## **Objective**

To improve educational outcomes by reducing student absenteeism through nursing resources that manage acute illness, injury and chronic health conditions. Short- and medium-term goals target chronic absenteeism and reading readiness. Long-term goals include improving rates of graduation, workplace readiness and college entry.


## **Program Service Model\***



Registered nurses (RN) educate and train school personnel (building support staff, paraprofessionals, teachers, administrators, etc.) who provide daily direct services to students. Dependent upon location and need, consultative access to an RN may occur on-site, by phone and/or through virtual connectivity (Spectrum Health MedNow).

Through this model, the following support may also be provided:

- Identifying, prioritizing and assisting school administrators with critical health and safety issues
  - Individualized Health Plans (IHPs)
  - Emergency Action Plans (EAPs)
  - Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)
  - 504 Plans
- Facilitate staff education and training
  - Chronic conditions in schools
  - Medical emergency response team (CPR/AED)
  - First Aid
  - Medication administration



Schools enrolled in this program have access to administrative health program support, data collection and outcome measurements. Staff wellness initiatives can also be facilitated through the program.







## **Virtual Support for Students at School**

When a student gets sick, injured or has chronic health care needs at school, it can be stressful, especially if medical treatment is not directly available. With the school health program and use of Spectrum Health MedNow technology, the student can be seen by an RN via video visit for rashes, minor injuries or even the flu. This service provides safety, increases access and provides a real-time visit with a nurse using a webcam.

#### **How it Works**

Video visits will be used in all necessary situations. A member of the school will guide students through the technology using a private, secure video connection to a nurse located offsite.

By talking to the student and seeing their condition via video, the nurse will be able to determine a plan of care. Once the visit is finished, the information will be entered into the electronic student record and if needed, a parent or guardian will be contacted.


