Quick Hits

- The Southern Conference begins its 92nd season of football this weekend.
- SoCon teams take on four FBS opponents this weekend. League teams have 24 wins over FBS opponents.
- Southern Conference teams went 13-5 against FCS nonconference opponents last season.
- Home teams have gone 19-17 in league games each of the last two seasons.

AWARD CANDIDATES: The Southern Conference has three candidates on the Preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List and four on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Payton Award is presented annually to the most outstanding player at the FCS level, while the Buchanan honors the nation's top defensive player in FCS.

- Payton Award Finalists - Jamal Londry-Jackson (Appalachian State), Jerick McKinnon (Georgia Southern) and Sean Price (Appalachian State).
- Buchanan Award Candidates - Wes Dothard (Chattanooga), Alvin Scioneaux (Wofford), Davis Tull (Chattanooga) and Jaquiski Tartt (Samford).

RANKINGS: Four Southern Conference teams are ranked in at least one of the two major FCS Polls. Wofford is ranked fifth by the FCS Coaches and eighth by the Sports Network. Chattanooga is ranked 24th by the Sports Network and 25th by the coaches.

- Georgia Southern is ranked ninth by the Sports Network with Appalachian State slotted 12th.

DEFENSIVE ROTATION: All nine SoCon teams have led the league in total defense at least once since 2003.

- Wofford led the conference and ranked ninth nationally in total defense in 2012. The Terriers gave up 306 yards per game.

THROUGH THE AIR: The Southern Conference has had at least one wide receiver rank in the top five nationally for receiving yards per game in each of the last seven seasons.

- Elon's Aaron Mellette led the league and finished third nationally with 127 receiving yards per game in 2012.
- Appalachian State's Sean Price ranked sixth nationally with 119 receiving yards per contest.

ON THE GROUND: A Southern Conference team has led the nation in rushing in nine of the last 12 years.

- Georgia Southern led all of FCS with 399 yards per game on the ground in 2012.

MAKING THE GRADE: In addition to achieving success on the gridiron, SoCon teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference football teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 960, ranking sixth nationally and third among FCS conferences. It was the fourth consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- Eight Southern Conference's sports (football, men's basketball, men's cross country women's basketball, women's cross country, women's indoor track & field, women's outdoor track & field and women's tennis) ranked among the top 10 of Division I for their four-year average.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores last October. Five of the nine SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for FCS programs.

CONFERENCE CROWN: Appalachian State, Georgia Southern and Wofford all earned a share of the league championship in 2012 with identical 6-2 records in conference play.

- Georgia Southern won the league with a 7-1 mark in 2011 and has won at least a share of the league championship in each of the last two seasons.
- Appalachian State and Furman have won the most Southern Conference titles as each program has won or shared the league crown on 12 occasions.

CAREER MILESTONES: Appalachian State's Jamal Londry-Jackson is tied for eighth place on the league's all-time list of 300-yard passers. Londry-Jackson has thrown for 300 yards in six games as a Mountaineer.

- Elon's Scott Riddle (2007-10) leads all SoCon QBs with 23 career 300-yard passing performances.
- Samford's Kelsey Pope is poised to crack the league's top-10 list for career pass receptions. Pope enters the 2013 campaign with 182 catches.
- Samford's Fabian Truss ranks 10th on the league's career all-purpose yardage list with 4,435 yards. VMI's Thomas Haskins (1993-96) owns the SoCon record with 7,355 all-purpose yards.

EXPERIENCED COACHES: Wofford head coach Mike Ayers enters the 2013 season as the dean of SoCon coaches. Ayers has tallied 125 wins at East Tennessee State and Wofford while coaching in the Southern Conference. He ranks third on the league's all-time wins list behind Appalachian State's Jerry Moore and Duke's Wallace Wade.
