

FRENCH MPs have voted to ban flights within France if the journey can be travelled by a direct train in less than two and a half hours.

A French consumer group found a plane flight emits 77 times more CO₂ per passenger than a train.

A 3,000-YEAR-OLD city in Luxor, Egypt, has been found by a team of archaeologists.
