The ultimate homeowner maintenance checklist

Keeping your place in good nick is one of the best things you can do as a homeowner. A bit of mahi now and then can help you dodge massive repair bills later on and help you secure the best price if you decide to sell.

MONTHLY JOBS

- Check that your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are working. Swap out the batteries if you need to.
- Give the waste disposal unit a clean to stop any funky smells.
- Look for any plumbing leaks under your sinks and around appliances like the dishwasher.
- Keep an eye out for pests check for droppings, nests, or spots where they might be getting in.
- Clean the filters in your range hood to get rid of grease buildup.
- Clear out your dryer's lint filter and vent to prevent any fire hazards.
- Look for any signs of mould and mildew, especially in the bathroom, laundry, and around window joinery.

EVERY FEW MONTHS

- Clean out the tracks on your sliding doors and windows so they run smoothly.
- Check the filters in your <u>heat pump</u>/ air-con to keep it running nicely.

- Clear leaves and other gunk out of your gutters and downpipes.
- Clean your taps and fittings to get rid of any mineral buildup.
- Have a peek in your ceiling cavity and under the house for any leaks or pests.
- Give the grout and sealant in your kitchen and bathroom a good clean.
- Trim back trees and bushes so they don't end up damaging the house.

TWICE A YEAR

- Check the seals and grout in your showers and baths to stop water from getting where it shouldn't.
- Inspect your windows and doors to make sure they're properly sealed against drafts.
- Test the safety auto-reverse on your garage door opener to make sure it's working.





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ONCE A YEAR

- Lube your door hinges and locks to stop them from squeaking.
- Check your exterior paint for any damage and touch it up if needed.
- Have a look at your roof for any broken tiles, leaks, or issues with the flashings.
- Give your floors and carpets a deep clean.
- If you've got a fireplace, get the chimney cleaned and inspected.
- Pressure wash the outside of your house to get rid of dirt and grime.
- Check the foundations of your home for any cracks or signs of water getting in.
- Give your oven and stove a thorough clean.
- Protect your wooden decks and fences from the weather with a fresh coat of stain or paint.
- Fertilise and aerate your lawn to keep it looking lush.
- Inspect and clean your outdoor lights.
- Flush your hot water cylinder to remove sediment and keep it running efficiently.
- Get your heat pump/HVAC system serviced by a professional.
- Test your irrigation system and fix any leaks.
- Review your insurance policy to make sure you've got the right cover for your home.

SEASONAL BITS AND BOBS

- Spring: Tidy up the outdoor furniture, get the garden ready, and check the sprinkler system.
- Summer: Keep on top of the lawn and put a new coat of stain or oil on the deck.
- Autumn: Rake up the leaves, clear out the gutters again, and prep for winter.
- Winter: Check your insulation, fix any drafts, and keep your paths clear of ice.

AS YOU NEED TO

- Leaks: Fix any plumbing leaks as soon as you spot them to prevent water damage.
- Electrical: Got flickering lights or buzzing switches? That's a job for a sparky don't muck around with it.
- **Pests:** Deal with any unwelcome critters as soon as they show up.
- Appliances: Check the manual for your appliances and follow the maintenance tips to help them last longer.
- Septic tank: If you have one, get it cleaned and inspected regularly.
- **Pool:** Keep your pool clean and the chemicals balanced.
- Ventilation: Make sure your home's ventilation systems are clean and working well for better air quality.
