SCHEDULE NOTE

The Southern Conference Council of Presidents announced on Aug. 13 that the league would postpone conference competition for all fall sports to the spring due to health and safety concerns related to the COVID-19 pandemic, with schools able to participate in nonconference play in the fall at their discretion.

Notes

- The Southern Conference is idle on Saturday, Oct. 17, before resuming play with two contests at FBS opponents on Oct. 24. Mercer will visit Army West Point and Chattanooga will play its lone fall contest of the season when it heads to Western Kentucky.
- Oct. 24 will mark the second and final day this fall with multiple SoCon teams in action.
- Mercer will be facing Army West Point for the second time in program history but the first since 1933, when the Black Knights took a 19-6 win at home.
- •The Bears opened their fall campaign and the Drew Cronic era with a 34-28 loss at Jacksonville State on Oct. 10. Mercer got off to an electric start, as Deondre Johnson returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown, good for the longest special teams play in program history. The Bears would lead 14-3 after a quarter, but the Gamecocks outscored Mercer 24-0 in the second to take a lead they would not relinquish.
- Mercer running back Tyray Devezin ran for 94 yards and a touchdown at JSU, moving over 2,000 yards for his career and becoming the SoCon's active career leader and one of just three active players in the league to hit the milestone, joining ETSU running back Quay Holmes (2,071) and Citadel quarterback Brandon Rainey (2,061). Now with 2,080 career rushing yards, Devezin is one of just four players in Mercer history to surpass 2,000 yards.
- Freshman linebacker Isaac Dowling had a game-high 15 tackles in his collegiate debut.
- Chattanooga owns an 8-5 lead in the series against Western Kentucky, though the Hilltoppers have won the last two contests, with the last one coming in 2007, WKU's first year of transition to the FBS level.
- The Mocs received votes in the Stats Perform 2020 Preseason FCS Top 25. Stats Perform is not conducting a weekly poll this fall.
- Chattanooga returns senior wide receiver Bryce Nunnelly, who is the SoCon's active career leader in receptions (143) and receiving yards (2,120). Nunnelly, who had 57 catches for 794 yards and five touchdowns last season, was a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American in 2019.
- The Mocs also return running back Ailym Ford, who finished fifth in the Jerry Rice Award voting last season. Before a season-ending injury in November, Ford ran for 1,081 yards, averaging 108.1 per contest.
- •The Citadel wrapped up its fall schedule with a 14-9 loss at FBS Army West Point on Oct. 10. The Bulldogs held the Black Knights to just 153 rushing yards, nearly 200 below their season average of 350.5 entering the contest. Defensive back Sean-Thomas Faulkner had a career-high 16 tackles, including nine solo stops and one for loss. Stats Perform named The Citadel its FCS Team of the Week and named Faulkner, whose 16 tackles are a single-game FCS high this season, its FCS Co-Player of the Week.
- With his fall schedule complete, Citadel backup quarterback Jaylan Adams leads the FCS with a kickoff return average of 20.4 yards per return.


