### Quick Hits

- Eight Southern Conference teams open the 2016-17 season Friday night. Wofford begins its campaign Saturday at LSU, while Samford's first game is Monday vs. San Diego.
- A league-record six teams advanced to the postseason in 2016.
- All 10 Southern Conference head coaches return to the bench in 2016-17.
- The SoCon's 10 schools return a total of 84 lettermen from last season.
- Western Carolina's Larry Hunter and Wofford's Mike Young both rank among the top 15 winningest coaches in league history.
- The 2017 Southern Conference tournament will be held March 3-6 at the U.S. Cellular Center in Asheville, N.C.

### Preseason Poll

The Chattanooga Mocs have been tabbed the preseason favorite to win the Southern Conference men's basketball title for the second consecutive season, according to a vote by the league's head coaches.

Head coach Matt McCall returns four starters and seven lettermen from a team that finished 29-6 a season ago and posted a 15-3 mark in conference play. Chattanooga was picked first in preseason balloting with 80 points on the strength of eight first-place votes.

ETSU was slotted second (74) and received two first-place votes. Head coach Steve Forbes led the Bucs to a 24-12 mark in his first season at ETSU. The Bucs went 14-4 in league play and advanced to the title game of the league tournament. ETSU advanced to the postseason in 2016 and participated in the Vegas 16 tournament.

Wofford (57) edged Mercer (55) for third place in the preseason balloting. Furman and UNCG tied for fifth place with 50 points apiece.

Samford was slotted seventh (32), while Western Carolina came in eighth (20). VMI (19) and The Citadel (13) rounded out the poll.

## Conference News and Notes

### Familiar Faces

Southern Conference teams return 84 lettermen for the 2015-16 season. Eight of 10 schools boast at least eight returnees from last season. League teams averaged 8.4 returners from 2015-16.

- Conference teams return 28 starters from last year, an average of 2.8 per team. Furman, UNCG and Chattanooga each return four starters from last season.
- Six of the 10 members from the 2016 Coaches All-Southern Conference team return for 2016-17.

### Nonconference Scheduling

Nine of the 10 SoCon teams are scheduled to participate in exempt tournaments this year. SoCon teams will take part in the Holy City Hoops Classic (The Citadel), Sanford Pentagon Showcase (ETSU), CBE Hall of Fame Classic (Furman), Savannah Invitational (Mercer), High Point Tournament (UNCG), San Diego Classic (Samford), Maui Jim Maui Invitational Mainland (Chattanooga), Global Sports Invitational (Western Carolina) and Gulf Coast Showcase (Wofford).

### Head Coaches

All 10 Southern Conference head coaches return to the bench in the league for 2016-17. The current head coaches have a combined 42 years of experience in the SoCon.

- Wofford head coach Mike Young ranks fourth on the league's all-time wins list. Young has tallied 232 wins with the Terriers and needs just 12 victories to move past Maryland's Burton Shipley into third place. Young was named the 2015 Coach of the Year by both the league's media and head coaches.
- Western Carolina's Larry Hunter has 171 victories at WCU and ranks 14th on the league's all-time wins list.

### One-Possession Games

Southern Conference teams played 90 league games during the 2015-16 regular season. Twenty-one games (23 percent) were decided by one possession or went into overtime.

- In 2015, the league had 23 of 90 (26 percent) conference games decided by one possession.
- In 2014, the league had 17 of 88 (19 percent) conference games decided by one possession.
- In 2013, the league had 30 of 108 (28 percent) conference games decided by one possession.
- In 2012, the league had 32 of 108 (30 percent) conference games decided by one possession.

### Sudden Impact

Wofford's Fletcher Magee was named the league's Freshman of the Year by the league's coaches in 2016. Magee joined Ian Chadwick (1998) and Karl Cochran (2012) as the only Terriers to win the award.

### Defensive Presence

Chattanooga's Justin Tuoyo was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. He is the only player to earn the award twice since it began in 2009. Z. Mason earned the nod in 2014, giving the Mocs three straight winners.

## Southern Conference News and Notes

### Annual Leaders

Furman led the league in scoring defense as the Paladins allowed just 66.7 points per game last season.

- Wofford led the SoCon in fewest points allowed for four straight seasons (2012-15). Furman was the last team other than Wofford to lead the league in scoring defense, back in 2011.

Wofford led the league in 3-point field-goal percentage (.408). It was the highest percentage by a SoCon team since Davidson connected on 41.7 percent of its 3-pointers during the 2002-03 season.

Mercer led the SoCon in rebounding margin (+8.8). It is the highest margin in the league since College of Charleston was +9.0 in 2006.

### Postseason Performance

A Southern Conference-record six teams advanced to the postseason in 2016.

- Chattanooga earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tourney, where the Mocs fell to Indiana in the first round.
- UNCG and WCU both earned bids to the CBI. The Spartans knocked off Houston Baptist at home before dropping a five-point decision (72-67) at Ohio. Western Carolina was eliminated in the first round at Vermont.
- Furman and Mercer were accepted to the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. The Paladins held off Louisiana-Monroe in their first game before falling to Louisiana. Mercer dropped its first game of the tournament at Coastal Carolina.
- ETSU advanced to the semifinals of the inaugural Vegas 16 tournament. After topping Louisiana Tech, the Bucs fell to Oakland University.

### Preseason Honors

Chattanooga was picked to win the 2016-17 Southern Conference championship in pre-season balloting conducted by the league's head coaches. The Mocs return four starters and seven lettermen from last season's team that went 29-6.

- ETSU was picked second and earned two first-place votes, while Mercer was tabbed third.
- Chattanooga's Tre' McLean was named the league's preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the preseason all-conference team by teammates Casey Jones and Justin Tuoyo. Seven of the league's 10 teams had at least one player on the preseason all-conference team.

### Close Encounters

Southern Conference teams were 14-7 last season in nonconference games that were decided by one possession or went into overtime.

- SoCon teams went 7-5 in nonconference games that were decided by one possession or went into overtime in 2014-15.
- League teams went 6-13 in nonconference games that were decided by one possession or went into overtime during the 2013-14 season.

### Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA, in May 2016, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 961. It was the eighth consecutive year that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate.

### Conference Tournament

The 2017 Southern Conference Tournament presented by General Shale will be held March 3-6 in Asheville, N.C., at the U.S. Cellular Center. This year's tournament final will be Monday, March 6, at 7:00 p.m. The oldest conference tournament in the nation, the SoCon tournament was first held in 1921, and 2017 marks the 97th year of the postseason classic.
