### Quick Hits

- Southern Conference teams are 19-6 at home in non-conference play this season.
- The Citadel's Mike Groselle leads the league in both scoring (18.5 ppg) and rebounding (12.5 rpg).
- College of Charleston's Antwaine Wiggins is just 63 points away from 1,000 for his career.
- Chattanooga's Keegan Bell leads the league with 5.9 assists per game and has 382 helpers for his career.
- The Southern Conference Tournament will be held in Asheville, N.C., March 2-5 at the newly renovated Asheville Civic Center. The league's tournament was held in Asheville from 1984-1995.

### Player of the Week

Davidson's JP Kuhlman has been named the Southern Conference Player of the Week for all games played November 22-28 the league office announced Tuesday (Nov. 29). The junior guard scored 21 points on the road as Davidson topped UNC Wilmington (70-67) last week.

With the Wildcats holding a one-point lead late in the game, Kuhlman grabbed a defensive rebound and was fouled before hitting two free throws with 1.2 seconds remaining to push Davidson ahead, 70-67. The Ponte Vedra, Fla., native connected on 6-of-11 shots from the floor, including 3-of-6 from three-point range. He made six of seven

free throw attempts, grabbed seven rebounds and dished out two assists in 33 minutes against the Seahawks.

Kuhlman is tied for seven in the Southern Conference in scoring with 14.2 points per game.

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included Appalachian State's Isaac Butts, College of Charleston's Andrew Lawrence, The Citadel's Mike Groselle, Chattanooga's Keegan Bell, Samford's Drew Windler, Western Carolina's Brandon Boggs and Wofford's Kevin Giltner.





**MOUNTAINEERS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Senior Omar Carter scored a season-high 24 points and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds as Appalachian State picked up its first conference win of the season with a 78-64 win over UNCG Thursday night. The Mountaineers have now won five of the last six meetings with UNCG.

Senior Andre Williamson recorded four blocked shots Thursday and leads all active SoCon players with 130 career blocks.

The Mountaineers travel to Georgia Southern Saturday night. It will be the only meeting between the two teams this season.



**COUGARS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Sophomore forward Trent Wiedeman tallied a double-double with a game-high 22 points and a team-high 10 rebounds as College of Charleston knocked off The Citadel 83-64 Thursday. Senior Antwaine Wiggins scored 20 points for CofC while Anthony Stitt chipped in with 10 points off the bench.

Junior point guard Andrew Lawrence leads the league in assist-to-turn-over ratio (3.1).

CofC plays host to Chattanooga Saturday afternoon. The Cougars host Tennessee December 14.



**PHOENIX** **NORTH DIVISION**

Elon got 20 points from Drew Spradlin and held Furman to 39 percent shooting from the floor as the Phoenix earned a 77-70 win over the Paladins Wednesday night.

Elon ranks second in the SoCon with 8.2 made triples per game. Sophomore Sebastian Koch ranks fifth in the league with 2.3 made three-pointers per game.

Elon hosts Navy in non-conference play Saturday. The Phoenix travel across town to face UNCG Monday night.



**BULLDOGS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Junior center Mike Groselle improved his consecutive double-double streak to seven games following a 20-point, 19-rebound outing against College of Charleston. Groselle, who established the program record for most consecutive double-doubles (five) against Florida Christian on Nov. 26, has now moved past Kent Hill for the sixth most double-doubles in Citadel basketball history.

The Citadel has the highest scoring offense in the league (77.7ppg).

The Bulldogs travel to Wofford Saturday night. The Citadel then hosts Coastal Carolina on Tuesday.



**SPARTANS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Aaron Bracket, Trevis Simpson and Derrell Armstrong all scored in double figures for the Spartans, but it wasn't enough as UNCG lost at Appalachian State (78-64) Thursday. UNCG shot just 31 percent from the field.

The Spartans are averaging 16.9 offensive rebounds per game, the highest mark in the league. UNCG has grabbed over 40 percent of the available offensive rebounds which is tops in the SoCon.

UNCG will visit Western Carolina Saturday afternoon. The Spartans welcome Elon to the Greensboro Coliseum Monday night.



