and public health organizations to pilot the School Blue Envelope Program, which initiates a plan of action when a student has thoughts of suicide. Because of philanthropy, over 250 school staff were trained as Level 1 responders (1-hour training) and 57 were trained as Level 2 responders (2 hour training). Philanthropy ensured training materials were developed and distributed in print and digital formats, in both English and Spanish. After the trainings took place, there was a 44 percent increase in school staff's knowledge of suicide prevention and 54 percent increase in school staff's confidence when responding to a student expressing suicidal thoughts. There was also a remarkable 240 percent increase in knowledge of how to keep students and staff safe.

For the 2020-2021 school year, the School Blue Envelope program expanded to train staff at Saugatuck Middle and High Schools, Holland High School, West Ottawa High School, Harbor **Lights Middle School and Pine Creek Elementary**. Staff trainings continue and refresher sessions are offered throughout the year. When COVID forced schools to be closed, staff members reached out weekly or bi-weekly to students, providing opportunities to connect with counselors and social workers. We are looking forward to the return of normalcy in the 2021-2022 school year, as we have seen much better results when Blue Envelope is offered to students who are receiving inperson instruction and are easier to connect with at school.
