Quick Hits

- Chattanooga's Keegan Bell, College of Charleston's Andrew Lawrence, Davidson's JP Kuhlman and Western Carolina's Trey Sumler have been named to the Cousy Award Watch List. The Cousy Award is given annually to the nation's top point guard.

- Chattanooga's Omar Wattad leads the SoCon and ranks 35th nationally with 2.8 made three-pointers per game.

- League play resumes January 5th.

- The Southern Conference Tournament will be held in Asheville, N.C., March 2-5 at the newly renovated Asheville Civic Center. The league's tournament was held in Asheville from 1984-1995.

Player of the Week

Davidson junior Nik Cochran has been named the Southern Conference Player of the Week. Cochran scored a team-high 21 points, 19 of which came in the second half, as Davidson knocked off No. 12 Kansas 80-74 in Kansas City, Mo., Monday night.

Holding a three-point lead with 1:25 remaining in the game, Cochran hit a 25-foot three-pointer to give the Wildcats a 71-65 advantage. Cochran connected on 7-of-8 free throws during the game's final 3:04 to seal the win. He shot 5-of-6 from the field and was 4-of-5 from three-point range as all four of his triples came in the second

half. The Vancouver native added three assists and two rebounds in just 21 minutes of action against the Jayhawks.

Cochran leads the Southern Conference in free throw percentage (.929) and ranks fourth in three-point percentage (.467).

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included Appalachian State's Omar Carter, College of Charleston's Antwaine Wiggins, The Citadel's Mike Groselle, Furman's Bryson Barnes, Chattanooga's Drazen Zlovacic, Samford's Drew Windler and Wofford's Kevin Giltner.

MOUNTAINEERS NORTH DIVISION

Appalachian State became the first team in more than a calendar year to score 80 or more points against North Carolina in the Smith Center on Saturday, when the Mountaineers posted 82 in a setback against the nation's No. 5 team. Long Beach State last accomplished the feat on Dec. 10, 2010.

Omar Carter led the Mountaineers with 21 points on 7-of-15 shooting in the game, to accompany a team-high seven rebounds. Four players reached double figures in the game, including freshmen Tab Hamilton and Mike Neal, who each set career scoring highs and combined for 26 points in front of the crowd of more than 20,000.



COUGARS SOUTH DIVISION

The Cougars are off to their second-best start in the Bobby Cremins Era (2006-Present) at 9-1 which is tied for the fourth-best start in the program's NCAA Division I history with one loss or less in the first 14 games of the season.

Senior Antwane Wiggins, who currently leads the Southern Conference in scoring (18.1 ppg) is looking to place himself among the list of Cougar greats who have reached 1,000 career points at CofC. He is seven points shy of the honor and would become the 29th player in school history to reach the career mark.



PHOENIX NORTH DIVISION

Elon leads the Southern Conference with 38.0 rebounds per game, but the Phoenix have a -2.3 rebounding margin as Elon ranks last in the league in rebounding defense (40.3 rpg). Sebastian Koch leads the team with 6.1 rebounds per game.

Sophomore Lucas Troutman recorded two blocked shots at Dartmouth Saturday afternoon. Troutman ranks second in the SoCon with 1.7 blocks per game.

The Phoenix travel San Diego State Thursday.



BULLDOGS SOUTH DIVISION

Junior center Mike Groselle recently became the 45th member of The Citadel's 500-point, 300-rebound club. Groselle has scored 67 points and pulled down 45 rebounds (26 offensive) during the month of December. Among those players in this exclusive group, 18 amassed more than 1,000 points in their careers

The Citadel's trip to play Denver University is their third visit to the state of Colorado in the last 370 days. The Bulldogs will travel a total of 3,812 miles (Harrisonburg, Va. to Denver, Colo.) before returning to Charleston.



SPARTANS NORTH DIVISION

Kyle Randall scored 12 points and Derrell Armstrong added 11 as UNCG fell at Duke (90-63) Monday night.

The Spartans named 28-year old Wes Miller the interim head coach last week. He is the youngest head coach in the nation.

Sophomore swingman Trevis Simpson scored 24 points in loss to East Carolina, his third 20-point effort of the season.

