
## A MISSION is underway to test a new way of collecting space junk.

There are about 9,200 tonnes of space debris speeding around the Earth's orbit. At any point, they could collide with one of the 3,000 active satellites above us, including ones that we <u>rely</u> on for <u>forecasting</u> the weather or for mobile data.

A Tokyo-based company called Astroscale is looking to clean up that space mess. On Monday (22 March), a Soyuz rocket launched from Kazakhstan's Baikonur <u>Cosmodrome</u>, carrying two spacecraft.

These two spacecraft will attempt to clean up the space <u>debris</u> that surrounds the Earth in the first mission of its kind. The mission has been called the End-of-Life Services by Astroscale demonstration, or ELSA-d.

One of the spacecraft is called the servicer – which will collect the space debris – and the other is called the client,



which will act as the debris itself. The servicer will chase the client and dock with it before <u>separating</u> again. This will be repeated several times so that Astroscale can prove that its spacecraft is <u>capable</u> of finding and <u>latching</u> onto old and broken satellites.

The two spacecraft will be controlled by <u>technicians</u> working at the In-Orbit Servicing Centre in Oxfordshire, UK.

If the mission is successful, Astroscale hopes that it will be hired to be a much-needed space cleaner. Currently, space companies aren't responsible for clearing up their space junk.
