USED VEHICLE BUYER'S CHECKLIST

BEFORE BUYING

- Check the www.cpic-cipc.ca website to see if the vehicle is listed as stolen.
- Check for liens on the vehicle with the RDPRM (French acronym for "Register of Personal and Movable Real Rights") via the Web site at www.rdprm.gouv.qc.ca, or by phone at 418 646-4949, 514 864-4949 or 1 800 465-4949. You will need the vehicle identification number (VIN) and the name of the previous owner to complete your search.
- Check the website www.carfax.ca to see if the vehicle was involved in a major accident.
- Have the vehicle inspected by a trustworthy garage or CAA-Quebec inspection centre (addresses listed below).
- Check the chain of vehicle ownership with the SAAQ (www.saaq.gouv.qc.ca). Requests must be made in person at a SAAQ office or at the offices of an official SAAQ agent, including CAA-Quebec registration centres. There is a charge for this service.
- Ask to see all recent repair bills and check if the repairs are still under warranty.
- Check with the vehicle manufacturer to see if the warranty is still valid.
- Check the Transport Canada website to see if all recalls have been carried out.
- Check with the seller or the SAAQ if any unpaid fines could prevent the completion of the transaction.

AFTER BUYING

- Transfer the vehicle ownership with the SAAQ as quickly as possible.
- The buyer pays the provincial tax (PST) when registering the vehicle with the SAAQ.
- Read the owner's manual carefully for information on its operation, recommended maintenance, etc.
- Advise the manufacturer that you are the new owner of the vehicle.

USED VEHICLE SELLER'S CHECKLIST

BEFORE SELLING

- Check (with the saaq) to see if the prospective buyer has a valid driver's license in order to avoid the risk of seizure of the vehicle.
- No guarantee is required of you in a private sale.
- You are liable for hidden defects. Be sure you inform the buyer of any problems you are aware of.
- Advise the seller if the vehicle was involved in a major accident.
- Agree to have the vehicle inspected at the buyer's expense by a trustworthy garage or CAA-Quebec inspection centre (addresses listed below).
- Show the buyer all recent repair bills.

AFTER SELLING

- Transfer the vehicle ownership with the SAAQ as quickly as possible.
- The buyer pays the provincial tax (PST) when registering the vehicle with the SAAQ.
- Make sure you give the owner's manual to the new owner.
- The buyer can obtain an extended warranty on a vehicle bought in a private sale. Ask CAA-Quebec for more information.
