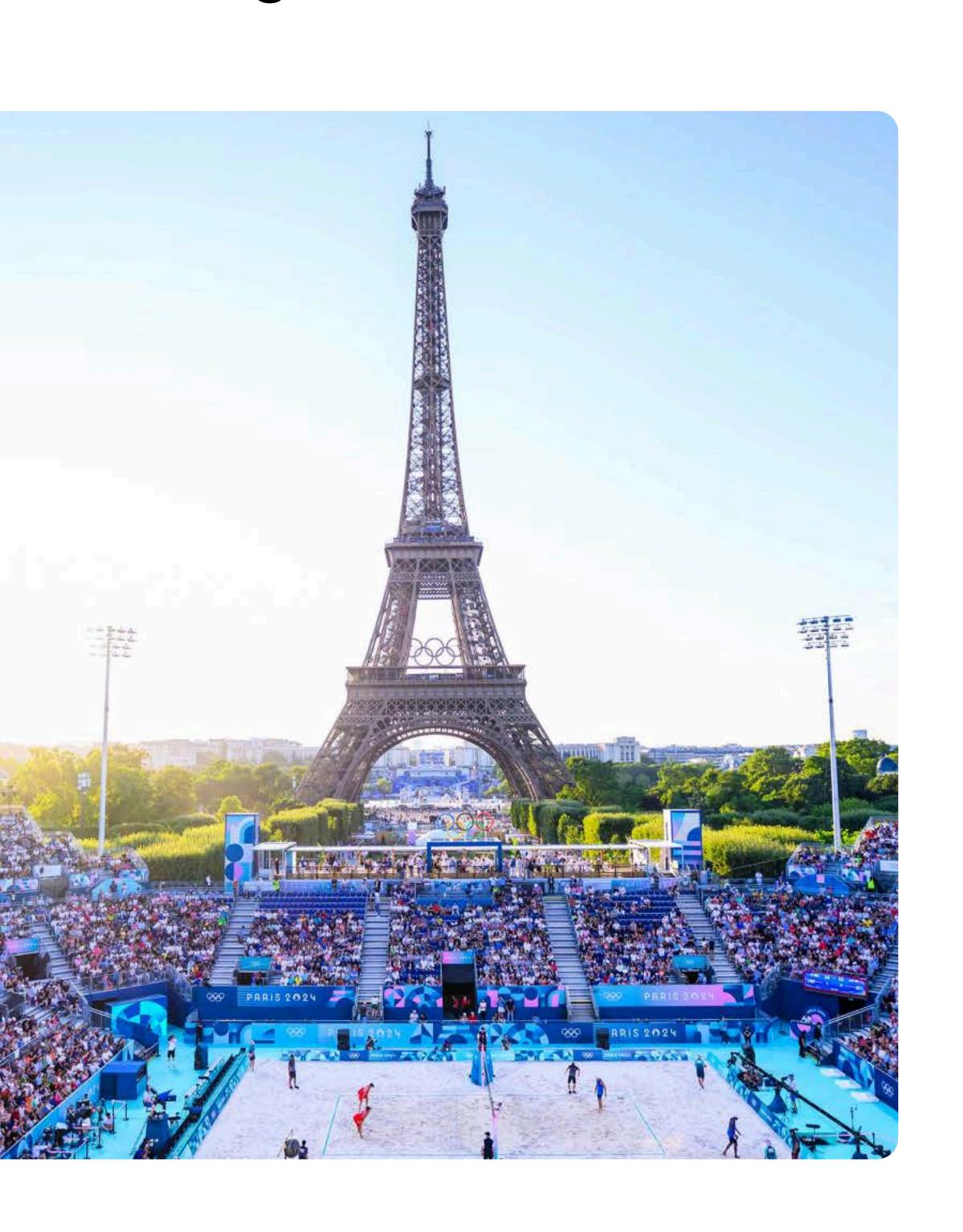
As the world came together for the Olympic and Paralympic Games, Comcast NBCUniversal brought the action home — delivering the most comprehensive viewing experience in history and using the power of the Games to unite and uplift communities across the globe.

We launched the Games with a \$35 million commitment to community organizations helping to train the "Team of Tomorrow" — the next generation of innovators, entrepreneurs, and creators. We also supported the International Olympic Committee's **Olympic Refuge Foundation**, helping athletes on the Refugee Olympic Team prepare and compete on the global stage.

NBCUniversal's Creative Impact Lab partnered with the **Challenged Athletes Foundation** (CAF) and nonprofit agency **Venice Arts** to produce a national public service announcement featuring U.S. Paralympic Silver Medalist Derek Loccident. The inspiring spot aired across donated on-air and digital platforms, reaching millions and driving a surge in engagement with CAF's mission.

As a proud partner of Team USA, Comcast sponsored 16 athletes competing in Paris 2024. We also introduced "Passport to Paris" for Xfinity customers, offering new ways to watch, engage, and feel like part of the Olympic experience.

While we continue to celebrate this joyful and inspiring chapter of the Games' history, we're already building momentum for Milan 2026 and Los Angeles 2028.

Enhanced Accessibility for Olympics Coverage

Paris 2024 coverage reached a broad audience. Current service members and veterans worldwide enjoyed free access to stream NBCUniversal's full coverage of the Games, courtesy of a partnership with the **Army & Air Force Exchange Service**. In a first for a U.S. broadcaster, audio description services for NBC coverage were provided, enhancing the quality of sound for Xfinity customers who watched the Games on the Xfinity X1 platform.

More audio description services than ever before – interspersing broadcast audio with skilled voices describing Olympic and Paralympic scenes and context – were available for viewers who are blind or visually impaired.







The NBC Olympics broadcast of the Paris 2024 Games earned a Green Seal from the Environmental Media

Association, the first for NBC Sports.

Universal Epic Universe

Universal Epic Universe in Orlando is the most ambitious and most technologically advanced park we've ever built, and the first major theme park to open in the United States in the last quarter of a century.



An Epic Impact

Universal Epic Universe is more than just a game changer in theme park entertainment – it has also stimulated economic growth and generated thousands of jobs nationwide. This world-class entertainment resort complex will draw millions of new visitors, boost tax revenues, drive traffic to new and established businesses, enhance local infrastructure, and facilitate community investment.

Our community investments are long-term ventures designed to foster cultural vitality, drive economic growth, and forge connections that deliver lasting benefits as we care for and protect our environment.

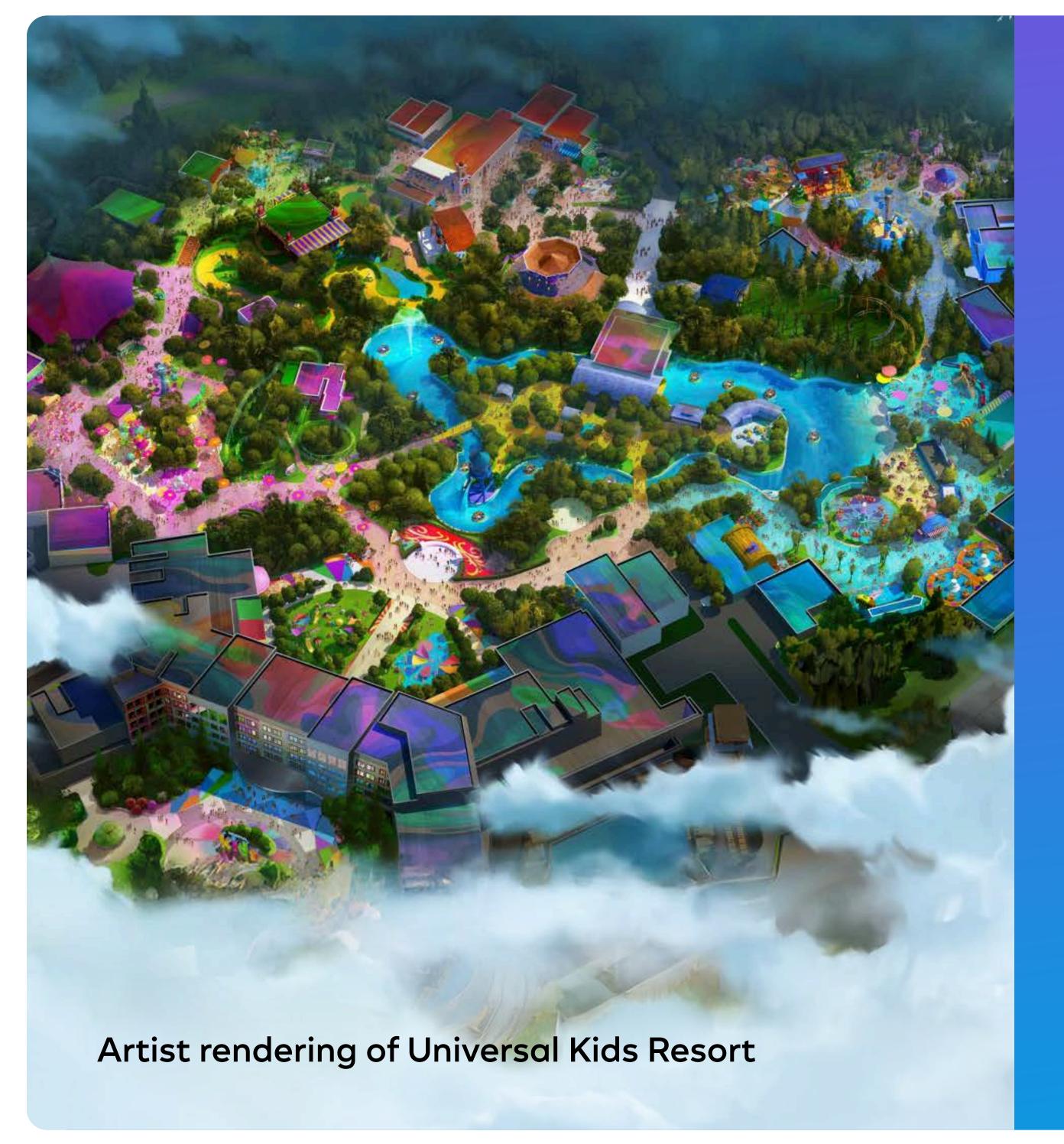
Universal Orlando Resort in partnership with the Universal Orlando Foundation focuses on expanding opportunity and access through collaborative programming, partnerships, skills enhancement, as well as grant support. Over the last five years, more than \$70 million in cash donations, in-kind contributions, and grants has been provided by the company and the Foundation.

