SoCon Players of the Week



D.J. Thompson Appalachian State Senior, Guard, Raleigh, N.C.

Appalachian State guard D.J. Thompson was named Southern Conference Player of the Week after averaging 26.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists in two games for the week ending Nov.

The senior scored 25 points with eight rebounds in an 88-78 loss at Wake Forest on Nov. 27. He scored 11 of ASU's final 15 points against the Demon Deacons.

Thompson tallied 28 points and grabbed 10 boards in Appalachian State's 84-71 triumph over Campbell on Nov. 27. He scored 20 of his points in the second half and was 10-of-11 from the free throw

He moved into 20th on ASU's all-time scoring list with 1,177 points.





















SoCon News and Notes



Appalachian State

- Against Campbell on Nov. 27, senior guard D.J. Thompson moved into 20th place on Appalachian State's all-time scoring list with 1,777 points. He had back-to-back 20+-point games last week with 25 points against Wake Forest and 28 versus Campbell.
- Jeremy Clayton notched his seventh career double-double and his second of the season where he scored 10 points and grabbed 10 rebounds against Campbell. The junior forward also dished out seven assists in two games last week.



College of Charleston

- Guard Dontaye Draper tallied 28 points in a 91-70 win over UNC Wilmington on Nov. 26 and had 31 points a game earlier against Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 20 at the Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. With 1,114 points, the senior ranks 20th on the school's all-time scoring list.
- The Cougars surrendered 70 points in the victory over UNC Wilmington, the most points allowed by the College of Charleston this season. The Cougar' streak of not having allowed 100 points in a game has now extended to 880 games.



Chattanooga

- The Mocs completed their longest road trip of the year when Chattanooga played games at East Tennessee State (Nov. 15), at Florida (Nov. 18), at Ball State (Nov. 21) and against Towson and Prairie View A&M in the Las Vegas Classic.
- After averaging just 4.7 points and 3.3 rebounds as a freshman, Nicchaeus Dokes earned a starting berth this year and the forward has responded by averaging 13.0 points and 7.5 boards in six starts.



The Citadel

- The Citadel concluded a five-game road trip that included visits to four states in nine days. The stretch began with back-to-back games at Michigan State and Iowa on Nov. 12 and 13 followed by games at Charleston Southern on Nov. 16, at Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind. on Nov. 19 and at Southern California on Nov. 21.
- After a game with Army in Charleston on Dec. 2, the Bulldogs open the Southern Conference portion of the schedule by hosting Appalachian State on Dec. 4.



Davidson

- Davidson broke or tied four school records in a 99-69 triumph over Colby on Nov. 21: three-point field goals made (19), three-point field goals attempted (52 --- also a new SoCon record) and freshman Stephen Curry broke school records for three-point field goals made (nine) and attempted (20).
- Guard Jason Richards was responsible for 52 of Davidson's 99 points against Colby. The junior set career highs with 20 points and dished out 16 assists in the contest.



Elon

- Senior LeVonn Jordan scored 22 of his 26 points against Vanderbilt in the second half. It marked the second straight game the guard tallied 22 points in the second stanza, having accomplished the feat at Wake Forest.
- Elon shot 11-for-11 from the free throw line against Vanderbilt. It was the first time the Phoenix were perfect from the line since Feb. 7, 2004 when Elon was 2-for-2 against UNC Greensboro.



Furman

- After playing games at Clemson (Nov. 15), Bowling Green (Nov. 19) and at North Dakota State (Nov. 22), Furman took six days off to celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday before returning to action on Nov. 28 with a game at Vanderbilt.
- Forward Moussa Diagne's 27 points in a 60-58 loss at the hands of North Dakota State on Nov. 22 was a career-high for the senior. The 27-points eclipsed his previous career-high of 25 points against San Diego last season.























Socon News and Notes



Georgia Southern

- The Eagles extended their streak of 26 straight season-opening wins at home and 19 consecutive non-conference home wins with a 70-41 win over Winston-Salem State.
- Louis Graham had a career night in Georgia Southern's 61-59 win at Mercer on Nov. 27. Graham grabbed 17 rebounds, had four steal and dished out three assists in the win.



UNC Greensboro

- With a 77-54 win over Wofford on Nov. 27 at Fleming Gymnasium, the Spartans have won four consecutive conference openers. Overall, UNC Greensboro is 6-4 in SoCon openers.
- Junior Kyle Hines tied the school mark by scoring in double figures for 27 consecutive games. The forward equaled the mark set by teammate Ricky Hickman last season. The last time Hines was limited to fewer than 10 points was Dec. 16, 2005 when he tallied eight points against Greensboro College.