The Spartans host 2011 Final Four squad VCU on Thursday.



WILDCATS SOUTH DIVISION

Davidson's 80-74 win over No. 12 Kansas Monday night gave the Wildcats a win over a ranked opponent for the first time since topping Wisconsin 73-56 in the 2008 NCAA Tournament. It was Davidson's first win over a ranked team in the regular season since defeating South Carolina Jan. 12, 1974. It was the 'Cats first win over a ranked opponent on the road since defeating St. John's 88-84 Jan. 4, 1972.

Davidson has won 17 of its last 23 games, dating back to last season.

The Wildcats visit UMass Thursday night.



BULLDOGS NORTH DIVISION

In Saturday's 90-64 home win over Spring Hill, the Bulldogs shot 51.7 percent from the field and 45.8 percent from 3-point range. Samford's 90 points scored against Spring Hill was its highest total since losing at UT Martin, 101-94, in triple overtime March 4, 2008, in the opening round of the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament.

The Bulldogs will play at No. 3 Kentucky on Tuesday in Lexington, Ky. The Wildcats will be Samford's highest-ranked opponent since the Bulldogs opened the 2006-07 campaign on the road against the No. 1-ranked and defending national champion Florida. Samford lost the game, 79-54.



PALADINS SOUTH DIVISION

Senior Bryson Barnes, playing in his first game of the year after sitting out the first semester, scored a career-high 26 points and grabbed 11 rebounds to lead Furman past Western Kentucky 76-63 on Saturday.

Furman has made 54-of-67 free throw attempts over its past two games and ranks second in the league and 21st nationally shooting 75.1 percent from the charity stripe.

The Paladins travel to Presbyterian Tuesday night. Furman will visit Georgia Friday.



MOCs NORTH DIVISION

Ricky Taylor graduated Saturday, Dec. 17, with his degree in accounting. He immediately left for Lexington after receiving his degree and started at No. 3 Kentucky scoring 11 points and dishing out a career-high five assists.

Keegan Bell became the Mocs all-time assist leader with four assists at Kentucky. He now has 416 eclipsing Tim Brooks (1992-93) and Wes Moore (1996-99) who are now tied for second with 414.

The Mocs host Hiwassee College Wednesday afternoon.



EAGLES SOUTH DIVISION

Willie Powers III scored a team-high 16 points as Georgia Southern fell at South Alabama (70-57) Monday night. Ben Drayton III tallied 11 points and five assists for the Eagles.

The Eagles have been one of the best teams in the league defending the three-point. GSU has limited its opponents to just 43 made triples, the lowest mark in the league. GSU's opponents have made just 27.6 percent of their shots from beyond the arc, the second-lowest mark in the league.

Georgia Southern visits Georgia State Thursday.



CATAMOUNTS NORTH DIVISION

WCU saw its 10-game home winning streak against nonconference foes come to an end with the two-point, 58-56, home loss to Kent State on Saturday, Dec. 10. The Catamounts led by four with 2:36 to play, but were outscored 7-to-1 over the closing moments to drop their second-straight on the season, and second-consecutive to Kent State.

WCU returns to the hardwood Tuesday when it visits Bradley in nonconference action in Peoria, Ill. The Catamounts have won two-straight over the Braves, rallying in the second half in both of the last two seasons to score victories.



TERRIERS SOUTH DIVISION

Wofford leads the SoCon in scoring defense (61.2 ppg), while its field goal percentage defense (.407) is second in the conference.

Seniors Brad Loesing and Kevin Giltner are first and second in minutes played this season in the SoCon at 38.5 and 37.7, respectively.

After the Terriers lost 78 percent of their scoring from last season, several players have increased their production. Kevin Giltner has gone from 6.2 points per game to 15.9 and Brad Loesing has gone from 6.2 points to 13.2 points. Drew Crowell has jumped from 1.4 points to an 8.1 ppg average.

Conference News and Notes

Athlete of the Month

The Citadel's Mike Groselle was named the SoCon Athlete of the Month for men's basketball. Groselle recorded five double-doubles in November. The junior center hit at least six field goals in all five games, including a 9-for-12 shooting performance against VMI. He averaged 18.2 points and 11.2 rebounds per game in November.