The Universal Orlando Foundation gives to programs such as **The Art of Tomorrow**, a collaboration between Orange County Public Schools, Universal Orlando Resort, and the Foundation that offers hands-on, curriculum-based opportunities for eighth grade students to explore arts and entertainment careers.

Bites, Camera, Action! in partnership with Second Harvest Food Bank, Orange County Public Schools, Universal Orlando Resort, and the Universal Orlando Foundation supports school children, families, veterans, and other residents of Central Florida. Since its inception, it has delivered over two million meals.

Sustainability and accessibility features are integrated seamlessly into Universal Epic Universe. It has received a Platinum certification under LEED for Communities: Plan and Design, demonstrating a commitment to sustainability and innovation by integrating energy efficiency and sustainable construction practices during the planning and design of the transformative theme park.

In addition, park entrances and all attractions are accessible for guests using wheelchairs and mobility devices, and passes are available for guests whose disabilities prevent them from waiting for extended periods in a conventional queue.



OPENING IN 2026

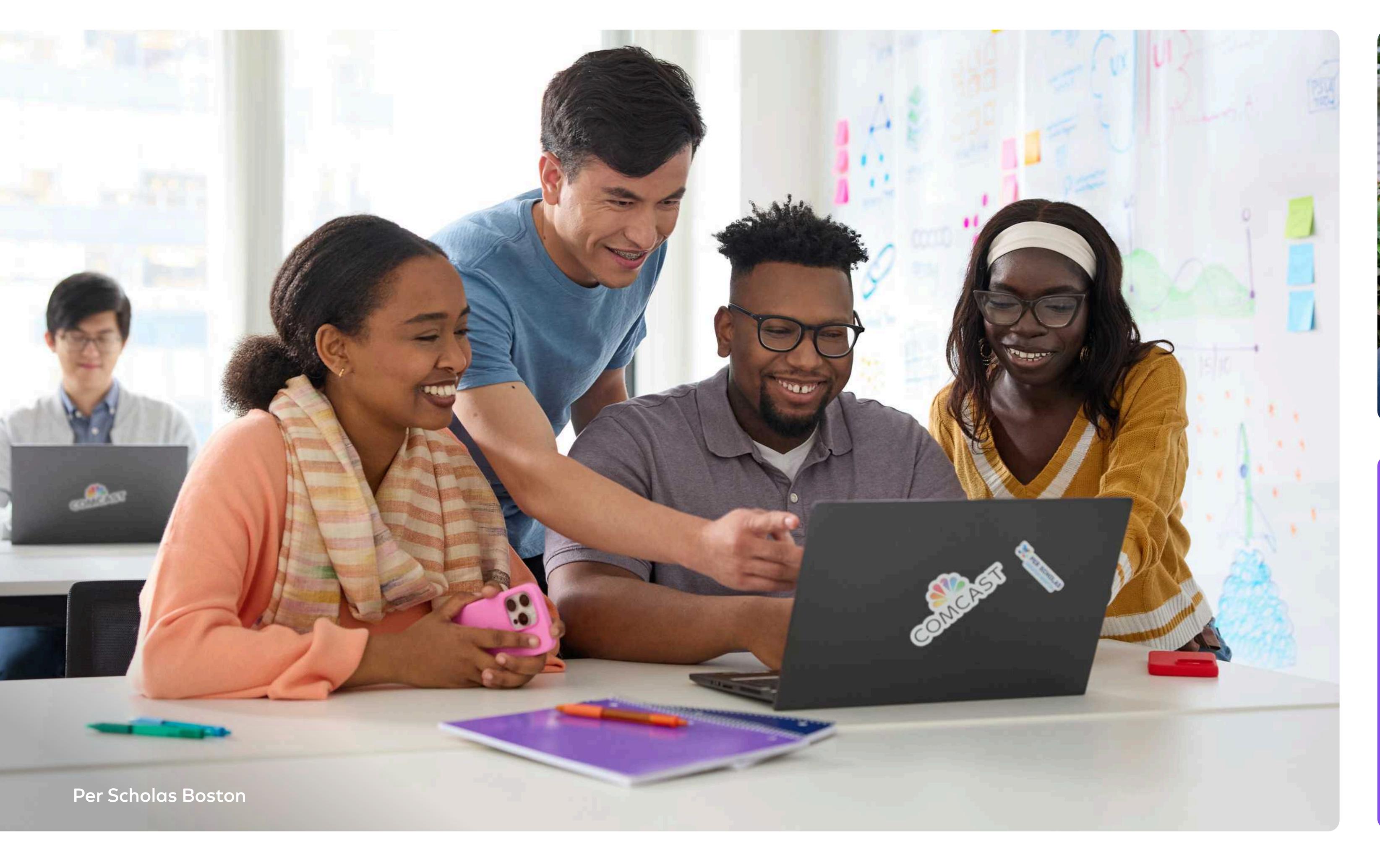

Digital Adoption

We are investing tens of millions of dollars in programs that connect people to Digital Navigators, trusted community members who are trained to help others get online, use devices, and learn digital skills.

Aligned with Xfinity's ad campaign for "The Aviators," Comcast launched an enhanced Xfinity Military Customer Benefits Program. We also committed \$1 million to several military community-serving organizations, such as **NPower**, which provides job placement services and free technology training.



"Getting Connected: Powered by Comcast Newsmakers" is an interview series that spotlights leaders from across the United States whose work focuses on topics including digital opportunity and broadband access. Segments are available online and on Xfinity On Demand.

Telemundo and Comcast joined forces with the Hispanic Heritage Foundation to donate 2,500 laptops to students at more than a dozen nonprofits nationwide, including Amigos for Kids in Miami.

We expanded our digital navigation efforts by deepening support for the American Connection Corps (ACC). For example, in Williston, Vermont, an ACC Member is working to increase digital literacy and support through a local organization, Technology for Tomorrow. Approximately 33 member host sites received financial support from Comcast in 2024.

Lift Zones & Digital Hubs

Through more than 1,250 Lift Zones in the United States and 70 Sky Up Hubs across the U.K., Ireland, and Italy, we deliver free WiFi access in community spaces, ensuring people have the connectivity they need outside their homes. Community members can get online at a Lift Zone in cities such as Baltimore, Boston, Colorado Springs, Fort Wayne, and Miami, to name a few.

Building on the legacy of our award-winning Lift Zones, in 2024 we introduced Flagship Lift Zones, where Comcast provides partners with additional resources to enhance access to digital skills training and workforce development services. Our first flagships include **Inspiredu** in Atlanta and **SERJobs** in Houston.

The **Lacey Veterans Services Hub** in Washington provides a safe and secure place for veterans, service members, and their families to access high-speed internet and attend telehealth appointments.