Western Carolina

- The Catamounts are averaging 111.0 points in two home games this season, posting wins over Atlanta Christian (105-40) and Toccoa Falls (117-58). Western Carolina is scoring at a 59.0 clip on the road with a win at UNC Asheville (61-46) and a loss at Purdue (82-57).
- Western Carolina's next four contests are on the road as the Catamounts play at Wofford (Nov. 29) in its SoCon opener, at Xavier (Dec. 2), at Gardner-Webb (Dec. 9) and at Dayton (Dec. 16) before returning home to host The Citadel on Dec. 18.



Wofford

- Senior Eric Marshall tied his career-high with 27 points in Wofford's 91-90 victory over Cincinnati on Nov. 21. The guard scored 11 points against James Madison and 11 at UNC Greensboro.
- Wofford has three starters who are left-handed. Guards Shane Nichols and Drew Gibson are both southpaws as is center Tyler Whatley. In addition, guard Adam Sheehan, who comes off the bench, is left-handed.

Appalachian State Mountaineers

2005-06 Record: 14-16

2005-06 SoCon Record: 6-8, fourth in North Division Coach: Houston Fancher (Middle Tennessee State, 1988)

Record at ASU: 81-97 (six years) Overall record: 125-138 (nine years)

Scouting Report: Appalachian State returns all five starters from last year's team that finished 14-16 (6-8 in the SoCon). But the Mountaineers finished with a flourish, winning five of their last seven games to advance to the semifinals of the conference tournament. Coach Houston Fancher's team boasts depth, inside and outside scoring and a team leader in senior All-Southern Conference point guard D.J. Thompson (19.1 ppg).

Chattanooga Mocs 2005-06 Record: 19-13

2005-06 SoCon record: 8-6, second in North Division Coach: John Shulman (East Tennessee State, 1989)

Record at UTC: 39-24 (two years) Overall Record: 39-24 (two years)

Scouting Report: Chattanooga has advanced to the Southern Conference title game in each of the last four seasons while averaging nearly 20 wins per season over that span. Coach John Shulman has a solid nucleus with the return of guards Ricky Hood (7.1 ppg, 5.0 rpg), Casey Long (9.6 ppg, 5.2 rpg, 107 assists) and Keddric Mays (11.0 ppg and a school-record 91 three-pointers). Tyler Troupe, a medical red-shirt in 2006-07, is a highly-touted forward. The bench is deep with talented newcomers.

Elon Phoenix

2005-06 Record: 15-14

2005-06 SoCon Record: 10-4, first in North Division Coach: Ernie Nestor (Alderson-Broaddus, 1968)

Record at EU: 35-45 (three years) Overall Record: 103-136 (eight years)

Scouting Report: The Phoenix were the surprise team of the SoCon last year, winning the league's North Division with a 10-4 mark. Coach Ernie Nestor, the league's 2006 coach of the Year, will have three starters returning including All-Southern Conference senior forward Chris Chalko (12.6 ppg), senior guard Montell Watson (9.7 ppg), senior guard LeVonn Jordan (7.4 ppg). Elon started 2-9 last season but posted a 13-5 record after Christmas. The Phoenix play at Georgia Tech, Wake Forest, Vanderbilt, VCU and Notre Dame prior to Christmas.

UNC Greensboro Spartans

2005-06 Record: 12-19

2005-06 SoCon Record: 4-10, fifth in North Division Coach: Mike Dement (East Carolina, 1976)

Record at UNCG: 65-73 (five years) Overall Record: 272-262 (19 years)

Scouting Report: UNC Greensboro got off to a good start last season by winning seven of its first 10 games. But coach Mike Dement's team struggled the rest of the way and finished 12-19, 4-10 in the Southern Conference. The Spartans return all five starters including All-SoCon center Kyle Hines, a junior, who lead the conference in scoring (19.3 ppg) and rebounding (8.2 rpg) while shooting 62.2 percent from the field. Also returning is senior guard Ricky Hickman, who averaged 18.7 ppg and led the league in steals (2.7). Junior guard Kevin Oleksiak averaged 12.1 ppg a year ago.

Western Carolina Catamounts

2005-06 Record: 13-17

2005-06 SoCon Record: 7-7, third in North Division

Coach: Larry Hunter (Ohio, 1971) **Record at WCU:** 13-17 (one year) Overall Record: 522-241 (26 years)

Scouting Report: Western Carolina made great strides last year under new head coach Larry Hunter. Three starters and four of last year's top six scorers return including junior guard Antonio Russell (13.3 ppg), senior guard Kyle Greathouse (8.1 ppg), junior forward Negus McKenna (6.8 ppg) and junior guard Eric Wilson (6.2 ppg). Western Carolina hasn't posted a winning record in nine years since the 1996-97 squad went 14-13 but a strong freshman class, led by forward Nick Aldridge, give the Catamounts reason for optimism.























