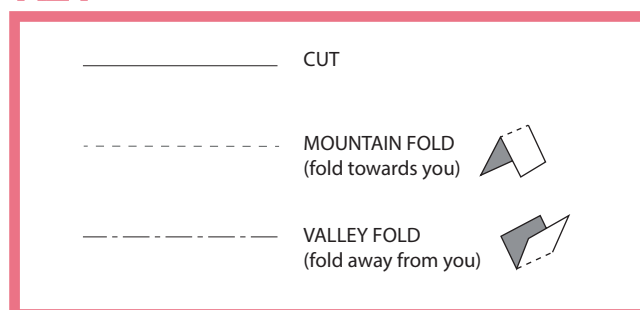

## #2 Easter Egg Wreath instructions

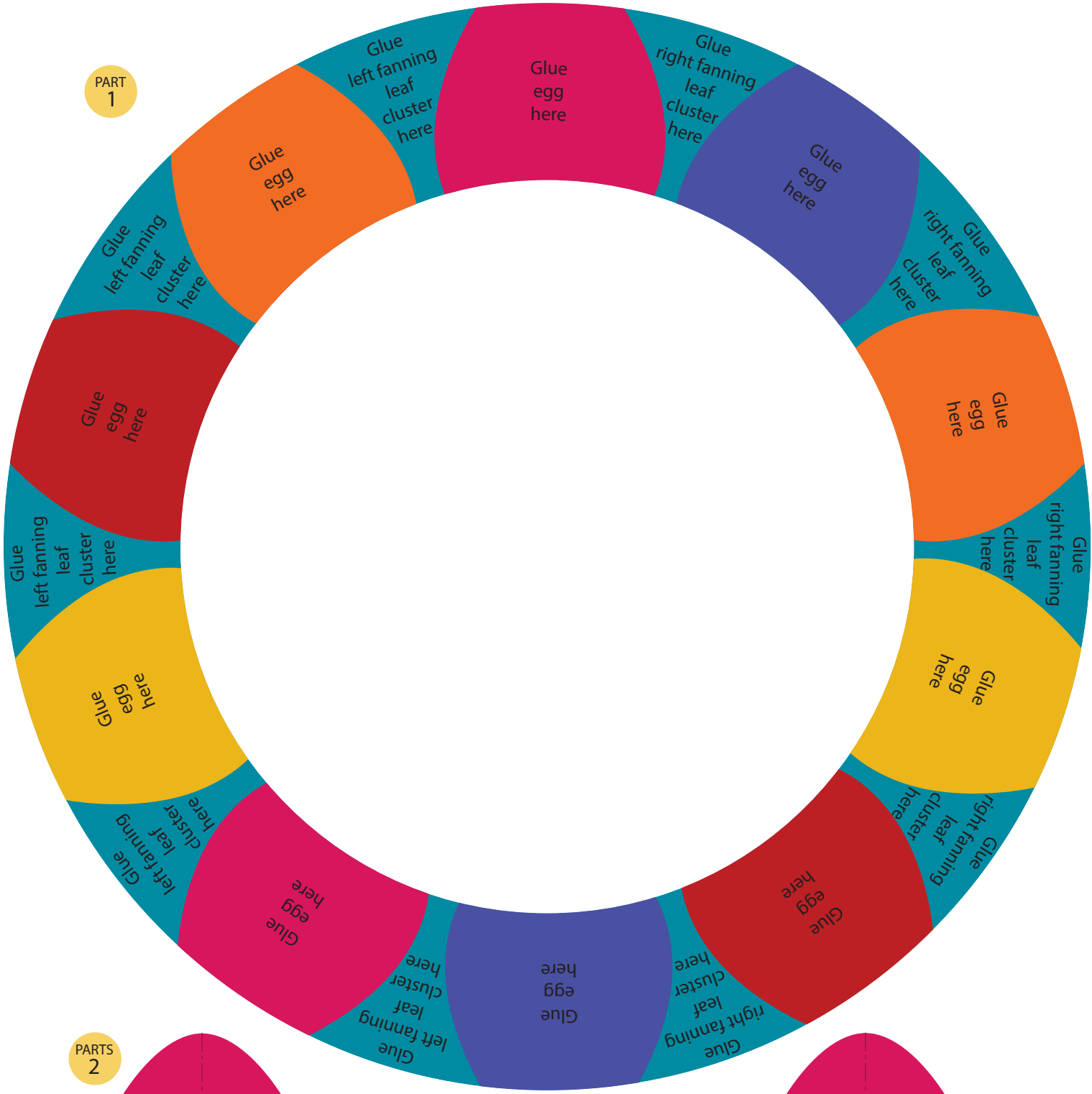

1. Cut out all parts. Use a craft knife for best results. You can either use the printed pieces directly, or use them as templates to cut the parts from coloured paper.
2. Carefully fold along all fold lines (see key for direction of folds). Before folding it is recommended to score the line lightly with a craft knife or a ballpoint pen that no longer has ink in it. This will make folding easier and more precise.
3. Take all of the part 2s and divide into piles of 5 of the same colour. You should have 10 piles in total, with 2 piles of each colour.
4. Take one of the piles. Pick up one of the egg shaped pieces and fold in half (coloured side inside). Put glue on one of the white sides. Then pick up another piece from the same pile (also folded) and, lining up with the first piece, glue the two sides together (back to back). Repeat this with the other pieces until all 5 are joined, making a fan shaped egg.
5. Do the same with each pile until you have 10 eggs. Put these to one side for now.
6. Take one of the part 3s and put a spot of glue at end 3A on the back (white side). Then glue onto of one of the part 4s (end 4A) fanning the unglued end out to the right (see photo for reference). Do the same with 4 more of the part 3s and 4s and set aside. You should now have 5 leaf clusters.
7. Repeat this action with the remaining part 3s and 4s, this time fanning the smaller leaf out to the left. You should have 5 more of these leaf clusters.
8. Take part 1 and, putting glue on the spaces marked, attach each of the leaf clusters to these markers, placing the clusters with the right leaning small leaf on the right side on the wreath, and the clusters with the leaf leaning small leaf on the left side on the wreath. See photo for reference.
9. Now taking the eggs you set aside earlier, glue each one into the spaces on the wreath between the leaf clusters where marked.

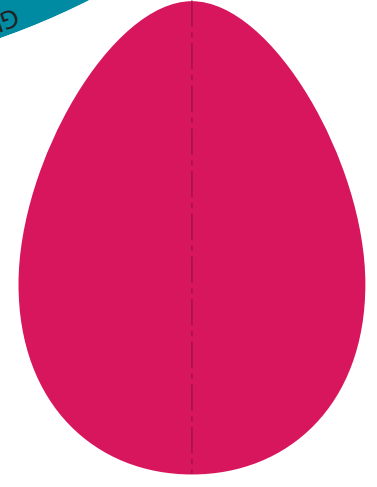
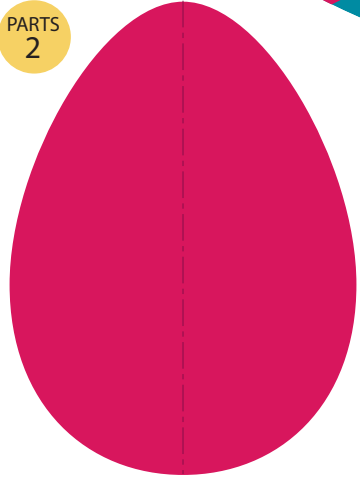
