




### Clayton

His name is Clayton, and his journey with scoliosis is a story of strength and resilience. Diagnosed at age 3 with a severe "S"-shaped curve, his early treatments were painful and ineffective—until his family found Shriners Children's. "For the first time in years, he said, 'Mommy, it doesn't hurt,'" recalls his mom, Jenny. Now 13, Clayton continues his scoliosis treatment with bracing and follow-up care from his specialized team. Full of energy, laughter, and smiles, Clayton is once again the happy kid who enjoys spreading joy to others.



### Lucy

Her name is Lucy, and her journey with osteogenesis imperfecta (OI) began at just 3 months old. Sometimes called "brittle bone disease," her family posted about her condition on social media. This led a friend to recommend Shriners Children's, prompting the family to visit the hospital's outreach clinic in Beaufort, South Carolina. Since then, Lucy receives regular follow-up care, including X-rays to monitor her bones, vertebrae, and lower back. She works hard to stay strong and safe, and has not suffered any fractures. With each visit, Lucy's smile shines — and so does her trust in the team that cares for her.