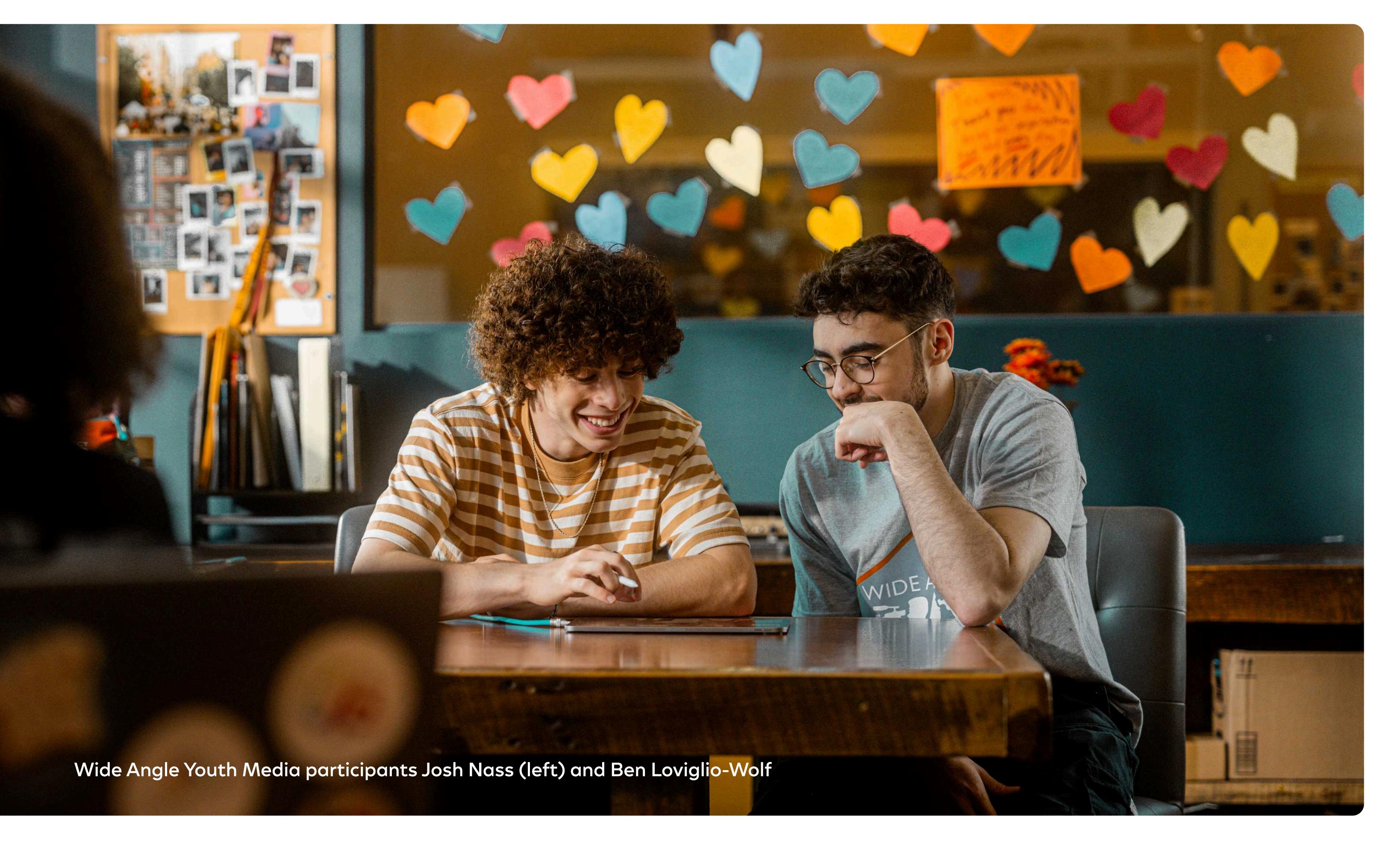

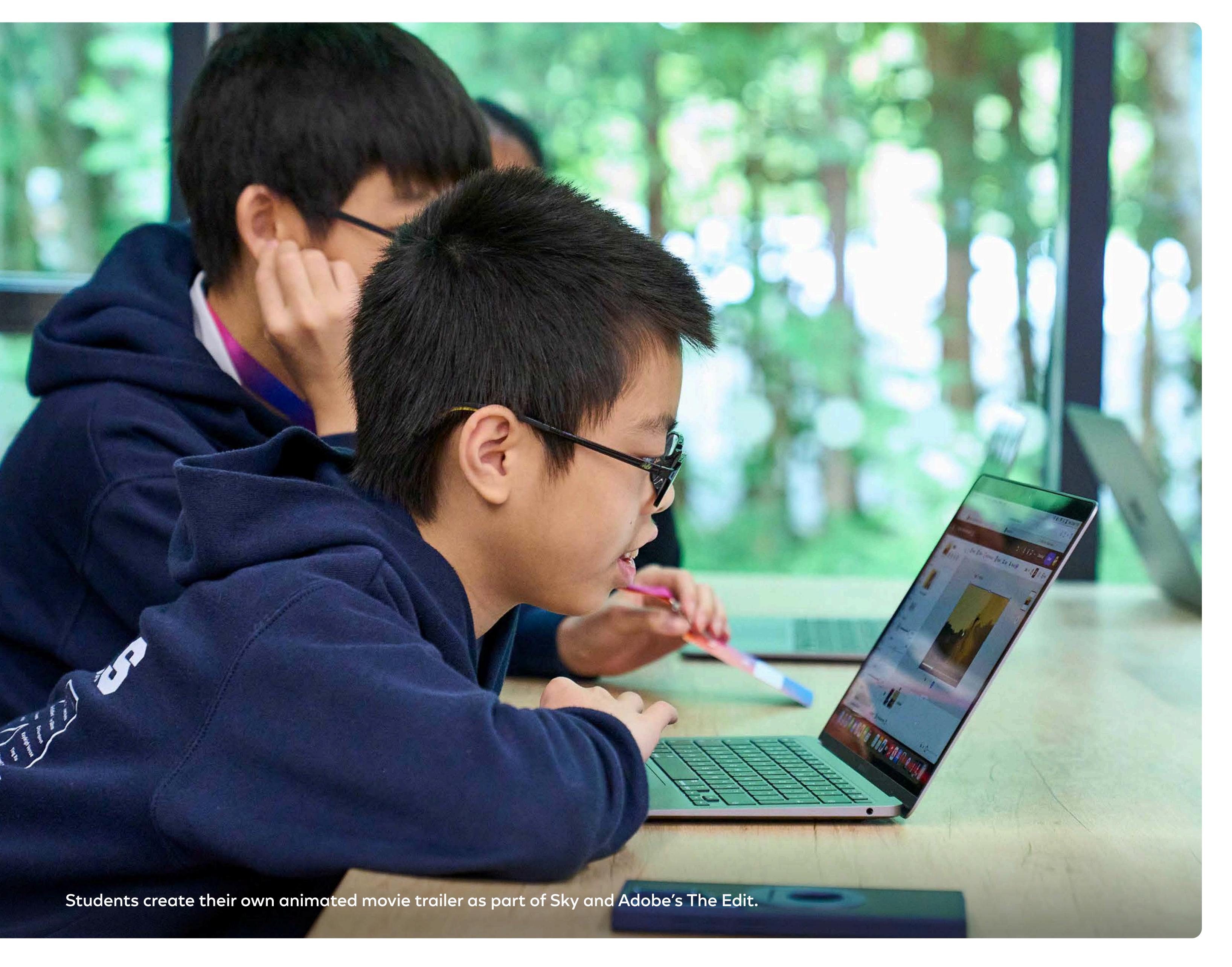
Digital Workforce of the Future

The "Talent for Tomorrow Grant Challenge" is an initiative with the **U.S. Conference of Mayors** to support the launch and expansion of local workforce programs. The program is designed to grow college and career readiness, close the digital skills gap, advance economic mobility, and build generational wealth in communities. The Challenge awarded a total of \$1.5 million to 10 cities to support local workforce development and jobs training programs across growth sectors.

We support **Per Scholas**, a nonprofit partner that provides tuition-free technology training to adult learners. Comcast's investment will help Per Scholas increase the capacity of its training programs, update its curriculum, and strengthen job placement services.

Next-Gen Media Pipelines

We provide opportunities and exposure for the next generation to explore careers in journalism, media, and film.