**WILDCATS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Jake Cohen scored a season-high 26 points and De'Mon Brooks added 23 as Davidson held off Wofford 72-69 Thursday at the Benjamin Johnson Arena.

The Wildcats lead the SoCon in rebounding margin (+6.5 rpg).

Davidson returns home to play host to Furman Saturday evening. The Wildcats host Vanderbilt Wednesday.

The Wildcats have won 29 of their last 31 non-conference games at Belk Arena.



**BULLDOGS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Drew Windler scored 20 points and Devin McNeil added 19 as Samford fell to Western Carolina (75-71) Thursday at the Pete Hanna Center.

The Bulldogs knocked down a season-high 15 3-point baskets in Saturday's 71-69 victory at UT Arlington. Samford's 15 3-point field goals was its highest total from beyond the arc since a similar total of 15 was achieved against Chattanooga in the final game of the 2010-11 regular season.

Samford hosts UT San Antonio Monday night.



**PALADINS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Charlie Reddick came off the bench and scored a game-high 22 points as Furman fell at Elon (77-70) Wednesday night. Reddick knocked down six of 10 three-point attempts. Brandon Sebirumbi added 11 points for the Paladins.

Furman limited its opponents to just 60.0 points per game, the lowest mark in the SoCon. The Paladins have also limited their opponents to just 40 percent shooting from the field.

Furman travels to face Davidson Saturday night. The Paladins host Virginia Wise Tuesday night.



**MOCS** **NORTH DIVISION**

The Mocs had three players score in double figures and shot 50-percent from the field but fell to Georgia Southern Thursday night in Statesboro. Ricky Taylor led UTC with 16 points while Omar Wattad and Drazen Zlovaric each added 11 for the Mocs.

Chattanooga leads the SoCon with 8.9 steals per game. Dontay Hampton has averaged 1.7 thefts per game for UTC.

The Mocs visit College of Charleston Saturday afternoon. Chattanooga will then have a week off before visiting Mercer December 10.



**EAGLES** **SOUTH DIVISION**

The Eagles placed five players in double figures as Georgia Southern topped Chattanooga (84-70) Thursday night. Jelani Hewitt and Ben Drayton each scored 20 points for the Eagles, who shot 52 percent from the field. Georgia Southern also added 10 steals in the win.

Georgia Southern is one of six SoCon teams with a positive rebounding margin. The Eagles rank second in the conference in defensive rebounds with 32.2 per game.

The Eagles welcome Appalachian State to Statesboro on Saturday.



**CATAMOUNTS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Western Carolina concluded a six-game road swing with a 75-71 win at Samford Thursday night. Sophomore Trey Sumler recorded a double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds. Senior Harouna Mutombo scored 18 points.

Sumler leads the conference in free throw percentage (.933).

The Catamounts return home for their first game in the Ramsey Center since Nov. 15 (18 total days) as they welcome UNCG to Cullowhee Saturday afternoon in league play.



**TERRIERS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Wofford opened a five-game homestand with a 72-69 loss to Davidson Thursday night. The Terriers utilized a balanced offensive attack as Drew Crowell led Wofford with 17 points. Karl Cochran and Kevin Giltner each added 15 points for the Terriers.

The Terriers have limited their opponents to just 62.4 points per game and 39.8 percent shooting from the floor.

Wofford hosts The Citadel Saturday and will entertain Tulane Tuesday night.

## Conference News and Notes

### Familiar Faces

A total of 104 lettermen returned to the Southern Conference in 2011-12. Three of the 12 schools boast at least 10 returnees from last season. League teams average 8.7 returners from 2010-11.

- Conference teams return 33 starters from last year, an average of 2.8 per team. Appalachian State, Davidson, Georgia Southern, UNCG and Chattanooga each return four starters. The Citadel, Furman and Wofford each return just one starter from last year.
- Just two players (Omar Cater - ASU and Omar Wattad - UTC) from the 2011 Coaches All-Conference team return for 2011-12.

### Head Coaches

All 12 Southern Conference head coaches return to the bench in 2011-12. The current head coaches have a combined 71 years of experience within the SoCon.

