Quick Hits

- Georgia Southern's 11-game improvement in league play is tied for the second-best turnaround in league history.
- UNCG's Trevis Simpson averaged 18.2 points per game this season to become the first Spartan to lead the league in scoring.
- The Citadel's Mike Groselle became the first Bulldog to lead the SoCon in rebounding. The junior averages 9.7 rebounds per game.
- Wofford won at least 10 league games for the fourth straight season.
- The Phoenix earned the second seed in the North Division. Elon's nine conference wins marks the most under head coach Matt Matheny.

Tournament Notes

- The Southern Conference Tournament will be held in Asheville, N.C., March 2-5 at the newly renovated U.S. Cellular Center. The league's tournament was held in Asheville from 1984-1995.
- Davidson won the South Division with a league record of 16-2. The Wildcats have won 11 division titles, the most of any current SoCon school.
- UNCG clinched the North Division title and earned a first-round bye in the SoCon Tournament. It is the first time the Spartans have earned the division crown outright.
- Chattanooga and Davidson have each won 10 SoCon Tournaments, the most among current league members.
- Saturday's quarterfinals will be televised on ESPN3. Sunday's semifinals will be shown on the SoCon Sports Network, as well as ESPN3. Monday's title game will air on ESPN2.
- Since the league went to divisional play in 1994-95 a team from the South Division has won the tournament nine times, while the North Division has won it on eight occasions.
- No team has won both the men's and women's championships in the same year.



MOUNTAINEERS NORTH DIVISION

Nathan Healy scored a game-high 19 points Wednesday but the Mountaineers fell on the road at The Citadel, 62-51. Andre Williamson posted a double-double in the loss with 10 points and a game-high 14 rebounds.

Appalachian State leads the league in blocks with 4.1 blocked shots per game. Williamson leads the SoCon with 1.4 blocks per contest.

The Mountaineers travel to face Western Carolina Saturday afternoon.



COUGARS SOUTH DIVISION

The Cougars will honor lone senior Antwaine Wiggins on Senior Night versus Georgia Southern in a pre-game ceremony. Wiggins is one of only four SoCon players to rank in the top 10 in scoring (16.3 ppg) and rebounding (6.6 rpg). He currently ranks 17th all-time in career scoring with 1,268 points in the CofC record books which is 10th-best in the program's Division I history. Wiggins also ranks fifth all-time in career rebounds (687) and seventh in career three-pointers made (171).

CofC has won four of its last five games under interim head coach Mark Byington and will close out the regular season this week against Georgia Southern and The Citadel.



PHOENIX NORTH DIVISION

Elon has used the three-point shot as part of its offensive attack. The Phoenix rank second in the league in three-point shooting (35.7 percent) and are fourth in triples per game (8.1 3fg).

The Phoenix has eight league wins, the most under head coach Matt Matheny. Elon is one win shy of tying the most overall victories under Matheny (14).

Elon will travel to Davidson Thursday. The Phoenix close the regular season Saturday against UNCG.



BULLDOGS SOUTH DIVISION

Bo Holston recorded a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds as The Citadel downed Appalachian State 62-51 Wednesday. Center Mike Groselle poured in a team-high 18 points.

Groselle is one double-double shy of Regan Truesdale for the most in Citadel history. Truesdale completed his four-year career with 22. Groselle (21) posted his school record 13th of the season when he finished with 17 points and 10 rebounds against Western Carolina.

The Bulldogs host College of Charleston Saturday afternoon.



SPARTANS NORTH DIVISION

The Spartans lead the league with 13.8 offensive rebounds per game.

UNCG's ten SoCon victories are the most since the 2007-08 squad won 12 league games.

Sophomore Trevis Simpson needs just 13 points to become the ninth player in school history to score 500 points in a season.

UNCG will travel to Elon Saturday to close the regular season.



WILDCATS SOUTH DIVISION

Davidson needs one more win to claim the South Division crown.

The Wildcats have won 22 of their last 25 SoCon regular-season games, dating back to last season.

Davidson has won at least 20 games for the 10th time under head coach Bob McKillop.

The Wildcats will host Elon Thursday night. Davidson will close the regular season Saturday night at Georgia Southern.



BULLDOGS NORTH DIVISION

With Samford's 55-49 victory against Furman on Saturday, the Bulldogs' head coach Jimmy Tillette earned the 100th home conference win of his illustrious career. Over the years, Samford has excelled under the tutelage of Tillette and with his guidance the Bulldogs own a stellar 100-54 record against conference opponents at home.

Since moving into the starting lineup against The Citadel on January 7, Samford true freshman Rajion Kelly is averaging 11.5 points, 3.8 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 33.2 minutes per outing.

Samford visits Western Carolina Thursday.



PALADINS SOUTH DIVISION

Furman ranks second in the conference and is 44th nationally in free throw shooting (.736). Sophomore Richard Brown leads the Paladins, connecting on 85 percent of his free throw attempts.

The Paladins rank second in the conference in scoring defense, as they have yielded just 65.2 points per game. Furman leads the conference in defending the three-point arc. The Paladins' opponents are shooting just 30 percent from three-point range.

Furman hosts Chattanooga Thursday night at Timmons Arena. The Paladins will visit Wofford Saturday.



MOCS NORTH DIVISION

In his last five games, junior forward Drazen Zlovacic is averaging 14.4 points and 7.2 rebounds per game. He is shooting 65.3 percent from the floor (32-49) and 72.7 percent (8-11) from the free throw line during that span.

Senior guard Keegan Bell has 520 assists at UTC. He is 10 assists from the 10th-most in SoCon history (530, Kevin Young, Western Carolina, 1979-82). Bell is 14th in the nation in assists averaging 6.2 per contest.

