SCIENTISTS have discovered the "world's northernmost island".

The tiny island was revealed by shifting pack ice off the coast of Greenland.

It measures roughly 30 metres across and consists of mainly seabed mud, soil and rock.

The new island is believed to be the closest point of land to the North Pole.

DESPITE lockdowns across the globe, greenhouse gas levels reached record highs in 2020.


