The Heart Foundation Expert Advisory will be a group of people with subject matter expertise, including lived experience, selected via an application process. Members will be called upon for advice, as needed, by the Heart Foundation Executive or Board, via the Secretariat, over the course of our work when their skill area is sought. Members may also be invited to form steering committees and working groups for specific projects.

- Provide strategic guidance and recommendations
- Provide guidance and recommendations on potential strategic health-related partnerships
- Support media communications
- Advise on the potential need for additional consultation or set up of steering groups
- Advise on the potential need to broaden the diversity of representation for specific reviews or of the Heart Foundation Expert Advisory as a whole