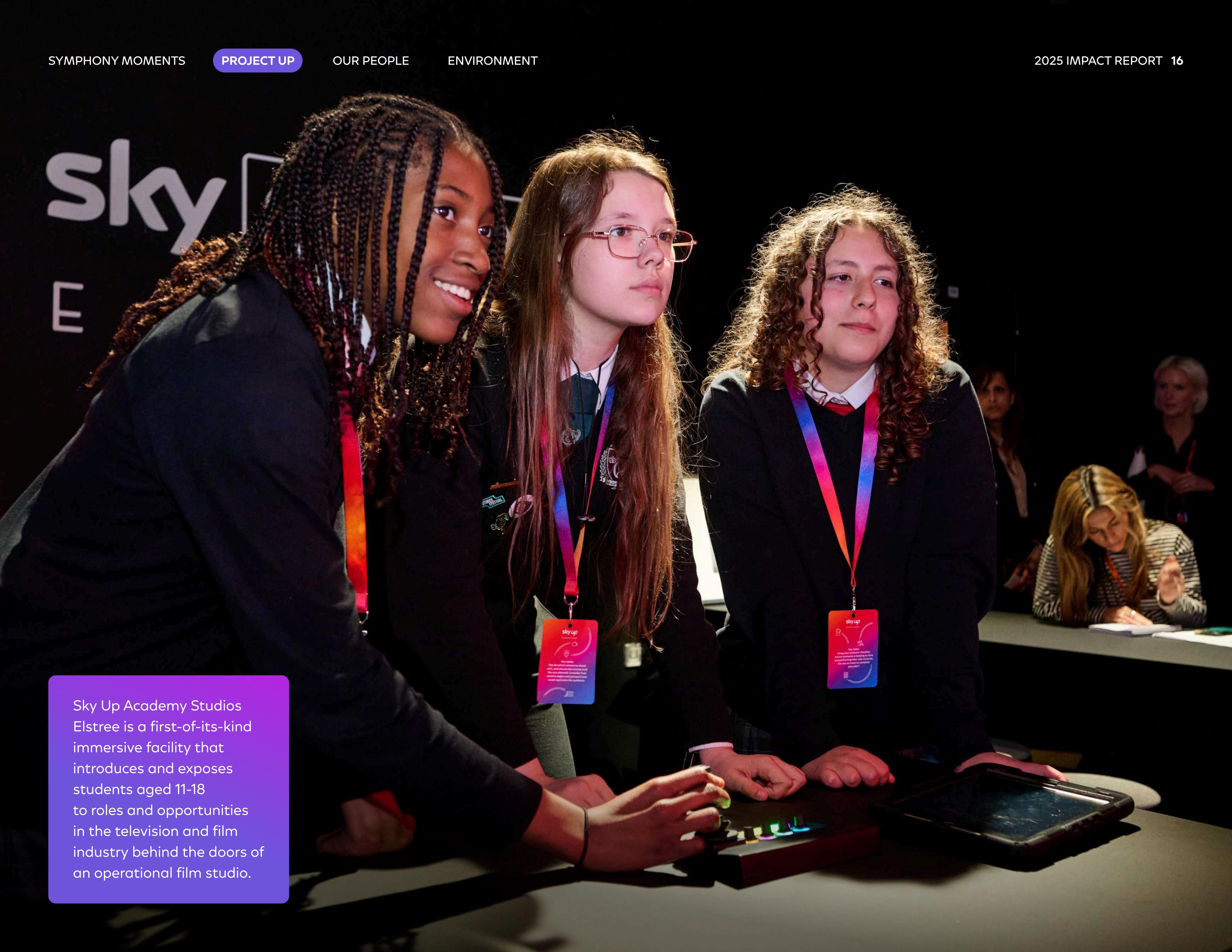

TEAM UP LEADER NETWORK

In 2024, our inaugural cohort of 50 Comcast employees stepped up for the Team UP Leader Network, spearheading volunteer service projects and inspiring their teammates to collectively contribute 2,500 volunteer hours.



Sky Cares hit a major milestone: Employees have volunteered 250,000 hours since the program began in 2019.

Universal Orlando volunteers completed numerous beautification projects at the **Sunshine Foundation Dream Village**. The Village is an accessible and welcoming place for families to stay when they visit theme parks and attractions through the Sunshine Foundation, a children's charity that grants wishes to children with lifelong chronic illnesses or conditions.

Over 400 NBCUniversal employees volunteered for NBCUnites Ambassador projects, including creating care packages for hospitalized children, building hockey rinks, renovating housing, and assisting families living in poverty.

Telemundo organized a team of 15 volunteers to host a Minion-themed holiday party for 300 children in foster care and families in need at the **Children's Home Society of Florida** in Miami.

Natural Disaster Support

When emergencies strike, we step up to support our employees — and our employees step up to help each other. The Comcast NBCUniversal **Employee**Disaster Assistance Fund provides grants to assist teammates during times of unexpected need. Anyone can

donate to the fund, and 100% of every donation is delivered to a Comcast NBCUniversal employee. For example, after the California wildfires, Comcast offered a double match for employee donations made to the fund and donated \$10 million to relief efforts.

When Hurricane Milton caused widespread destruction and power outages in Florida, Comcast donated \$250,000 total to the Florida Disaster Fund and 11 community-based organizations to help with recovery.

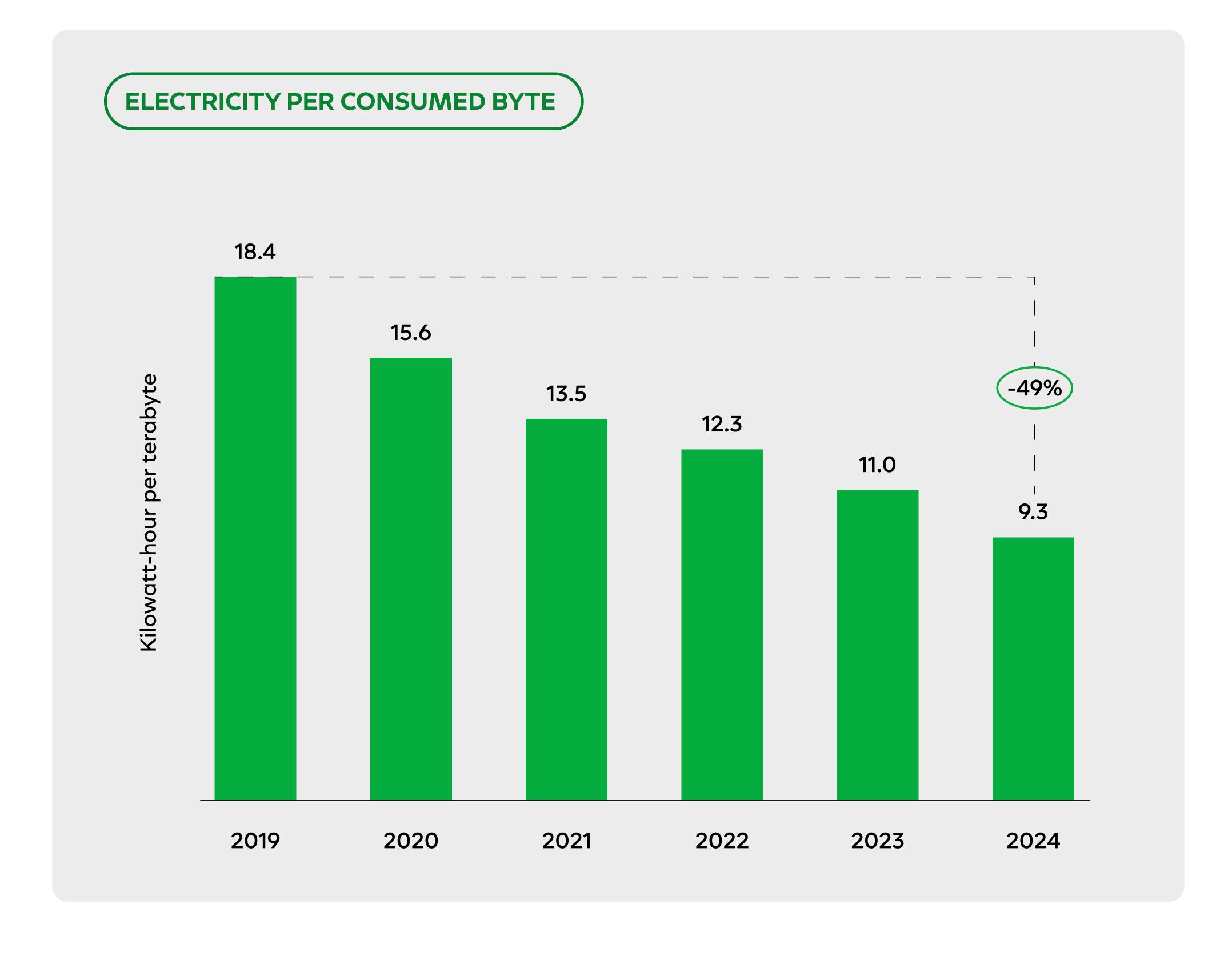
We're driving innovation and impact through our network and products, investing in our theme parks and studios, and supporting operational efficiency across our business.

Network

We've invested billions of dollars to expand our network, creating a smarter, faster, and more reliable connection to meet and exceed every customer's increasing demand for speed and capacity. We also take care to grow our network efficiently.

ENVIRONMENT

Comcast set a goal to double network energy efficiency by 2030. So far, we've reduced the amount of electricity it takes to deliver each byte of data across our network by 49% since 2019. We've also begun deploying technology that will enable us to accelerate the use of AI to drive efficiency in the future.



Energy Spotlight

Comcast's campus in West Chester, Pennsylvania, which houses energy intensive technical infrastructure such as data centers and engineering departments, has adopted a holistic energy management plan, which includes deployment of Comcast Smart Solutions IoT technology to enable accurate, real-time monitoring of energy consumption. This technology, combined with other network virtualization and efficiency measures, helped the campus team realize electricity savings in 2024 equivalent to more than 150 homes' energy use for one year.

Products

Our dedication to sustainable innovation includes designing products and packaging that improve the entertainment experience, utilize recycled materials, reduce waste, and boost efficiency in ways that can save our customers energy and money.

More Energy Efficient Technology



We continue to work with industry peers to improve the energy efficiency of **small network equipment**, collectively decreasing the weighted average power of modems, routers, and other home internet equipment by 89% relative to broadband speed since 2015.



Sky Stream is Sky's lowest-powered entertainment device yet. The compact plug-and-play device lets customers stream entertainment via WiFi straight to any TV, without a dish – reducing materials, conserving energy, and cutting emissions compared to other Sky set-top boxes.



Building on the sustainability credentials of the first model, the **Sky Glass Gen 2** 55" and 65" TV models are more energy efficient than the original Sky Glass models of comparable size. The new models also contain parts made from recycled aluminum, recycled solder for the printed circuit board, and recycled plastic.

Connectivity With Conservation at the Core

We pride ourselves on building products that are made to last, as reliability is the foundation of our business. That's why our design teams work to extend the life of devices and reduce waste.

Our latest generation of WiFi devices use 85% post-consumer recycled materials, reducing waste to landfills.

