Player of the Week

Wofford senior Brad Loesing has been named the Southern Conference Player of the Week for all games played December 6-12 the league office announced Tuesday (Dec. 13). Loesing averaged 19.0 points and shot 57 percent from the field as Wofford knocked off previously unbeaten Tulane (61-50) and Virginia-Wise (69-66).

The Cincinnati native played all 40 minutes against Tulane and poured in a career-best 24 points on 9-of-13 shooting from the floor. Loesing connected on 4-of-7 three-point attempts and added five assists and two steals against the Green Wave.

Hampered by foul trouble against UVA-Wise, Loesing scored 14 points and added five rebounds, four assists and a steal in 29 minutes of action.

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included Appalachian State's Rodney Milum, Elon's Austin Hamilton, Chattanooga's Omar Wattad, Samford's Tyler Hood and Western Carolina's Harouna Mutombo.

MOUNTAINEERS NORTH DIVISION

Despite narrow deficits on the boards in last week's games, ASU ranks second in the league with 37.9 rebounds per game. Andre Williamson (7.6), Isaac Butts (6.7) and Omar Carter (6.1) rank in the top-10 as individuals.

The Mountaineers concentrate on finals most of the week before traveling to Chapel Hill to take on No. 5 (AP) North Carolina on Saturday. The matchup pits ASU head coach Jason Capel against his alma mater. The last time the programs met was 2000, in the first game played in ASU's Holmes Center. Capel was a starting forward for the Tar Heels in the contest.



COUGARS SOUTH DIVISION

For the fourth consecutive year, CofC has opened Southern Conference play 2-0 with a pair of victories against The Citadel (83-64) on Dec. 1 and preseason North Division favorite Chattanooga in double overtime (87-85) on Dec. 3. The Cougars are one of only 48 NCAA Division I schools with one loss or less on the season with a current 7-1 record. It marks the second-best start in the first eight games of the season in the Bobby Cremins era next to the 2008-09 campaign.

The Cougars rank 30th nationally in three-pointers made (8.4 avg) and have knocked down 10-or-more treys in a single game on three occasions including 12 against UTC on Dec. 3.



PHOENIX NORTH DIVISION

Elon downed Lynchburg 109-67 Sunday afternoon and is now 7-2. It is Elon's best start to a season since 1991-92.

The Phoenix lead the conference in field goal percentage defense. Elon has limited its opponents to just 36.3 percent shooting through nine games. The Phoenix has held opponents to 27.9 percent from beyond the three-point arc.

The Phoenix travel to Dartmouth December 17. Elon will travel to San Diego State December 22.



BULLDOGS SOUTH DIVISION

Barry Smith scored 15 points and grabbed five rebounds as The Citadel fell to Coastal Carolina (80-58) last Tuesday at McAllister Fieldhouse. DeVontae Wright added 10 points for the Bulldogs.

Center Mike Groselle tied Patrick Elmore for the fifth most double-doubles in program history (14) following a 20-point, 19-rebound outing against College of Charleston (Dec. 1).

The Bulldogs are currently 133-100 against teams that comprise the Big South Conference as they Charleston Southern Wednesday.



SPARTANS NORTH DIVISION

The Spartans recorded 13 steals at Florida State Sunday afternoon. UNCG ranks second in the Southern Conference with 8.0 steals per game. Derrell Armstrong is third in the league with 1.7 thefts per contest.

Sophomore guard Drew Parker currently leads the SoCon in 3-point field goal percentage (.615) after shooting just 30 percent last season.

UNCG hosts East Carolina December 16. The Spartans travel to Duke Monday night.



WILDCATS SOUTH DIVISION

The Wildcats have had the lead at halftime in eight of nine games this season

Davidson has won 16 of its last 22 games, dating back to last season.

The Wildcats are shooting 80 percent as a team from the free-throw line, the third-best percentage in the nation.

The Wildcats travel to face Kansas December 19.



BULLDOGS NORTH DIVISION

Samford is currently ranked No. 3 in the nation in 3-point field goals per game. The Bulldogs are averaging 10.6 3-point field goals per contest this season and are shooting 36.5 percent from beyond the arc. Samford's 36.5 shooting percentage from 3-point range is ranked No. 91 nationally.

In Samford's version of the Princeton offense, the Bulldogs typically aim to get a back-door layup or a wide open look at a three-point shot. So far this season, Samford is averaging 10.6 3-point baskets per game. The Bulldogs are also averaging 9.6 layups per contest and are shooting 50 percent from two-point range.



PALADINS SOUTH DIVISION

Charlie Reddick, Richard Brown and Bobby Austin each scored 16 points as Furman topped Jacksonville (85-79) Sunday. The Paladins forced Jacksonville into 21 turnovers.

Furman grabbed 13 offensive rebounds against Jacksonville. The Paladins are second in the league with 14.4 offensive rebounds per game. Furman has pulled down 40 percent of the available offensive rebounds, the highest average in the conference.

The Paladins travel to Western Kentucky on Saturday.



MOCS NORTH DIVISION

Ricky Taylor has scored in double digits in four straight (15.0 ppg). During those contests, he is shooting 45 percent from the field and 50 percent from three-point range while averaging 4.8 rpg. He is 55 points short of 1000 for his career.

Chattanooga's Tuesday opponent Spalding is coached by UTC Hall of Famer Kevin Gray. Gray played from 1973-76 for the Mocs, helping guide the team to an 82-32 mark over his four seasons and a national runner-up finish in 1976. He scored 1,385 points in his career averaging 12.4 points per game.



EAGLES SOUTH DIVISION

Eric Ferguson was 9-of-9 from the floor and finished with a team-high 19 points as GSU lost at Eastern Kentucky (63-59) on Saturday.

