### PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### Stephen Curry - Davidson

SPARTANBURG, S.C. - Davidson's Stephen Curry has been named the Southern Conference Player of the Week for all games December 9-15 the league office announced Tuesday (Dec. 16). Curry helped Davidson improve to 8-1 on the season with wins over West Virginia (68-65) and Chattanooga (100-95) last week. The junior guard averaged 34.0 points and 8.0 assists per game last week. He also added five steals and two blocked shots. The player of the week is selected by a vote of the league's basketball sports information directors.

Curry, who leads the nation in scoring with 31.9 points per game, scored all 10 of Davidson's points in a decisive 10-4 run as the Wildcats defeated West Virginia at Madison Square Garden last week. He then scored 41 points, including a school-record 31, in the second half of Davidson's 100-95 victory over Chattanooga on Saturday. He has scored at least 40 points a school-record five times in his career. Curry is 11th in the nation in assists per game (6.8 apg) and ranks 15th in steals per game (2.9 spg).

# TEAM REPORTS

## APPALACHIAN STATE MOUNTAINEERS



- Center Ike Butts recorded his league-leading sixth double-double of the season with 13 points and 15 rebounds in the loss to ETSU. The last time a Mountaineer had six double-doubles in the first seven games of a season was 1980-81 when Charles Payton opened the season with seven double-doubles in the first eight games.
- Appalachian State has started 2-0 in conference play for the second time in three years. The Mountaineers began the 2006-07 season 4-0 in league play, en route to a 15-3 mark. It is the third time they have started the league schedule 2-0 under Houston Fancher.
- The Mountaineers take on Kentucky December 20 in Louisville.

## CHATTANOOGA MOCS



- Senior Stephen McDowell scored a team-high 28 points against East Tennessee State on Wednesday. McDowell's 28 points was the tenth best single-game output by a SoCon player this season. With 31 points against Davidson, McDowell has averaged 29.5 points over the last two games.
- The Mocs have done much of their scoring damage from beyond the arc this season. Chattanooga is third in the conference with 8.9 made three pointers per game.
- The Mocs visit Mississippi Valley State Saturday, December 20.

## ELON PHOENIX



- Sophomore Chris Long tied his career high with eight assists in games against The Citadel and College of Charleston last week. Long leads the conference with 6.8 helpers per game. The Phoenix lead the SoCon in assists (16.3) and rank third in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.1).
- Senior Brett James is just five points shy of the 1,000-point plateau. James is on pace to become just the 32nd player in school history to reach the career milestone. He is the league's active career leader in blocked shots with 71.
- The Phoenix host Lees-McRae College Friday night.

## UNC GREENSBORO SPARTANS



- Junior forward Ben Stywall has been a consistent performer on the front line for the Spartans this season. Stywall is averaging 7.0 points and 8.4 points per game. He has pulled down at least seven rebounds in seven of UNCG's eight games this season. In addition, he has recorded at least two blocked shots in five different games this year.
- Mikko Koivisto has made at least one three-point shot in each of his last 32 games which is the third-longest active streak in the nation. Ryan Toolson of Utah Valley State owns the longest active streak with 55 consecutive games.
- UNCG travels to face the Dayton Flyers on Saturday.

## SAMFORD BULLDOGS



- Samford has been one of the top defensive teams in the league this season. The Bulldogs lead the SoCon in points allowed (60.9 ppg) and rank second in field goal percentage allowed (.420).
- Samford's Trey Montgomery has been the team's top rebounder this season. Not only is Montgomery the Bulldogs' floor general from the point guard position, but he has also led the team in rebounding in five of their last six games. Montgomery is averaging 5.5 rebounds per contest and is ranked third on the team with 9.3 points per game.
- Samford visits Chicago State Saturday afternoon.

## WESTERN CAROLINA CATAMOUNTS



- Western Carolina is second in the conference with a +11.4 scoring margin this season. The Catamounts lead the league in rebounding (42.9 rpg), offensive rebounds (17.3 rpg) and second in made three pointers (9.0).
- Jake Robinson scored a team-high 23 points against Gardner-Webb Wednesday. Robinson is sixth in the league in scoring (15.5 ppg).
- The Catamounts travel to take on Marquette Friday in Milwaukee.

## COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON COUGARS



- The Cougars moved to 8-1 with a win over Coastal Carolina this week. The Cougars are off to their best start since opening the 2003-04 season with a 9-1 mark. CofC won its first two league openers for the first time since that same season.
- Head coach Bobby Cremins picked up his 500th career victory this week. He currently tied for 68th on the NCAA's all-time victories list, while his 500 career wins ranks 17th on the active wins total list.
- The Cougars host UNC-Wilmington Friday at Carolina First Arena.

## DAVIDSON WILDCATS



- Davidson is 8-1 after defeating West Virginia and Chattanooga last week. It is the best start for the Wildcats since opening the 1969-70 season 11-1 under Terry Holland.
- The Wildcats have won 31 consecutive league games. It is the third longest conference consecutive wins streak in conference history. They need three more wins to tie North Carolina's streak of 34 for second place.
- The Wildcats face Purdue on Saturday in Indianapolis as part of the Wooden Tradition.

## FURMAN PALADINS



- Sophomore Jordan Miller has dramatically increased his production from last year. Miller averaged 5.2 points and 2.1 rebounds per game as a freshman in 2007-08. He is fifth in the SoCon and leads the Paladins with 15.0 points per game this season. Miller is shooting 48 percent from the field.
- Bryson Barnes leads the SoCon with 1.8 blocked shots per game. Barnes has recorded at least one blocked shot in six of Furman's eight games this season.
- The Paladins return to the court Monday night in Nashville against Vanderbilt.

## GEORGIA SOUTHERN EAGLES



- Head coach Jeff Price ranks 13th all-time for most wins at a SoCon school with 160 victories at Georgia Southern. Price needs just nine more victories to pass Malcolm J. Pitt (Richmond) for 12th place.
- Junior Antonio Hanson hit seven three pointers for a team-high 21 points at Drake on Friday. His seven treys are tied for sixth-most in school history.
- The Eagles have nine days off before travelling to Gainesville, Fla., to face the Florida Gators December 22.

## THE CITADEL BULLDOGS



- The Citadel has made tremendous strides on the defensive end of the floor from last season. The Bulldogs yielded 74.3 points per game in 2007-08, but have allowed just 65.6 points through 11 games this season, the second-best mark in the conference.
- Sophomore Cameron Wells has distinguished himself as a multi-dimensional player for the Bulldogs. Wells is fourth in the SoCon in scoring (15.6 ppg) and also ranks 11th in assists (2.9 apg). He is 15th in the league in free throw percentage (.744) and is second in the conference in minutes played (33.5 mpg).
- The Citadel visits South Carolina Saturday evening.

## WOFFORD TERRIERS



- Junior Salters scored a team-high 25 points in Wofford's 82-41 win over Union College Wednesday. Salters is third in the league with 16.9 points per game this season. Salters ranks fourth in the league with 2.1 steals per game.
- The Terriers have limited their opponents to just 30.0 rebounds per game, the best mark in the SoCon. Wofford ranks third in the conference with a +3.6 rebounding margin. Tim Johnson and Noah Dahlman both rank in the league's top 10 in rebounding.
- Wofford travels to face the Georgia Bulldogs on Saturday (Dec. 20).

## CONFERENCE NOTES

### RPI STRENGTH

The Southern Conference ranks ninth in the Men's Basketball RPI Report, released December 15. The league has garnered the second-highest strength of schedule rating among 31 Division I conferences. Four of the league's teams (Davidson, 27; Western Carolina 33; College of Charleston, 68; Wofford, 83) all rank in the top 100.

### STREAKING

Davidson owns a 31-game conference winning streak after defeating Chattanooga, 100-95 on December 13. The Wildcats won their final 10 games during league play in 2006-07, before posting a 20-0 mark last year. Davidson's streak is the third-longest conference consecutive wins streak in league history.

- West Virginia won a league-best 44 straight conference games from 1956-1960. North Carolina won 34 straight league games from 1923-25.