We maintain long-standing refurbishing programs that reduce waste by enabling reuse of certain returned devices until the end of the product's life. Our latest devices are designed to be easily assembled, repaired, reused, and recycled.

Through a National Recycling
Program, we aim to recycle or
divert certain cable equipment
waste from landfills through
recovery and redistribution
of materials.



Xfinity's Most Sustainable Packaging Yet

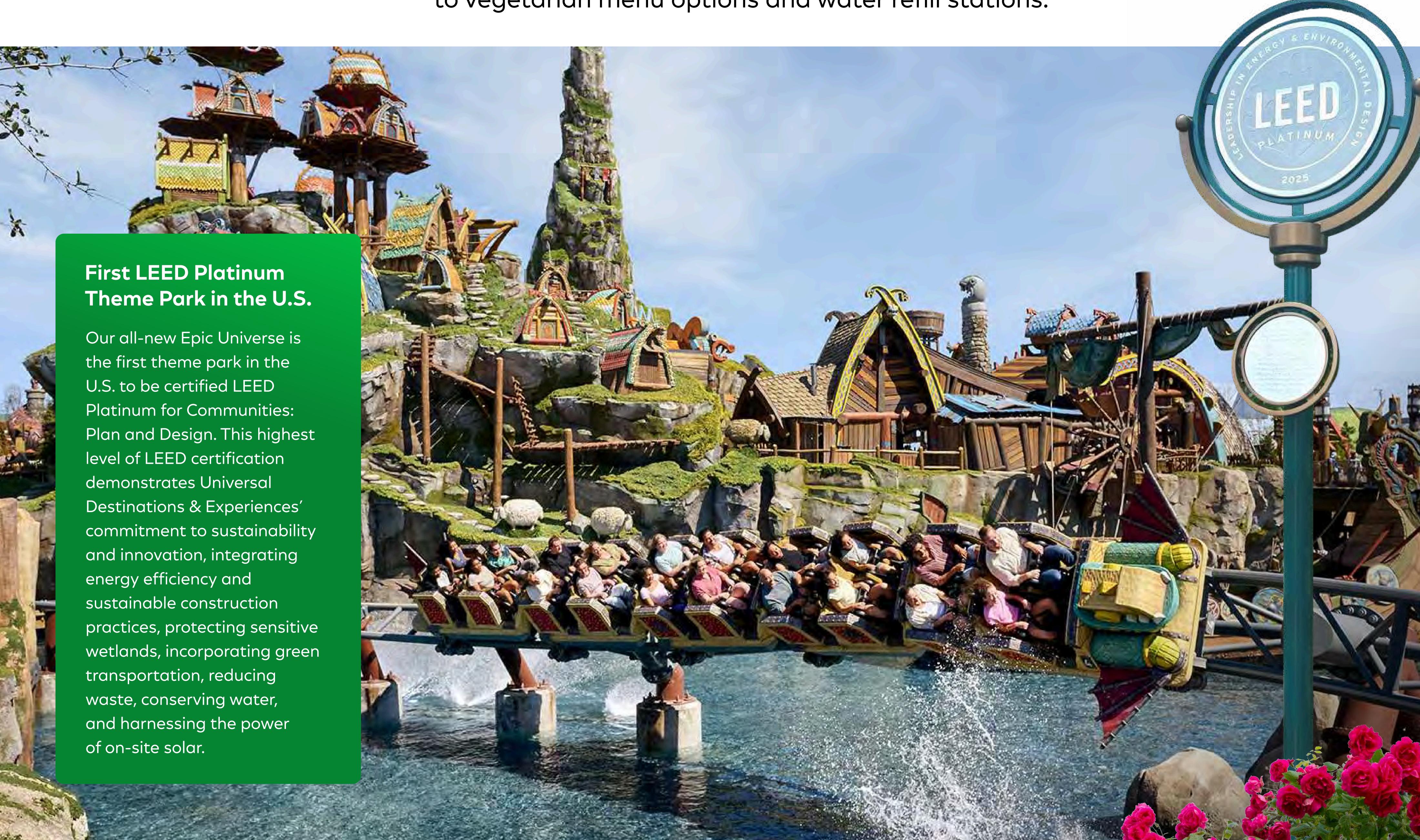
From design and manufacturing to shipping and recycling, Xfinity's latest packaging is made in America and designed with conservation and efficiency in mind.

We recently shifted to domestic manufacturing, eliminating overseas shipping and reducing associated emissions by approximately 90% compared to previous packaging solutions. A modular box reduces the need for plastic and paper padding, and we use only Forest Stewardship Council-certified recyclable materials and water-based ink.



Theme Parks

Sustainability features are designed seamlessly into our theme parks, from thoughtfully integrated green spaces and energy efficient technologies to vegetarian menu options and water refill stations.



Studios

Our world-renowned studios are transforming productions to be more sustainable behind the scenes and on the big screen.

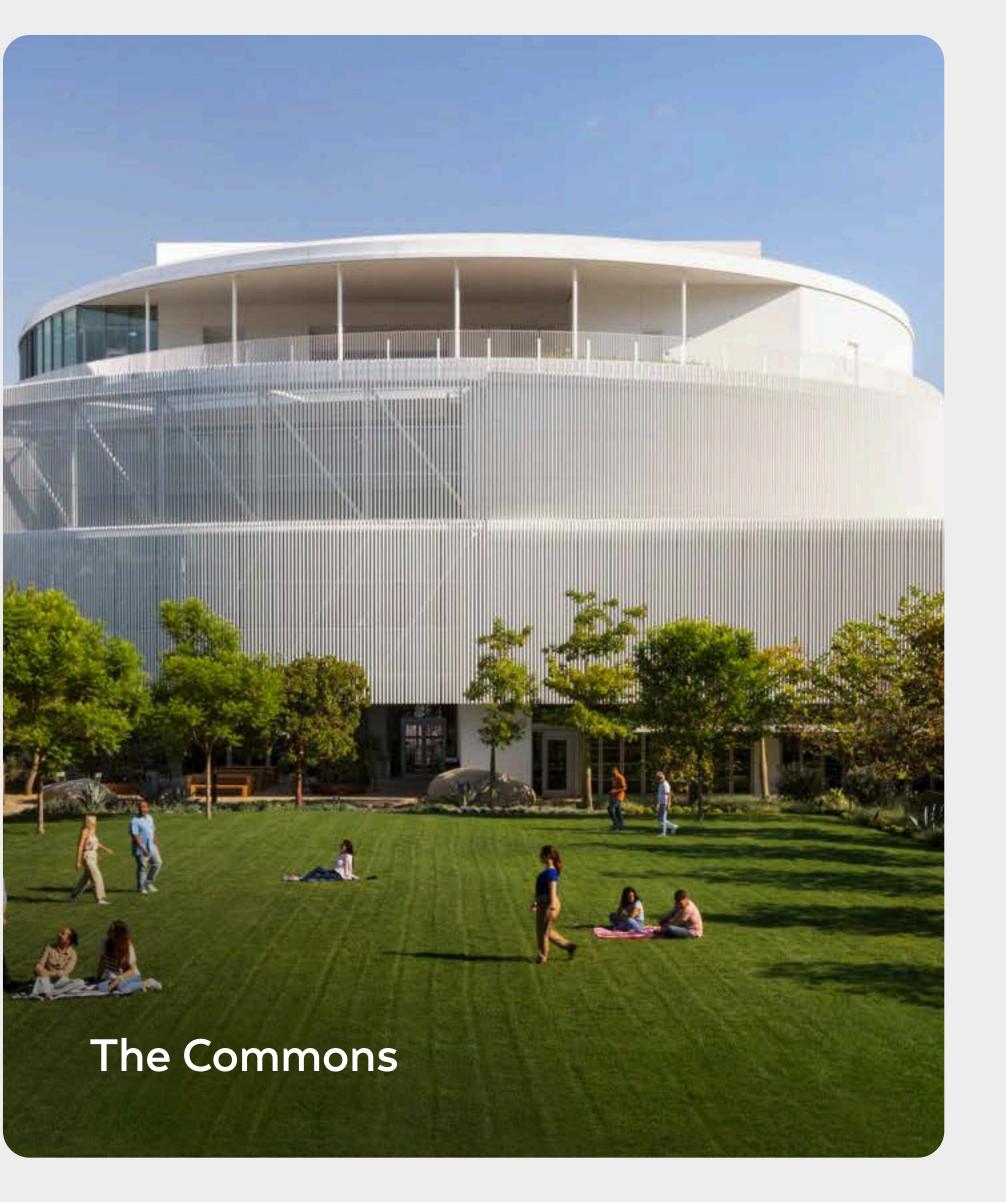
Buildings

The new Assembly Studios in Atlanta is equipped with sustainability features including stage sub-metering and connected building software to closely monitor energy use and address inefficiencies. It also has three-stream waste bins, a food donation program, 21 electric vehicle (EV) chargers, and water refill stations at each of the 19 stages. In addition, Universal Production Services at Assembly offers LED lighting, battery units, and 15 solar-powered trailers to productions for rent.

In California, the Universal Studios
Lot opened two new buildings in
2024. The Commons and One
Universal, both LEED Platinumcertified buildings, are connected
by The Paseo, an outdoor gathering
and meeting space. These buildings
made the Universal Studios Lot the
first Hollywood studio to earn not one
but two LEED Platinum certifications
on the property. The Commons also
received the 2024 California Green
Building award for merit in Energy
& Operational Carbon.



