PLAYER OF THE WEEK

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – Wofford's Rachael Rose has been named Southern Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week for games played Jan. 16-22, after registering a triple double in the Terriers lone contest this week. She is the first player in conference history to win the award seven times in a single season. The award is selected by the league office.

Rose, who won the honor on Nov. 21, Dec. 5, Dec. 19, Dec. 26, Jan. 2, and Jan. 16, led Wofford offensively last week during the Terriers' 69-51 victory over conference rival Furman. Rose, a junior, scored a gameleading 19 points, grabbed 16 rebounds, and dished out 11 assists for her first career triple-double, the first in the SoCon since Anna Claire Knight accomplished the feat on Jan. 9, 2014.

The Scranton, Pennsylvania, product has scored double digit points in a programrecord 36 consecutive games and leads the SoCon in five categories including scoring (21.1), field goal percentage (.506), free throw percentage (.888), assists (5.8), and assist to turnover ratio (2.4). Rose is also the active conference leader in points, points per game, and assists per game.

Wofford (10-7, 2-1 SoCon) hosts Mercer on Thursday, Jan. 25 before welcoming Samford on Saturday, Jan. 27.

Notes

- · The third week of conference play kicks off on Thursday with all eight teams in action. Each squad will also play on Saturday.
- Chattanooga sits atop the standings after going 3-0 the first two week of conference play to inporve go 15-3, 3-0. The Mocs secured the program's most wins in nonconference play since 2014-15.
- Six teams begin the week with a .500 record or better.
- •Chattanooga sits at No.17 in the College Insiders Mid-Major women's poll having moved up for the No. 18
- •UNCG is the only SoCon team that remains unbeaten at home with an 11-0 record. Together, the men's and women's teams are 20-0 at home.
- Chattanooga grabbed the conference's first Power Five win of the season on Dec. 3 against #21 ranked Mississippi State.
- Wofford upset Virginia on Dec. 16 to take home the SoCon's second Power Five win of the season. Rose sunk the game winning shot with 0.4 second on the clock to beat the Cavaliers 71-70.
- •Wofford's Rachael Rose was named Player of the Week for the SoCon after posting her first career tripledouble scoring 19 points, grabbing 16 rebounds and dishing out 11 assists. Rose is the first player in conference history to win the award seven times in a single season. Her triple-double was the first in the conference since 2014 when Georgia Southern's Anna Claire Knight accomplished the feat.
- Rose leads the conference five categories including points per game (21.1), field goal percentage (.506), free throw percentage (.888), assists per game (5.8), and assist to turnover ratio (2.4). Rose also leads the league in 20 point games, scoring 20+ points in eleven games so far this season including a 30-point performance against Western Carolina.
- •Furman's Jada Session leads the conference in rebounding with 172 (9.1 rpg), while Western Carolina's Chelsea Wooten leads the league in threepointers (46), Samford's Emily Bowman leads in blocks (49) and UNCG's Jayde Gamble is first in steals with 53.
- Furman is the league's top scoring offense averaging 71.3 points per game. ETSU has the leagues leading defense allowing only 53.4 points, 9th in the NCAA.
- Wofford guard Rachael Rose was named the SoCon player of the month for November. The junior is the only Terrier player to earn the honor.
- The 2024 Ingles Southern Conference Women's Basketball Championship will take place March 7-9 at Harrah's Cherokee Center Asheville in Asheville, North Carolina

SoCon History

The SoCon is celebrating its 102nd anniversary in 2023. The fifth-oldest NCAA Division I college athletic association, the SoCon contested the firstever collegiate conference basketball tournament in 1921, tackled freshman eligibility in 1922, became the first conference to adopt the 3-point field goal in basketball in 1980 and developed women's championships in 1984.



SOCON CHAMPIONSHIP

The Southern Conference Basketball Championships will be held March 7-10. The women's tournament will be held March 7-9, with the men's tournament slated for March 8-10, all at the Harrah's Cherokee Center - Asheville, in Asheville, North Carolina. The tournament will include all eight women's teams and all 10 men's teams.