- Five SoCon coaches have won at least 100 games at their current school. Bob McKillop eclipsed the 400-win plateau at Davidson last season while Samford's Jimmy Tillette has topped 200 wins. College of Charleston's Bobby Cremins, UNCG's Mike Dement, Chattanooga's John Shulman and Wofford's Mike Young all have at least 100 wins at their current school.

### Non-Conference Scheduling

Six of the 12 SoCon teams are scheduled to participate in an exempt tournament this year. SoCon teams will take part in the All-Military Classic (The Citadel), Battle for Atlantis (College of Charleston), Chicago Invitational (Wofford), Hoosier Classic (Chattanooga), Maui Invitational (UNCG) and South Padre Island Invitational (Western Carolina).

### Making The Leap

The Southern Conference has had four teams improve their win total by a minimum of nine games over the last three years.

- Furman won 22 games last year after posting just 13 wins in 2010.
- Wofford went from 16 wins in 2009 to 26 victories in 2010.
- Both College of Charleston and The Citadel made impressive jumps in 2009. The Cougars went from 16 wins in 2008 to 27 the next year. The Citadel had one of the greatest turnounds in league history, improving from just six wins in 2008 to 20 in 2009.

### Repeat Performance

The Wofford Terriers won the conference tournament in 2011 after winning the title in 2010. It was the 16th time a team had won at least back-to-back conference tournament championships.

### NBA Draft

College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock was selected in the second round (#46 overall) of the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. Goudelock became the 107th Southern Conference player taken in the draft and the first Cougar to be selected after competing in the league.

- Seven of the league's 12 members have had at least one player taken in the NBA draft.

## Southern Conference News and Notes

### Turning Two

Wofford won the league's men's basketball championship in 2011 after winning a share of the conference football crown the previous fall, becoming just the fifth school in league history to win both championships in the same year.

- Appalachian State was the last team to win both titles as the Mountaineers accomplished the rare feat during the 1999-2000 school year. Davidson won both championships in 1969-70.
- Duke won both titles in the same year three times during the 1940s, while West Virginia won the SoCon football and basketball championships in the same academic year five different times.

### Freshman Honors

UNCG's Trevis Simpson was named to the league's all-freshman team in 2011. It was the third consecutive year that a Spartan was named to the league's all-freshman squad.

- Point guard Kyle Randall was named to the all-freshman team in 2010, while Damian Eargle was selected in 2009.

### Divisional Play

The Southern Conference established the North and South divisions in men's basketball prior to the 1994-95 season. Nine of the 12 current members have won at least a share of a division championship over the last 17 seasons. The Citadel, Furman and Samford, which joined the league in 2008, have not won their division.

- Davidson leads the league with 10 division championships while Chattanooga has won eight.

### Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 959, seven points higher than the national average of 952 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores October 25. Nine of the twelve SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for Division I men's basketball programs.

### Annual Leaders

Furman limited its opponents to just 64.4 points per game last season. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the SoCon in scoring defense.

- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

Western Carolina's Mike Williams led the league in steals last year (2.0 spg) making it four consecutive seasons that a Catamount has led the Southern Conference in steals.

- Brigham Waginger, now an assistant coach at WCU, led the league in steals three consecutive seasons (2008-10).

College of Charleston led the league in scoring with 76.2 points per game. It was the second straight year the Cougars led the conference in offense after posting 75.0 points per game in 2010. The Cougars' 2,173 points last year was the seventh highest single-season total in league history.

- Davidson led the Southern Conference in scoring four straight seasons from 2006-09.

College of Charleston also led the league with 306 made three-pointers last year, the fifth highest single-season total in league history.

- Elon connected on 285 made triples last season, which tied for the ninth-best single season total.

## SoCon Championship

The 2012 Southern Conference Men's Basketball Championship will be held March 2-5 in Asheville, N.C., at the newly renovated U.S. Cellular Arena. The 2012 tournament will mark a return to Asheville, site of the men's basketball tournament from 1984-95.

The oldest conference tournament in the nation, the first tournament was held in 1921 and 2012 will mark the 92nd year of the postseason classic.