Divisional Play

The Southern Conference established the North and South divisions in men's basketball prior to the 1994-95 season. Nine of the 12 current members have won at least a share of a division championship over the last 17 seasons. The Citadel, Furman and Samford, which joined the league in 2008, have not won their division.

- Davidson leads the league with 10 division championships while Chattanooga has won eight.

Familiar Faces

A total of 104 lettermen returned to the Southern Conference in 2011-12. Three of the 12 schools boast at least 10 returnees from last season. League teams average 8.7 returners from 2010-11.

- Conference teams return 33 starters from last year, an average of 2.8 per team. Appalachian State, Davidson, Georgia Southern, UNCG and Chattanooga each return four starters. The Citadel, Furman and Wofford each return just one starter from last year.
- Just two players (Omar Cater - ASU and Omar Wattad - UTC) from the 2011 Coaches All-Conference team return for 2011-12.

Making The Leap

The Southern Conference has had four teams improve their win total by a minimum of nine games over the last three years.

- Furman won 22 games last year after posting just 13 wins in 2010.
- Wofford went from 16 wins in 2009 to 26 victories in 2010.
- Both College of Charleston and The Citadel made impressive jumps in 2009. The Cougars went from 16 wins in 2008 to 27 the next year. The Citadel had one of the greatest turnounds in league history, improving from just six wins in 2008 to 20 in 2009.

Repeat Performance

The Wofford Terriers won the conference tournament in 2011 after winning the title in 2010. It was the 16th time a team had won at least back-to-back conference tournament championships.

NBA Draft

College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock was selected in the second round (#46 overall) of the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. Goudelock became the 107th Southern Conference player taken in the draft and the first Cougar to be selected after competing in the league.

- Seven of the league's 12 members have had at least one player taken in the NBA draft.

Southern Conference News and Notes

Turning Two

Wofford won the league's men's basketball championship in 2011 after winning a share of the conference football crown the previous fall, becoming just the fifth school in league history to win both championships in the same year.

- Appalachian State was the last team to win both titles as the Mountaineers accomplished the rare feat during the 1999-2000 school year. Davidson won both championships in 1969-70.
- Duke won both titles in the same year three times during the 1940s, while West Virginia won the SoCon football and basketball championships in the same academic year five different times.

Freshman Honors

UNCG's Trevis Simpson was named to the league's all-freshman team in 2011. It was the third consecutive year that a Spartan was named to the league's all-freshman squad.

- Point guard Kyle Randall was named to the all-freshman team in 2010, while Damian Eargle was selected in 2009.

Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 959, seven points higher than the national average of 952 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores October 25. Nine of the twelve SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for Division I men's basketball programs.

Annual Leaders

Furman limited its opponents to just 64.4 points per game last season. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the SoCon in scoring defense.

- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

Western Carolina's Mike Williams led the league in steals last year (2.0 spg) making it four consecutive seasons that a Catamount has led the Southern Conference in steals.

- Brigham Waginger, now an assistant coach at WCU, led the league in steals three consecutive seasons (2008-10).

College of Charleston led the league in scoring with 76.2 points per game. It was the second straight year the Cougars led the conference in offense after posting 75.0 points per game in 2010. The Cougars' 2,173 points last year was the seventh highest single-season total in league history.

- Davidson led the Southern Conference in scoring four straight seasons from 2006-09.

College of Charleston also led the league with 306 made three-pointers last year, the fifth highest single-season total in league history.

- Elon connected on 285 made triples last season, which tied for the ninth-best single season total.

SoCon Sports Network

This summer the conference office announced a partnership with Public Television to carry an eight-game Southern Conference men's basketball package. The agreement provides state-wide distribution of SoCon games throughout Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina. Additional affiliates in Birmingham, Ala., and Chattanooga, Tenn., have also signed on to carry the league package. The distribution platform will reach more than 12 million homes through 34 affiliates.

- Each of the eight games produced for public television will be streamed online live through ESPN3 as well as the respective public television websites.
