NOTES

- For the third consecutive season, the Belmont University men's soccer team played in the Southern Conference Championship semifinals on Friday, Nov. 5. The fourth-seeded Bruins defeated fifth-seeded East Tennessee State University 1-0 Friday evening at UNCG Soccer Stadium in Greensboro, North Carolina.

- Romig entered the match ranking fifth in the nation in save percentage, 12th in shutouts, 21st in goals against average and 27th in saves. He now has a save percentage of .843, while extending the school's individual single-season shutout record with his eighth clean sheet of the year.

- The shutout was the Bruins' program record ninth of the fall.

- Alfredo Diaz-Santillan had a goal and two assists on Friday evening to lead the No. 3 seed Furman men's soccer team to a 3-1 victory over the No. 6 seed Wofford Terriers in the quarterfinals of the SoCon Men's Soccer Championship from Mercer's Betts Stadium.

- Nic Parker scored the lone goal for the Terriers and goalkeeper Joshua Old finished with five saves. Wofford's season ends at 5-11-1 overall.

- No. 2 seed Mercer clinched a 4-0 shutout victory over No. 3 seed Furman at the Bears' Betts Stadium on Sunday afternoon after Mercer forward and first-team all-conference selection Dylan Gaither netted three goals and Bears defender Logan Longo added one to advance Mercer to the Southern Conference Men's Soccer Championship.

- Mercer outshot Furman 19-6. Bears goalkeeper Trevor McMullen recorded four saves in the shutout, his fourth of the season and second against the Paladins, while Furman goalkeeper Ben Roberts saved five shots in the loss.

- For the second straight year, the Belmont Bruins knocked off the No. 1 seed and will play in the SoCon men's soccer championship following a 2-1 victory over top-seeded and 25th-ranked UNCG on Sunday evening at the UNCG Soccer Stadium in Greensboro, N.C.

- Belmont received a vote in the United Soccer Coaches Top 25 Poll for the first time in program history following their win over the Spartans. The Bruins are also ranked No. 9 in the United Soccer Coaches South Region, marking just the second time Belmont has been ranked regionally.

- The Bruins are 13-2-1 over its last 16 outings and has scored 21 goals in its last nine matches. The 13 wins over the year represent the most ever in a single season in Bruin history.

- Belmont and Mercer will play for the 2021 SoCon Men's Soccer Championship on Sunday afternoon in Macon, Georgia. Kickoff from Betts Stadium is slated for 1 p.m. CT/2 p.m. ET.

2021 SoCON MEN'S SOCCER SEMIFINALS RECAPS

No. 2 seed Mercer and No. 4 seed Belmont each won semifinal matches at the Southern Conference Men's Soccer Championship on Sunday and will face off in the championship final on Sunday, Nov. 14 at 2 p.m. ET at Mercer's Betts Stadium in Macon, Georgia.

In the regular-season matchup, Mercer defeated Belmont, 3-2, on Oct. 23 in Macon, Georgia.

The match will be the first championship between the Bears and Bruins, with Belmont making its second consecutive appearance and Mercer making its first appearance since 2019.

No. 4 Belmont 2, No. 1 UNCG 1

GREENSBORO, N.C. – For the second straight year, the Belmont Bruins knocked off the No. 1 seed and will play in the SoCon men's soccer championship following a 2-1 victory over top-seeded and 25th-ranked UNCG on Sunday evening at the UNCG Soccer Stadium in Greensboro, N.C.

The Bruins earned their 13th win of the season and advance to the championship matchup against Mercer after Belmont forward Liam O'Brien and defender Jack Shaw, who were both second-team all-conference selections, scored a pair of second-half headers against the Spartans to clinch the victory.

O'Brien connected with the net on a diving header in the 59th minute to hand the Bruins a 1-0 lead before Shaw added his own goal to give Belmont a 2-0 advantage over the Spartans in the 79th minute. O'Brien's goal was assisted by Shaw, while Shaw's goal was assisted by O'Brien and first-team all-conference selection Niccoli Dagnoni.

UNCG's Fernando Garcia attempted a comeback for the Spartans, as he netted a goal in the 86th minute to bring the score to 2-1, but the Bruins' defense kept UNCG scoreless the rest of the match to complete the season sweep of the Spartans.

The goal for O'Brien marked his ninth goal of the season, while Shaw's goal was his first of the season.

