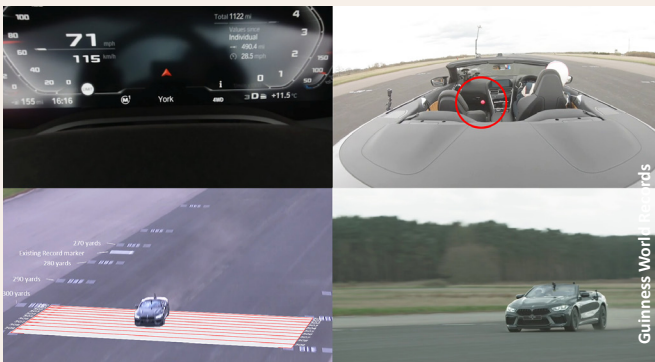
SPEEDY SHOT FOR GOLFER

BRITISH golfer Marcus Armitage has set a new Guinness World Record, after hitting a ball 303 yards (277m) into a moving car!

Armitage teamed up with driver Paul O’Neill to attempt the record at Elvington Airfield in Yorkshire.

The duo attempted the record several times and even broke the car’s windshield! After sticking with it, they successfully managed to land the ball from 303 yards, making it the farthest golf shot ever caught in a moving car.

The impressive feat smashed the previous record set by golfer Jake Shepherd and former Formula 1 driver David Coulthard, who managed a distance of 273 yards in 2012.

FARMER MOVES BELGIUM

A **BELGIAN** farmer moved a stone that was blocking his tractor, but accidentally changed the border between Belgium and France!

Stones marking the border between the two countries were originally laid in 1819, and by moving a stone by 2.29m (7.5ft), the farmer made Belgium bigger by 1,000 square metres – and France smaller!

Luckily the authorities on both sides saw the funny side. Mayor David Lavaux, of Erquelinnes in Belgium, said: “I was happy, my town was bigger, but the mayor of Bousignies-sur-Roc [in France] didn’t agree.”

The farmer won’t get in any trouble, as long as he returns the stone to its original spot.