South Division Scouting Reports

College of Charleston Cougars

2005-06 Record: 17-11

2005-06 SoCon record: 9-6, third in South Division **Coach:** Bobby Cremins (South Carolina, 1970)

Record at CofC: 0-0 (first year) Overall Record: 454-307 (26 years)

Scouting Report: Expectations are high as legendary coach Bobby Cremins came out of retirement to take over the coaching reins of the Cougars. Cremins began his coaching career at Appalachian State, winning 100 games in six seasons before moving to Georgia Tech. The College of Charleston return four starters from a team that finished with a 17-11 mark in 2005-06. Senior point guard Dontaye Draper averaged 18.5 ppg last season and will be joined by senior Renardo Dickerson (5.7 ppg), sophomore forward Jermaine Johnson (8.9 ppg, 7.5 rpg), junior center Josh Jackson (12.6 ppg) and senior forward David Lawrence (9.3 ppg, 7.0 rpg). Season tickets sold out for the first time since 1998-99 and a new arena, the Carolina First Center (5,000 capacity) is expected to open in 2008.

The Citadel Bulldogs 2005-06 Record: 10-21

2005-06 SoCon Record: 1-14, sixth in South Division

Coach: Ed Conroy (The Citadel, 1989) Record at The Citadel: 0-0 (first year) Overall Record: 41-40 (three years)

Scouting Report: New head coach Ed Conroy, a former player at The Citadel, begins the rebuilding process at his alma mater. Senior forward J'Mel Everhart (10.9 ppg, 7.6 rpg) highlights the three returning starters that include senior guard Donny McLendon (10.2 ppg) and the return of junior guard Travis Smith, who did not play for the Bulldogs last season. The Bulldogs boast more depth than in the past.

Davidson Wildcats 2005-06 Record: 20-11

2005-06 SoCon Record: 10-5, second in South Division

Coach: Bob McKillop (Hofstra, 1972) Record at DC: 282-213 (17 years) Overall Record: 282-213 (17 years)

Scouting Report: Davidson lost four starters and seven lettermen from last year's team that finished 20-11, won the Southern Conference Tournament and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. But coach Bob McKillop, winningest coach in SoCon history, is a proven winner. Despite the lack of experience, junior forwards Thomas Sander (6.5 ppg, 6.0 rpg) and Boris Meno (5.6 ppg, 6.6 rpg) will be tough upfront. Junior point guard Jason Richards (4.5 ppg) has experience and will run the team. Rebounding could be a problem but McKillop's over-achieving team surprised the experts a year ago.

Furman Paladins 2005-06 Record: 15-13

2005-06 SoCon Record: 8-7, fourth in South Division

Coach: Jeff Jackson (Cornell, 1984) Record at FU: 0-0 (first year) Overall Record: 21-60 (three years)

Scouting Report: Jeff Jackson enters his first season at the helm after serving as an assistant at Vanderbilt. He inherits a team that posted a 15-13 record and won nine of 12 games in the middle of the season. With the return of four starters and several key reserves, Jackson will have a solid line-up. Senior guard/forward Robbie Bostain (14.1 ppg, 5.7 rpg, 3.4 apg) highlights a line-up that includes senior guard Eric Webb (12.8 ppg), senior guard/forward Gerard Punch (5.5 ppg, 4.4 rpg), senior forward Moussa Diagne (11.8 ppg, 4.9 rpg) and sophomore center Stanley Jones (6.7 ppg). Diange appears fully recovered from arthroscopic foot surgery last spring.

Georgia Southern Eagles 2005-06 Record: 20-10

2005-06 SoCon Record: 11-4, first in South Division

Coach: Jeff Price (Pikeville, 1981)

Record at GSU: 122-83 (seven years) Overall Record: 258-125 (13 years)

Scouting Report: Only five lettermen, including three starters, return from last year's team that finished atop the Southern Conference's South Division. Led by Player of the Year Elton Nesbitt (21.7 ppg, 3.5 rpg and 89 assists), the Eagles advanced to the NIT. Despite the departure of Nesbitt, the Eagles have solid players in junior forward Louis Graham (11.4 ppg, 7.4 rpg) and senior guard Donte Gennie (12.7 ppg, 91 assists). Georgia Southern has amassed 59 wins in the last three seasons finishing first in the SoCon's South Division twice.

Wofford Terriers 2005-06 Record: 11-18

2005-06 SoCon Record: 6-9, fifth in South Division **Coach:** Mike Young (Emory and Henry, 1986)

Record at WC: 48-67 (four years)
Overall Record: 48-67 (four years)

Scouting Report: Wofford boasts a strong perimeter game and coach Mike Young will be looking to fill holes on the inside with the departure of seniors Howard Wilkerson (13.9 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and Tyler Berg (10.9 ppg, 5.9 rpg). Junior guard Shane Nichols averaged13.8 ppg last season with 93 three-pointers. Matt Estep (4.4 ppg) made 28 treys while playing just 308 minutes in 2005-06. Senior guard Eric Marshall averaged 12.8 ppg and 4.8 rpg a year ago and point guard Drew Gibson (6.8 ppg, 4.0 apg) gives the Terriers a solid nucleus at guard. Young will be looking for a player to step up and solidify the inside game.