In total, UNCG finished with 22 shots, while Belmont totaled five. Drew Romig, the Bruins' goalkeeper and two-time defending SoCon Defensive Player of the Month, finished with five saves.

With the win, Belmont improves to 13-4-1, while UNCG fell to 13-4-1.

No. 2 Mercer 4, No. 3 Furman 0

MACON, Ga. – No. 2 seed Mercer clinched a 4-0 shutout victory over No. 3 seed Furman at the Bears' Betts Stadium on Sunday afternoon after Mercer forward and first-team all-conference selection Dylan Gaither netted three goals and Bears defender Logan Longo added one to advance Mercer to the Southern Conference Men's Soccer Championship.

Gaither handed the Bears an early 1-0 advantage after scoring a goal in the 6th minute before giving Mercer a 2-0 lead with a penalty kick goal in the 51st minute. The Lilburn, Georgia, native extended the Bears lead to 3-0 after connecting with Kadeem Agard on a go-ahead pass in the 59th minute to net his third goal of the game and 11th goal of the season. Mercer secured the 4-0 win with a final goal in the 87th minute by Longo, which was assisted by Natnael McDonald and Trevor Martineau.

Mercer outshot Furman 19-6. Bears goalkeeper Trevor McMullen recorded four saves in the shutout, his fourth of the season and second against the Paladins, while Furman goalkeeper Ben Roberts saved five shots in the loss.

The appearance in the championship is Mercer's first since 2019 when they defeated top-seeded UNCG 1-0 to clinch their third SoCon Championship title after winning the tournament in 2016 and 2017.

Mercer, who was selected third and tied with Belmont in the preseason pick to win the league in voting by the seven headcoaches, improves to 9-7-1 with the win. The Paladins season concludes at

7-9-1.

SOCON ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – UNCG claimed four individual awards following the 2021 Southern Conference men's soccer campaign, with sophomore forward Theo Collomb named this year's Player of the Year, Niclas Wild tabbed Goalkeeper of the Year, and freshman midfielder JC Ngando receiving Freshman of the Year honors. UNCG's Chris Rich and Belmont's David Costa shared the SoCon Coach of the Year honor due to a tie in the voting.

The league's seven coaches also named two all-conference teams and an all-freshman squad. This season's all-conference first team, all-conference second team, and all-freshman team each includes 11 student-athletes. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own players or themselves.

UNCG tallied a conference-leading 15 total players who earned postseason recognition, including a conference-best six players on the all-conference first team. Belmont featured six total selections, while Wofford had five. Mercer, ETSU, and Furman each had three student-athletes represented.

Collomb, a first-team all-conference selection, helped lead UNCG to a 5-1-0 conference record as the Spartans finished the regular season as the No. 1 seed in the SoCon Championship. The Clermont, France, native leads the nation with 15 goals and 35 points and is ranked second nationally in goals per game (0.94) and points per game (2.19). Collomb was named the SoCon Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 28 and also earned the league's offensive player of the month honor for September. Following his impressive performance in UNCG's 3-1 win over No. 2 Clemson on Sept. 21 and the Spartans' 7-0 win over VMI on Sept. 25, Collomb earned the United Soccer Coaches National Player of the Week, College Soccer News National Player of the Week, and TopDrawer Soccer National Player of the Week.

Wild claims the Goalkeeper of the Year honors, ranking the lowest in the conference in goals against average (0.73), and ranking third in save percentage (0.75). He ranked first in shutouts, with the sophomore goalkeeper tallying nine following UNCG's 2-0 conference win over ETSU on Oct. 30. The Hohenstein-Ernstthal, Sachsen, Germany, native ranked third in saves, with 36, and has only allowed 12 goals on the season. Wild was named the SoCon Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 26, following his performance against Wofford on Oct. 23 where he earned his eighth clean sheet of the season. The sophomore goalkeeper also added a first-team all-conference selection to his Goalkeeper of the Year honors.

Ngando, who is also an all-freshman and All-SoCon first-team selection, recorded 18 points on five goals and eight assists with two game-winning goals. He earned offensive player of the week honors on Oct. 26 after tallying one assist in the Spartans' 7-1 nonconference win over USC Upstate on Oct. 19 before recording three in UNCG's 3-0 win over the Terriers on Oct. 23. The freshman from Paris, France, is the first Spartan to earn freshman of the year honors since Nelson Oceano in 2017.