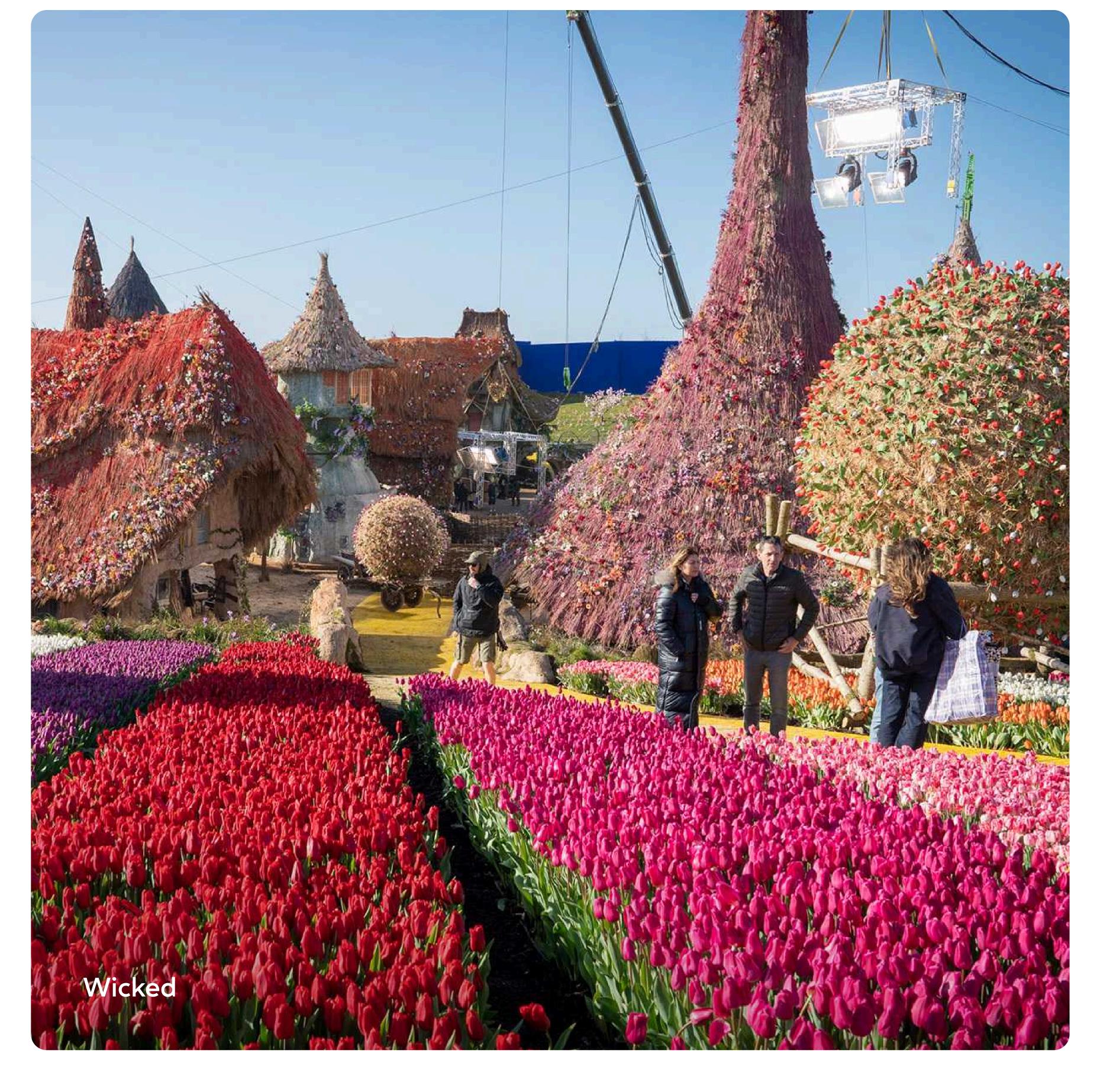






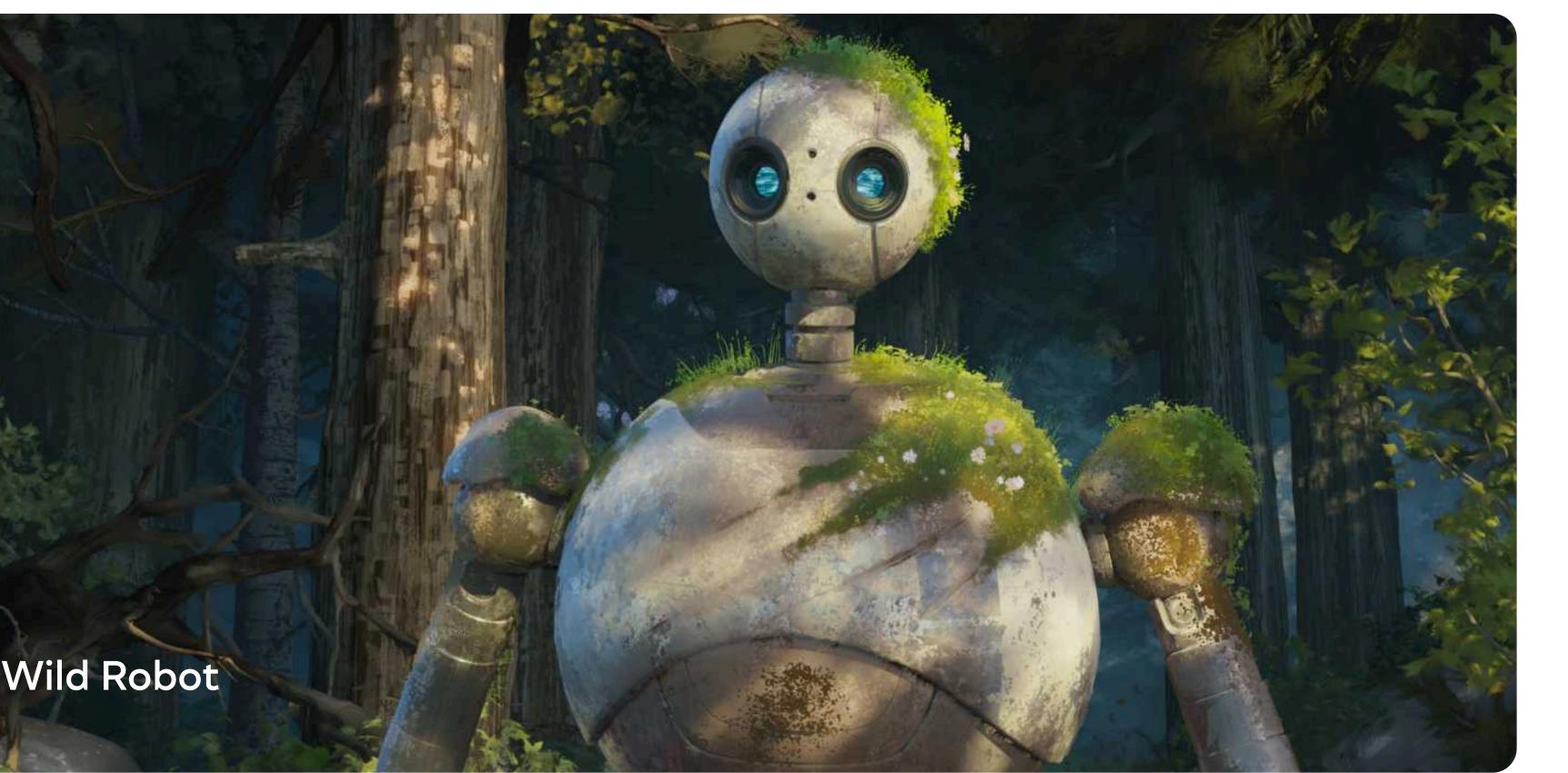

Productions

"Wicked" used 100% renewable electricity when filming at Sky Studios Elstree and other sound stages, avoiding approximately 45% of the production's projected Scope 1 & 2 emissions.

The production team for "Bridget Jones: Mad About the Boy" avoided approximately 44% of the production's Scope 1 & 2 emissions.

The NBC broadcast of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games earned a Green Seal at the 34th Annual EMA Awards, hosted by the Environmental Media Association.

The Sky Max Entertainment series "A League of Their Own" reduced its carbon footprint by 47% in season 18 compared to the prior season.

NBCUniversal took home three awards at the 34th Annual Environmental Media Awards for on-screen storylines: Universal Pictures' "Twisters" for Feature Film, Universal Television's "Hacks" for Comedy, and Bravo's "Top Chef" for Reality Series.

For "The Wild Robot," Universal Pictures created an in-theater public service announcement, encouraging audiences to take small, meaningful steps to care for our environment.

Sky Max's original comedy "Mr. Bigstuff" incorporated lighthearted but impactful content into its first series with an unlikely climate advocate in lead character Lee, played by Danny Dyer, who scolds others for littering chewing gum and leaving the fridge door open.

