Understanding your roof repair contract

To avoid problems or misunderstandings with the contractor, it's important to go over your roof repair contract in detail. That way, you'll be able to make an informed decision about whether to sign it.

CORRECTIVE MEASURES TO THE DECKING Standard practice is to include repairs for an area of 32 ft² at no extra charge and provide an estimate of additional costs.

The homeowner should normally receive warranties from both the manufacturer and the roofer. The former is responsible for any defects in the design of the shingles that result in water infiltration. The latter undertakes to repair, at their expense, any damage resulting from faulty installation work.