UNCG's Rich clinched a share of the league's coach of the year award for the first time after the Spartans earned their 10th SoCon regular-season title. Rich led UNCG to a 13-3-1 overall record, 5-1-0 conference record, and helped the Spartans earn three appearances on the top-25 national weekly rankings. UNCG's 13 victories marks the most wins in a single season since the 2006 squad won 16 matches. Belmont's Costa also claimed his first coach of the year honor, as the third-year head coach led the Bruins to a 11-4-1 overall record and a 4-2-0 conference record.

Spartan defenders Emmanuel Hagan, Marco Milanese, and Joey Skinner join Collomb, Wild, and Ngando to represent UNCG on the all-conference first team. Skinner led the defenders in goals (four), points (15), assists (seven) and game-winning goals (two), while Hagan earned SoCon Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 28 followed by Milanese, who secured SoCon Defensive Player of the Week honors the following week on Oct. 5.

Midfielder Jack Birch and Daniel Mangarov helped spark the Spartans' offense this season, as the freshman and sophomore both earned spots on second team following the conclusion of the regular season. Birch recorded one goal and tallied one assist, while Mangarov netted four goals, added three assists, and scored two game-winning goals. Basile Marc was the final Spartan player to earn team honors, with the Villeurbanne, France, native clinching a spot on the all-freshman team after concluding the 2021 regular season with one goal and two assists.

Belmont had one player earn a spot on first team, and five receive spots on the second team. Niccolo Dagnoni was the solo Bruin to earn a spot on first team, as the freshman midfielder tallied five goals and eight assists for 18 points this season. The native of Milan, Italy, also clinched SoCon Offensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 7 following an assist in Belmont's 1-0 nonconference win over UNC Asheville on Sept. 2 and an assist in the Bruins' 1-0 nonconference win over SIUE on Sept. 6. The five players selected to the all-conference second team were AJ Chastonay (forward), Liam O'Brien (forward), John Bannec (defender), Jack Shaw (defender) and Case Cox (defender).

Chastonay scored 12 points on six goals, including six game-winners this season, while O'Brien recorded 18 points on eight goals, including two-game winners. Defenders Shaw and Cox recorded the most assists of the SoCon defenders, with the senior and sophomore defenders both tallying five. Cox also added 11 points on three goals for the 2021 season. For the second straight season, the Belmont University men's soccer team will begin postseason play as the No. 4 seed in the Southern Conference Men's Soccer tournament.

Wofford had five selections this season, with defender Mitchell Myers securing a place on the first team, forward Brandon Oddy earning a spot on the second team, and Magnus Kjoller (midfielder), Amin Mohammadi (defender), Nic Parker (midfielder), and Chistoffer Saitz (defender) all clinching spots on the all-freshman team. Myers added 11 points on two goals and seven assists and Oddy notched 16 points on eight goals for the Terriers this season.

Ousman Jabang was the lone first-team selection for Mercer after recording 14 points on four goals and six assists, as well as one game-winning goal. Midfielder Dylan Gaither and forward Kadeem Agard represent the Bears on the second team and all-freshman team, respectively. Gaither led the midfielders with 19 points and notched eight goals and three assists this season, while Agard tallied 13 points on five goals and three assists, including a game winner in the Bears' first conference win of season on Sept. 18 against Furman.

Furman had three selections this season, with forward Jake Raine securing a place on the first team, midfielder Miles Fenton earning a spot on second-team, and Ivan Agyaakway clinching a spot on all-freshman team. Raine added 25 points on 11 goals and three assists, while Fenton added six points on one goal and four assists for the Paladins this season.

ETSU forward Tarik Pannholzer and Buccaneer goalkeeper Josh Perryman were both selected to SoCon teams this season, with Pannholzer being named first-team all-conference and Perryman earning second-team honors. Pannholzer, a sophomore from Flensburg, Germany, is third in the SoCon in points scored, with 22, after netting 10 goals and two assists, including two game-winners. Perryman ranks third in the SoCon in saves (50) and fourth in save percentage (.676). Rayhan Carlson-Du Toit rounded out the Buccaneers selected to all-conference teams, with the freshman earning a spot on the all-freshman team after concluding the season with six points on two goals and two assists, including one game-winner.