Operations

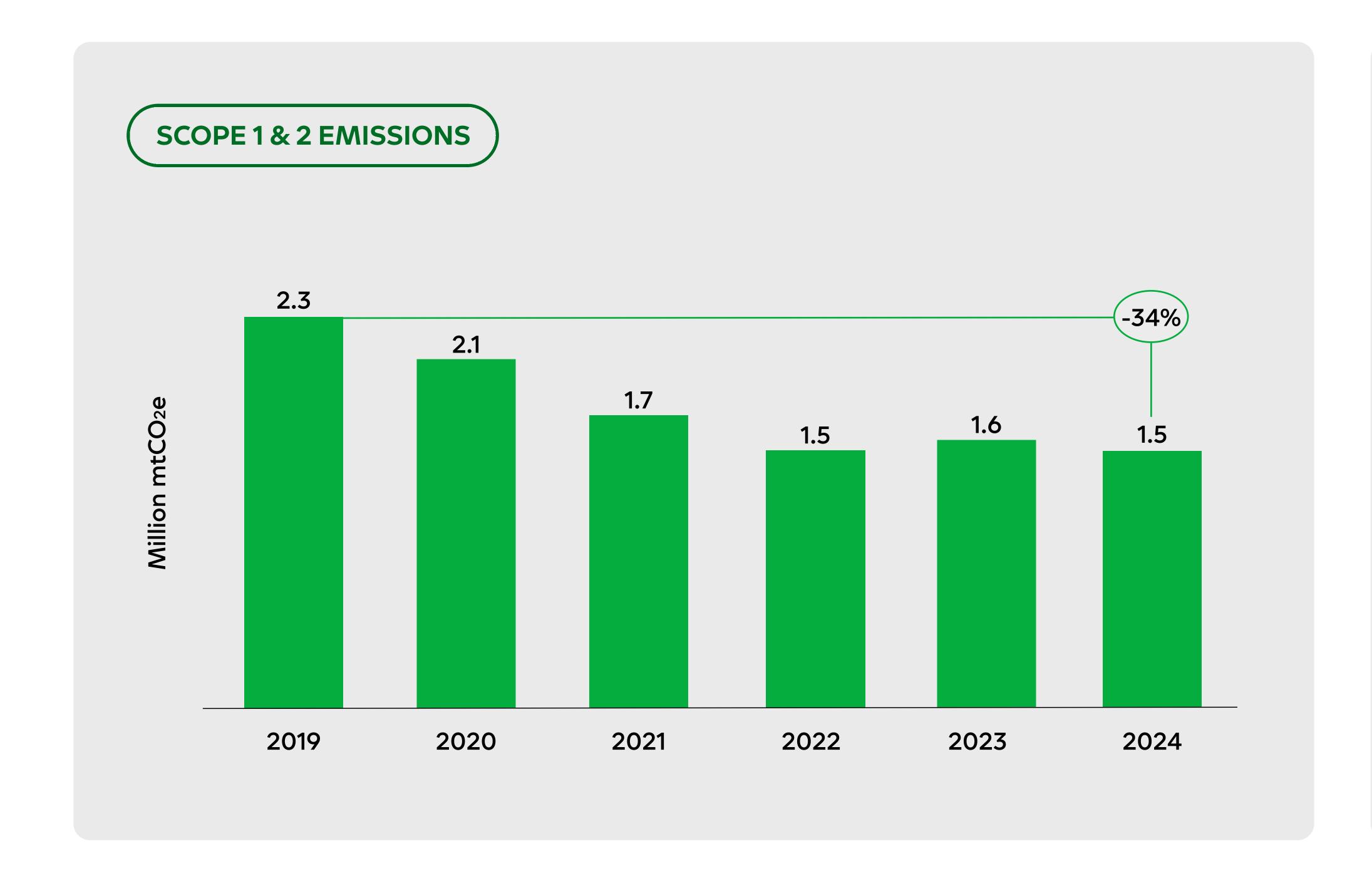
Across Comcast, NBCUniversal, and Sky, we're focused on conserving resources and driving operational efficiency in the areas of our business with the largest environmental impact.

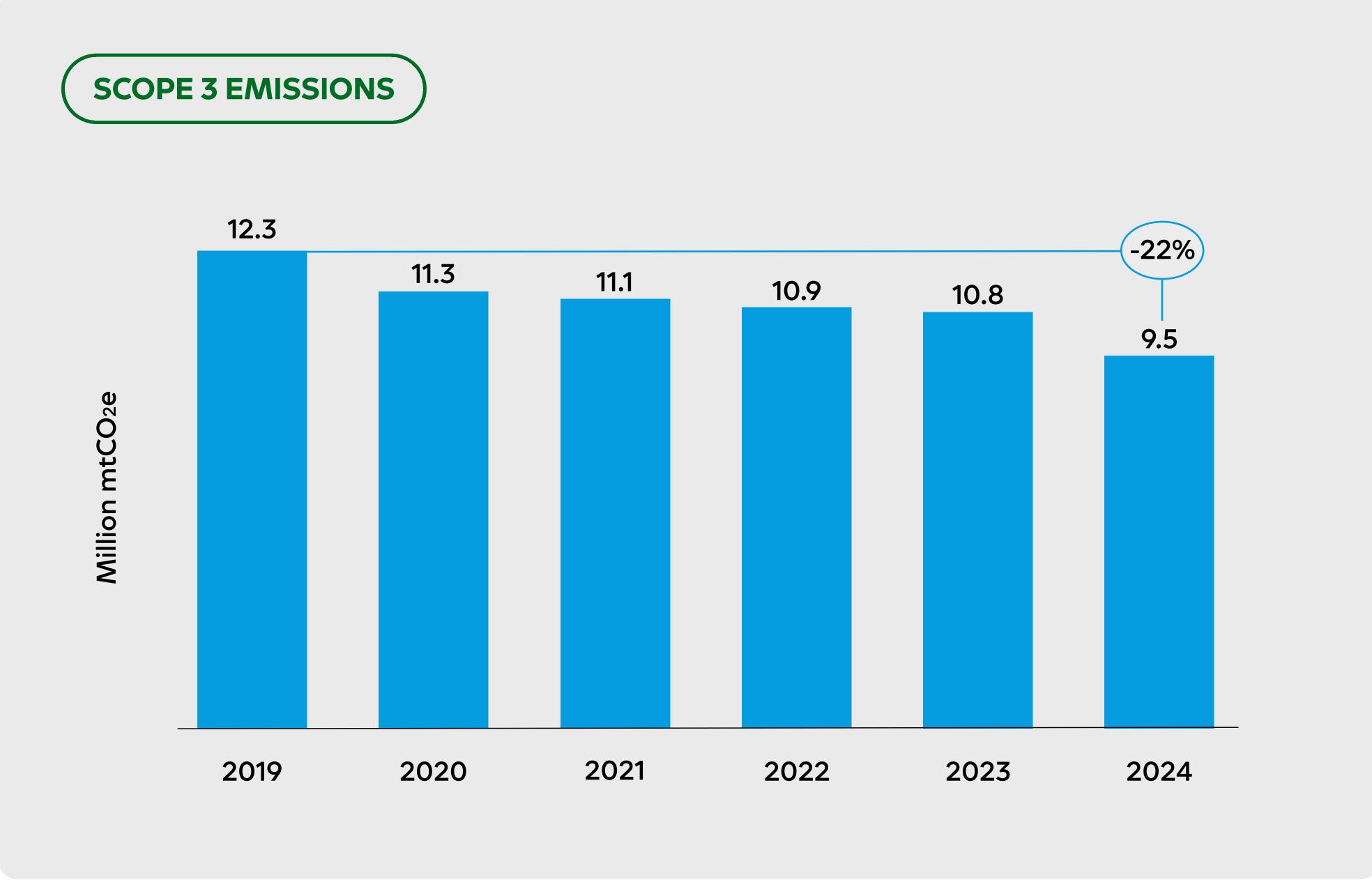
Emissions

We continue to make progress toward our goal to be carbon neutral for Scope 1 and 2 emissions by 2035. We have also set near-term science-based targets for Scope 1, 2, and 3 emissions that have been validated by the Science Based Targets initiative.

Since 2019, we have reduced our Scope 1 and 2 emissions by 34%. Our emissions decreased 5% from 2023 to 2024, due largely to greening of the U.S. electricity grid, optimizing our facilities and fleet, increasing clean energy usage, and improving the energy efficiency of our operations.
We made progress on many of our operational energy and emissions metrics year over year, including reductions in total energy consumed and emissions from our owned and operated fleet and vehicles.

We continue to make long-term investments in network energy efficiency and clean and renewable energy contracts that we expect to help reduce our carbon footprint as we grow our network and business into the future.



