- Georgia Southern was tabbed the pre-season favorite in the Southern Conference by both the league's head coaches and media.

- Appalachian State, Georgia Southern and Wofford all advanced to the FCS playoffs in 2011. It was the eighth consecutive season the SoCon sent multiple teams to the playoffs. The Southern Conference leads all FCS leagues with 96 playoff victories.
- When Furman and Samford face off Saturday night, it will be the second consecutive season that the Bulldogs open the year with a conference game.

Quick Hits

- The Southern Conference begins its 91st season of football this weekend.
- Furman and Samford face off Saturday in the league's only conference game this weekend.
- SoCon teams take on three FBS opponents this weekend. League teams have 24 wins over FBS opponents.
- Visiting teams won 17 of 34 league games in 2011.
- Southern Conference teams were 13-5 against FCS nonconference opponents last season.

AWARD CANDIDATES: The Southern Conference has two candidates on the Walter Payton Award Watch List and four on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The Payton Award is presented annually to the most outstanding player at the FCS level, while the Buchanan honors the nation's top defensive player in FCS.

- Payton Award Candidates - Eric Breitenstein (Wofford) and Aaron Mellette (Elon).
- Buchanan Award Candidates - Wes Dothard (Chattanooga), Jeremy Kimbrough (Appalachian State), Demetrius McCray (Appalachian State) and Brent Russell (Georgia Southern).

RANKINGS: The Southern Conference placed three teams in both major FCS Preseason Polls. Georgia Southern is ranked third in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Poll. Appalachian State is fifth according to the coaches and sixth in the Sports Network poll, while Wofford ranks 13th and 10th, respectively.

- Chattanooga was among the teams receiving votes in both polls.

Offensive Player of the Year

Eric Breitenstein, Sr., RB



The league's Offensive Player of the Year in 2011, Breitenstein led the SoCon and ranked fifth in FCS with

122.8 rushing yards per game last year. He ran for at least 100 yards in 10 games last season and enters 2012 needing just 368 yards to break into the top 10 of the league's all-time rushing list. He was named to the Walter Payton Award Pre-season Watch List.

Defensive Player of the Year

Brent Russell, Sr., DL



Russell was tabbed the league's top defender as a junior in 2011. He finished the year with 67 tackles, including

16 for loss. He finished the year with 6.5 sacks and earned First Team All-America honors from the Associated Press and The Sports Network. Russell was named to the 2012 Buck Buchanan Preseason Watch List.

THROUGH THE AIR: Elon's Aaron Mellette led the FCS with 149.0 receiving yards per game.

- The Southern Conference has had at least one wide receiver rank in the top five nationally for receiving yards per game in each of the last six seasons.

ON THE GROUND: Wofford had the nation's best rushing attack in 2011 with 365 yards per game.

- A Southern Conference team has led the nation in rushing in eight of the last 11 years.

DEFENSIVE ROTATION: Chattanooga owned the top defensive unit in the conference as the Mocs ranked 13th in the nation for total defense. Chattanooga gave up 305 yards per game this season.

ALL NINE HAVE POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: All nine of the current football-playing institutions in the Southern Conference have now reached the postseason at least once. The SoCon is the only conference to have 100 percent playoff participation among its current members.

MAKING THE GRADE: In addition to achieving success on the gridiron, SoCon teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference football teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 958, ranking sixth nationally and third among FCS conferences. It was the fourth consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- Ten Southern Conference's sports (football, men's basketball, men's indoor track & field, men's outdoor track & field, women's basketball, women's cross country, women's indoor track & field, women's outdoor track & field, women's tennis and volleyball) ranked among the top 10 of Division I for their four-year average.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores last October. Seven of the nine SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average (66 percent) for FCS programs.

CAUGHT IN THE DRAFT: The Southern Conference had three players taken in the 2012 NFL Draft in April. The SoCon's three draft picks tied for the highest amount among FCS conferences.

- Appalachian State's Brian Quick (WR) was chosen with the first pick of the second round (#33) by the St. Louis Rams, making him the highest selection in ASU history.
- Samford's Corey White (DB) was taken by the New Orleans Saints in the fifth round (#162).
- B.J. Coleman (QB) of Chattanooga was selected in the seventh round (#243) by the Green Bay Packers.