No. 3 seed Furman will play No. 6 seed Wofford in the SoCon Men's Soccer Championship quarterfinals on Friday, Nov. 5, at 7 p.m. in Macon, Georgia, while No. 4 seed Belmont and No. 5 seed ETSU play the same day at 6 p.m. in Greensboro, North Carolina. No. 1 seed UNCG will play the winner of No. 4 Seed Belmont and No. 5 seed ETSU and No. 2 seed Mercer will play the winner of No. 3 seed Furman and No. 6 seed Wofford. The semifinal matches will take place on Sunday, Nov. 7, with UNCG scheduled to host at 6 p.m. and the match at Mercer scheduled at 2 p.m.

The championship match will take place on Sunday, Nov. 14, at Mercer University. The tournament winner earns the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship.

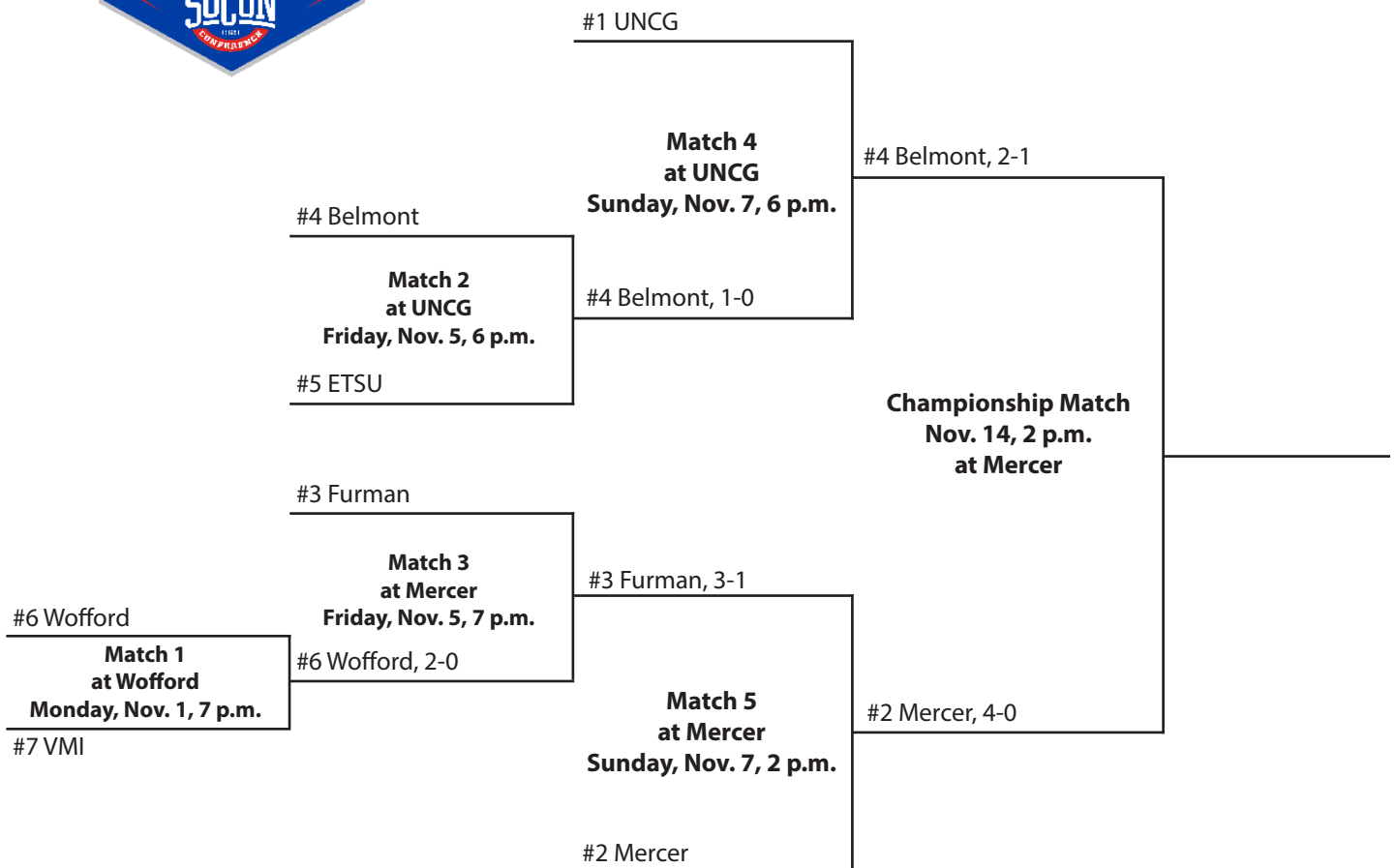
