SMILE TO GO TO WORK

EMPLOYEES at an office in Beijing, China, have to smile to be allowed into their office!

An artificial intelligence (AI) camera outside Canon Information Technology's office requires workers to smile in order for the front doors to open.

A spokesperson for Canon China said it "created a positive and lively atmosphere." However, some have criticised the tech. One person on Chinese social media wrote: "So now the companies are not only manipulating our time, but also our emotions."



SCIENTISTS are turning used plastic bottles into vanilla flavouring!

Researchers from Scotland's University of Edinburgh have discovered a way to turn terephthalic acid (TA) from plastic drinking bottles into a chemical called vanillin. This chemical is used a lot in food and cosmetics, such as body lotion.

The discovery could encourage more people to recycle, as well as tackle the growing problem of global plastic pollution.

HIGH WIRE RECORD



A NEW world record has been set for the longest high-line.

A single 855m line in Yosemite National Park was set up, stretching across a 487m drop. It took Moises Monterrubio, from San Francisco, USA, 37 minutes to walk the line.

The longest line previously walked in Yosemite had been 'just' 228m.
