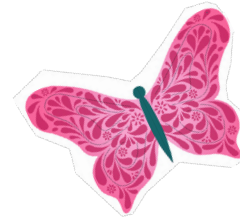

# Butterfly Garland

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## Tools required:

- For best results use 180gm paper
- Scissors or craft knife
- Glue or tape
- String



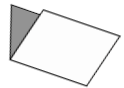
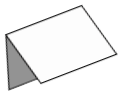
Use the ruler and either the back side (ie blunt) of the craft knife or an old ball point pen with no ink to score along the fold lines before folding

## KEY

————— Cut

----- Mountain Fold

----- Valley Fold



## METHOD

*Note that a blank butterfly is included at the end so you can design your own.*

- Cut out each of the butterflies and score along the fold lines as indicated.
- Mountain Fold each butterfly in half, then Valley Fold either side of the body.
- Lift each cut section the wings.
- Cut out the Butterfly Antenna strips and fold in half. Tightly roll each end of the strip to about one third of the way down, then glue the antenna onto the back of the butterfly's head.
- Thread string through the wing tips where marked with a dot.
- Arrange the butterflies along the string, gluing or taping the string on the back of each butterfly to keep them in place.