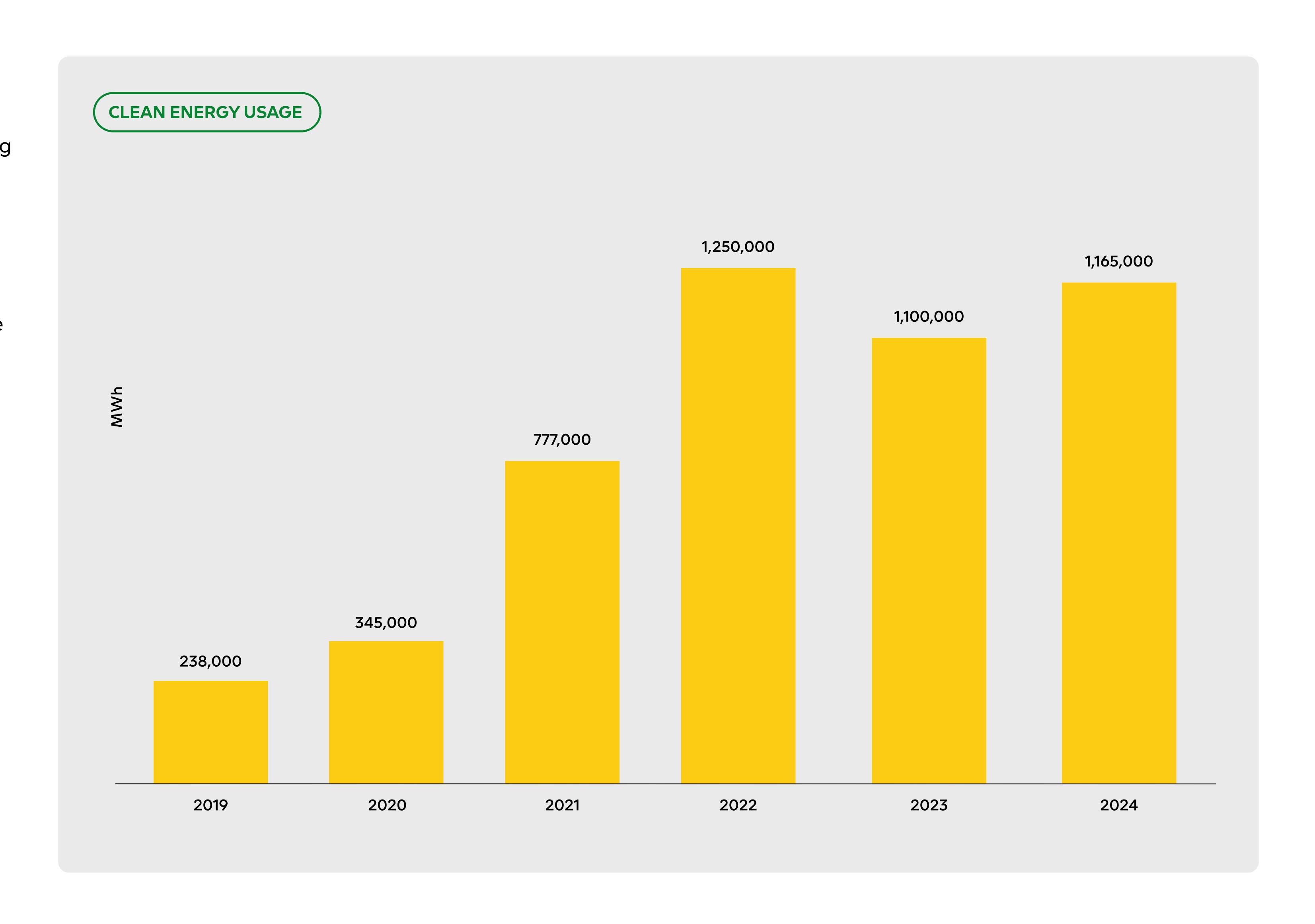


ENVIRONMENT

Energy

With purchased electricity accounting for the majority of our operational emissions, we continue to focus on sourcing clean and renewable electricity. In 2024, we sourced approximately 1.2 million megawatthours (MWh) of clean and renewable electricity – approximately 27% of our total enterprise electricity load.

Our clean energy usage increased 6% from 2023 to 2024, and we continue to focus on sourcing from new projects that can bring additional clean energy capacity to the grid to help meet future energy needs. In 2024, we signed new clean energy agreements that, when the projects are completed, will total approximately 300,000 MWh per year.



Managing the Challenges Ahead

Decarbonizing our business and value chain depends on many factors beyond our control, including political, economic, regulatory, and geopolitical conditions, supply chain and labor issues, supplier emissions reductions, the evolution of carbon offset markets, and innovations in technology and infrastructure.

Overcoming these challenges will require, among other things, increased collaboration with a range of business partners, industry peers, governments around the world, and other stakeholders.





Technology

Our digital technology and customer support tools allow us to serve more customers and resolve more network issues remotely — saving roughly 12 million gallons of fuel compared to 2019 and avoiding 100,000 metric tons of greenhouse gas emissions from reduced truck visits. Additionally, Comcast has deployed electric vehicles (EVs) in California. NBCUniversal purchased 447 EVs in 2024, including electric buses at Epic Universe,

Studio Tour trams at Universal Studios Hollywood, and electric golf carts for operations at multiple locations. 171 new EV chargers have been installed across Epic Universe, Universal Studios Hollywood, and the Universal Studios

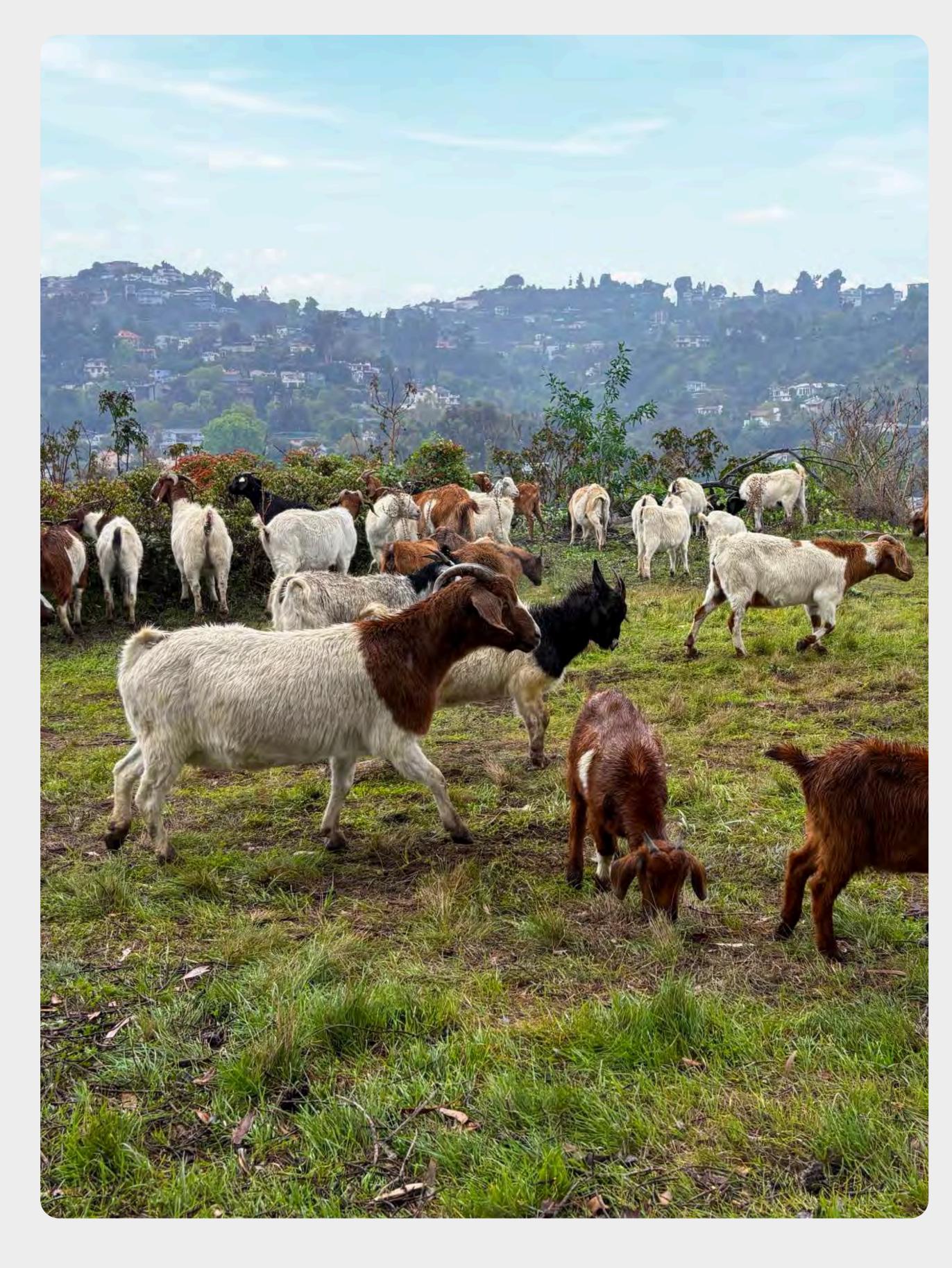
Lot. Across the U.K., Sky has transitioned 65% of its company car fleet to EVs and increased its EV charging bays to 244.

The inaugural Sky Zero Awards recognized the dedicated individuals powering sustainable change across the business. Hosted by Sky News presenter Leah Boleto, the event celebrated the sustainability achievements of colleagues in procurement, facilities, and more.

Resilience at the Studio Lot

Following the devastating Los Angeles fires in January 2025, the Operations team at the Universal Studios Lot hired 400 goats to help clear 43 acres of brush in the backlot to support ongoing efforts to mitigate wildfire risk without the need for landscaping equipment.
