Making the Impossible...Possible Precision Medicine Therapies and Research

Our genetics and genomics team at HDVCH are making great strides in genetic testing—specifically rapid whole genome sequencing—to find the root of disease in kids.

One of these kids is Hazel O'Brien of Ludington.

When Hazel was born she gave her parents, Logan and Jade, quite a scare. After two weeks at the Gerber Foundation Neonatal Center receiving treatment for feeding difficulties and respiratory issues, an echocardiogram revealed several heart defects.

Dr. Caleb Bupp, division chief for medical genetics at HDVCH, used a genetic blood test to reveal the root cause of Hazel's heart defects: Noonan syndrome. The diagnosis put the O'Briens at ease, Jade said. **"We were able to start understanding Hazel's disorder and determined the necessary course of follow-up treatment."**

"Hazel was one of those kids who, when we get results from the genetic test, it's like an 'aha' moment," said Dr. Bupp. With her diagnosis, doctors were also able to send Hazel home sooner. "We were able to move her treatment to outpatient care," he said. **"This got her out of the hospital faster, saved time and money on procedures and limited the amount of time the family needed to spend away from home."**

Today, Hazel is a happy girl with bright blue eyes and a smile that will light up the room. "We are beyond thankful for Hazel and can't imagine our lives without her," Jade said. **"The care we received at Helen DeVos Children's Hospital," care made possible by philanthropy, "has been extraordinary.