### TWO FOR THREE

The Southern Conference was the first league to implement a three-point line, establishing the mark at 22 feet during the 1980-81 season. Western Carolina's Ronnie Carr made the first three-point field goal in college basketball history in a game against Middle Tennessee State on November 29, 1980.

- Georgia Southern's Willie Powers made the first three-point field goal for the 2008-09 season, knocking down a triple against Houston on November 10. It was the first made three-point field goal from the new distance of 20-feet, nine inches.

### NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULING

Southern Conference teams are scheduled to take on some of the top competition across the country. Seven of the 12 SoCon teams will participate in at least one exempt tournament this winter, spanning from Cancun, Mexico (The Citadel) to Alaska (Western Carolina).

- SoCon teams are scheduled to participate in the Air Force Classic, Cancun Challenge, Charleston Classic, Coaches vs. Cancer Tournament, Drake Invitational, Great Alaska Shootout, Jimmy V Classic, NIT Season Tip-Off, Puerto Rico Tip-Off and Wooden Tradition.

### BRACKETBUSTERS 2009

Four Southern Conference teams will take part in the 2009 ESPNU BracketBusters event February 20-21. The event will feature 13 nationally televised games - on either ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU - selected from a pool of 102 teams.

- Davidson and Georgia Southern have been designated as home teams during the event, while Appalachian State and Elon will take to the road. The matchups for the 13 nationally televised games will be announced Feb. 2.

# SOUTHERN CONFERENCE NEWS AND NOTES

## CONFERENCE NOTES

### TOURNEY TIME

The 2009 Southern Conference Tournament will be held March 6-9 at The McKenzie Arena in Chattanooga. All 12 members of the Southern Conference will take part in the conference tournament. The championship game, scheduled for March 9, will be televised by ESPN2.

- The 2009 tournament will be the second time the league has held its conference championship in Chattanooga, after using the same site in 2005. The host Mocs downed UNC Greensboro, 65-62, in the final that year.

### HALL OF FAME

Southern Conference Commissioner John Iamarino announced the formation of the SoCon Hall of Fame for 2009. The league will induct its inaugural class during a ceremony in Spartanburg, S.C., on May 9. The Southern Conference is in its 88th season of intercollegiate competition and will begin recognizing many prominent student-athletes, coaches and administrators from the 43 current and former institutions that have been a part of the league's distinguished history.

- Among the nominees for consideration from Southern Conference men's basketball are Dick Groat (Duke), "Hot" Rod Hundley (West Virginia), Frank Selvy (Furman) and Jerry West (West Virginia).

### EXPERIENCE ON THE BENCH

All 12 head coaches return to the bench for 2008-09. The current league head coaches have a combined 84 years of experience within the Southern Conference.

- Davidson's Bob McKillop is the longest tenured coach in the SoCon, entering his 20th season on the bench for the Wildcats. Bobby Cremins (College of Charleston), Ed Conroy (The Citadel) and Jeff Jackson (Furman) are all in their third season with their current school.

### EXPERIENCE ON THE COURT

The 12 Southern Conference schools combined to return 105 lettermen from the 2007-08 season, an average of 8.75 returners per team. Eleven of the 12 SoCon teams returned at least eight lettermen from 2007-08.

- Three schools (College of Charleston, The Citadel and Furman) returned all five starters for 2008-09. Ten of the 12 leagues schools returned at least three starters from 2007-08.

### SCHEDULE CHANGE

The 2008-09 season will mark the final year of the 20-game conference schedule in the Southern Conference. The SoCon Council of Presidents decided in early November to move to an 18-game conference schedule beginning with the 2009-10 season.

### PRESEASON PLAUDITS

The Davidson Wildcats were ranked 20th in both preseason polls released by the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today. It was the first time a SoCon team has appeared in the preseason rankings since Davidson was ranked fifth to start the 1969-70 season.

### NEW MEMBERSHIP

Samford University, located in Birmingham, Ala., begins its first season as a member of the Southern Conference after officially joining the league on July 1, 2008. The Bulldogs, who play their home games in the 5,000-seat Pete Hanna Center, finished last season 14-16, including a 10-10 mark in Ohio Valley conference play.