Senior guard Ricky Taylor is four points shy of 1200 for his career.



EAGLES SOUTH DIVISION

Sophomore Eric Ferguson ranks sixth in the league in scoring (15.2 ppg) and is third in rebounding (7.2 rpg). Ferguson is shooting 57 percent from the field which is the third best mark in the conference.

After winning just one league game last season, Georgia Southern has 12 conference wins through 16 games. The Eagles are currently in second place in the South Division.

Georgia Southern will travel to College of Charleston Thursday night. The Eagles close the regular season at home against Davidson Saturday night.



CATAMOUNTS NORTH DIVISION

Keaton Cole finished with 10 three-pointers last week to give him 91 for the season, which ranks second on the school's career ledger. Cole is now just eight treys shy of tying WCU's single-season record held by current assistant coach Anquell McCollum (99, 1995-96).

Western Carolina won both games last week, snapping several streaks in the process. Thursday's home victory over The Citadel halted a five-game losing skid in the overall series with the Bulldogs while also ending a three-game seasonal slide. Saturday's road victory over Elon halted an eight-game road losing streak as WCU picked up its first road win of calendar year 2012.



TERRIERS SOUTH DIVISION

Brad Loesing scored 19 points at UNCG Tuesday and became the 42nd Terrier to reach the 1,000 mark.

Drew Crowell leads the SoCon in field goal percentage at 61.7 percent from the field. If he continues, it would mark the fourth time in the last five seasons a Terrier has led the SoCon in that category.

Wofford has won at least ten games in SoCon play for the fourth straight season.

The Terriers host Furman Saturday night.

Conference News and Notes

One Possession Games

The Southern Conference played 108 league games during the regular season. A total of 32 games (30 percent) were either decided by one possession or gone into overtime.

- There have been nine games that have gone to overtime, while 23 contests have been decided by one possession at the end of regulation.

Moving Forward

Georgia Southern won 12 conference games this season after going 1-15 in league play last year. The Eagles' 11-game improvement is among the best mark in league history.

Athletes of the Month

Jake Cohen earned Player of the Month honors in January as he averaged 18.5 points, 6.4 rebounds and 1.7 blocked shots per game in a 7-1 month for the Wildcats. The junior forward had five consecutive games with 20-plus points and two double-doubles during the month. Cohen shot 59 percent from the floor, 50 percent from 3-point range and 88 percent from the free-throw line for the month.

Antwaine Wiggins was earned December Athlete of the Month honors in men's basketball. Wiggins led College of Charleston to a 5-2 record in the month. He averaged a team-and conference-leading 18.7 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Wiggins tied a career-high with 24 points against his home state Tennessee Vols, including 15 in the second half of play. Wiggins also reached a milestone of his own becoming the 29th player in school history to reach 1,000 career points with his jumper at the 8:32 minute mark of the first half at Louisville on Dec. 20.

The Citadel's Mike Groselle was named the SoCon Athlete of the Month for men's basketball in November. Groselle recorded five double-doubles during the month. The junior center hit at least six field goals in all five games, including a 9-for-12 shooting performance against VMI. He averaged 18.2 points and 11.2 rebounds per game in November.

Point Production

Davidson leads the Southern Conference with 77.9 points per game.

- Either Davidson or College of Charleston has led the league in scoring every year since 2006.

Southern Conference News and Notes

Making The Leap

The Southern Conference has had five teams improve their win total by a minimum of nine games over the last four years.

- Georgia Southern has won 14 games this season after winning just five last year.
- Furman won 22 games last year after posting 13 wins in 2010.
- Wofford went from 16 wins in 2009 to 26 victories in 2010.
- Both College of Charleston and The Citadel made impressive jumps in 2009. The Cougars went from 16 wins in 2008 to 27 the next year. The Citadel had one of the greatest turnarounds in league history, improving from just six wins in 2008 to 20 in 2009.

Divisional Play

The Southern Conference established the North and South divisions in men's basketball prior to the 1994-95 season. Nine of the 12 current members have won at least a share of a division championship over the last 17 seasons. The Citadel, Furman and Samford, which joined the league in 2008, have not won their division.

- Davidson leads the league with 11 division championships while Chattanooga has won eight.

Repeat Performance

The Wofford Terriers won the conference tournament in 2011 after winning the title in 2010. It was the 16th time a team had won at least back-to-back conference tournament championships.

Turning Two

Wofford won the league's men's basketball championship in 2011 after winning a share of the conference football crown the previous fall, becoming just the fifth school in league history to win both championships in the same year.

- Appalachian State was the last team to win both titles as the Mountaineers accomplished the rare feat during the 1999-2000 school year. Davidson won both championships in 1969-70.
- Duke won both titles in the same year three times during the 1940s, while West Virginia won the SoCon football and basketball championships in the same academic year five different times.

Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 959, seven points higher than the national average of 952 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores October 25. Nine of the twelve SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for Division I men's basketball programs.

NBA Draft

College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock was selected in the second round (#46 overall) of the NBA draft by the L.A. Lakers. Goudelock became the 107th Southern Conference player taken in the draft and the first Cougar to be selected after competing in the league.

- Seven of the league's 12 members have had at least one player taken in the NBA draft.

SoCon Sports Network

This summer the conference office announced a partnership with Public Television to carry an eight-game Southern Conference men's basketball package. The agreement provides state-wide distribution of SoCon games throughout Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina. Additional affiliates in Birmingham, Ala., and Chattanooga, Tenn., have also signed on to carry the league package. The distribution platform will reach more than 12 million homes through 34 affiliates.

- Each of the eight games produced for public television will be streamed online live through ESPN3 as well as the respective public television websites.