Georgia Southern leads the league in field goal percentage as the Eagles have connected on 47 percent of their shots from the floor. GSU also leads the SoCon in three-point field goal percentage (.394).

Georgia Southern travels to South Alabama Monday night. The Eagles are looking to snap a 22-game road losing streak that dates back to the 2009-10 season.



CATAMOUNTS NORTH DIVISION

WCU saw its 10-game home winning streak against nonconference foes come to an end with the two-point, 58-56, home loss to Kent State on Saturday, Dec. 10. The Catamounts led by four with 2:36 to play, but were outscored 7-to-1 over the closing moments to drop their second-straight on the season, and second-consecutive to Kent State.

WCU will not return to the hardwood until Dec. 20 when it visits Bradley in nonconference action in Peoria, Ill. The Catamounts have won two-straight over the Braves, rallying in the second half in both of the last two seasons to score victories.



TERRIERS SOUTH DIVISION

Seniors Brad Loesing and Kevin Giltner are first and second in minutes played this season in the SoCon at 38.5 and 38.1, respectively.

Wofford has given up just 61.6 points per game, the lowest mark in the Southern Conference.

After taking a week off for exams, Wofford will complete a five-game home stand on Sunday, December 18 against Jacksonville. The Terriers will be on the road December 21 at High Point.

Conference News and Notes

Athlete of the Month

The Citadel's Mike Groselle was named the SoCon Athlete of the Month for men's basketball. Groselle recorded five double-doubles in November. The junior center hit at least six field goals in all five games, including a 9-for-12 shooting performance against VMI. He averaged 18.2 points and 11.2 rebounds per game in November.

Familiar Faces

A total of 104 lettermen returned to the Southern Conference in 2011-12. Three of the 12 schools boast at least 10 returnees from last season. League teams average 8.7 returners from 2010-11.

- Conference teams return 33 starters from last year, an average of 2.8 per team. Appalachian State, Davidson, Georgia Southern, UNCG and Chattanooga each return four starters. The Citadel, Furman and Wofford each return just one starter from last year.
- Just two players (Omar Cater - ASU and Omar Wattad - UTC) from the 2011 Coaches All-Conference team return for 2011-12.

Head Coaches

All 12 Southern Conference head coaches return to the bench in 2011-12. The current head coaches have a combined 71 years of experience within the SoCon.

- Five SoCon coaches have won at least 100 games at their current school. Bob McKillop eclipsed the 400-win plateau at Davidson last season while Samford's Jimmy Tillette has topped 200 wins. College of Charleston's Bobby Cremins, UNCG's Mike Dement, Chattanooga's John Shulman and Wofford's Mike Young all have at least 100 wins at their current school.

Making The Leap

The Southern Conference has had four teams improve their win total by a minimum of nine games over the last three years.

- Furman won 22 games last year after posting just 13 wins in 2010.
- Wofford went from 16 wins in 2009 to 26 victories in 2010.
- Both College of Charleston and The Citadel made impressive jumps in 2009. The Cougars went from 16 wins in 2008 to 27 the next year. The Citadel had one of the greatest turnounds in league history, improving from just six wins in 2008 to 20 in 2009.

Repeat Performance

The Wofford Terriers won the conference tournament in 2011 after winning the title in 2010. It was the 16th time a team had won at least back-to-back conference tournament championships.

NBA Draft

College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock was selected in the second round (#46 overall) of the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. Goudelock became the 107th Southern Conference player taken in the draft and the first Cougar to be selected after competing in the league.

- Seven of the league's 12 members have had at least one player taken in the NBA draft.

Southern Conference News and Notes

Turning Two

Wofford won the league's men's basketball championship in 2011 after winning a share of the conference football crown the previous fall, becoming just the fifth school in league history to win both championships in the same year.

- Appalachian State was the last team to win both titles as the Mountaineers accomplished the rare feat during the 1999-2000 school year. Davidson won both championships in 1969-70.
- Duke won both titles in the same year three times during the 1940s, while West Virginia won the SoCon football and basketball championships in the same academic year five different times.

Freshman Honors

UNCG's Trevis Simpson was named to the league's all-freshman team in 2011. It was the third consecutive year that a Spartan was named to the league's all-freshman squad.

- Point guard Kyle Randall was named to the all-freshman team in 2010, while Damian Eargle was selected in 2009.

Divisional Play

The Southern Conference established the North and South divisions in men's basketball prior to the 1994-95 season. Nine of the 12 current members have won at least a share of a division championship over the last 17 seasons. The Citadel, Furman and Samford, which joined the league in 2008, have not won their division.

- Davidson leads the league with 10 division championships while Chattanooga has won eight.

Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 959, seven points higher than the national average of 952 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores October 25. Nine of the twelve SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for Division I men's basketball programs.

Annual Leaders

Furman limited its opponents to just 64.4 points per game last season. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the SoCon in scoring defense.

- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

Western Carolina's Mike Williams led the league in steals last year (2.0 spg) making it four consecutive seasons that a Catamount has led the Southern Conference in steals.

- Brigham Waginger, now an assistant coach at WCU, led the league in steals three consecutive seasons (2008-10).

College of Charleston led the league in scoring with 76.2 points per game. It was the second straight year the Cougars led the conference in offense after posting 75.0 points per game in 2010. The Cougars' 2,173 points last year was the seventh highest single-season total in league history.

- Davidson led the Southern Conference in scoring four straight seasons from 2006-09.

College of Charleston also led the league with 306 made three-pointers last year, the fifth highest single-season total in league history.

- Elon connected on 285 made triples last season, which tied for the ninth-best single season total.
