The Chattanooga Mocs have been tabbed the preseason favorite to win the Southern Conference men's basketball title in 2015-16, according to a vote by the league's head coaches.

First-year head coach Matt McCall inherits a team that finished 22-10 (15-3 SoCon) last season and returns nine letterwinners, including four starters. The Mocs earned seven first-place votes and led the preseason balloting with 78 points.

Wofford was chosen second (74) and received two first-place votes. Head coach Mike Young guided the Terriers to a 28-7 mark last year.

Wofford won the Southern Conference tournament for the second consecutive year after finishing league play with a 16-2 record.

Mercer was tabbed third (59) and earned the final first-place vote. ETSU, under the direction of Steve Forbes, was picked fourth (55), just four points ahead of Furman (51).

UNCG was slotted sixth with 42 points, while Samford was picked seventh (34). Western Carolina (27), The Citadel (16) and VMI (14) rounded out the poll.

Conference News and Notes

Familiar Faces

Southern Conference teams return 85 lettermen for the 2014-15 season. Eight of 10 schools boast at least eight returnees from last season. League teams averaged 8.5 returners from 2014-15.

- Conference teams return 31 starters from last year, an average of 3.1 per team. Furman returns all five starters from last season, while Chattanoog and VMI bring back four
- Three of the 10 members from the 2015 Coaches All-Conference team return for 2015-16.

Nonconference Scheduling

Seven of the 10 SoCon teams are scheduled to participate in an exempt tournament this year. SoCon teams will take part in the Battle 4 Atlantis (Furman), Challenge in Music City (Mercer), Emerald Coast Classic (Chattanooga), Gotham Classic (Western Carolina), Greensboro Coliseum (UNCG), Mean Green Showcase (Samford), and USC Upstate Classic (The Citadel).

Head Coaches

Six of the 10 Southern Conference head coaches return to the bench in the league for 2015-16. The current head coaches have a combined 32 years of experience in the SoCon. Three coaches joined the league this season with the Steve Forbes (ETSU), Matt McCall (Chattanooga) and Dan Earl (VMI). Duggar Baucom moved from VMI to The Citadel during the offseason.

- Wofford head coach Mike Young ranks 8th on the league's all-time wins list. Young has tallied 217 wins with the Terriers and needs just seven victories to move past Lyles Alley into seventh place. Young was named the 2015 Coach of the Year by both the league's media and head coaches.
- Western Carolina's Larry Hunter has 154 victories at WCU and ranks 15th on the league's all-time wins list.

One-Possession Games

Southern Conference teams played 90 league games during the 2014-15 regular season. Twenty-three games (26 percent) were decided by one possession or went into overtime.

- In 2014 the league had 17 of 88 (19 percent) conference games decided by one possession.
- In 2013 the league had 30 of 108 (28 percent) conference games decided by one possession.
- In 2012 the league had 32 of 108 (30 percent) conference games decided by one possession.

Sudden Impact

Furman's Devin Sibley was named the league's Freshman of the Year by the league's coaches in 2015. Sebley became the first Paladin to earn the award since Quan Prowell in 2004.

Defensive Presence

Chattanooga's Justin Tuoyo was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year last season. As a junior Tuoyo recorded 104 blocked shots, the second-highest single-season total in league history. It was the second consecutive year a Moc earned the award after Z. Mason took home the same honor in 2014.

Southern Conference News and Notes

Annual Leaders

Wofford limited its opponents to just 59.7 points per game last season. It was the fourth straight year the Terriers led the Southern Conference in scoring defense.

• The Terriers also led the league in field goal percentage (.454), marking the first time in league history Wofford had the highest percentage of made field goals.

The Citadel led the league in 3-point shooting, connecting on 40 percent of its attempts from beyond the arc. It was the first time since 1989 that The Citadel led the SoCon in 3-point percentage. The Bulldogs also led the conference in free throw percentage (.767).

Furman's Kris Acox led the league in rebounding with 7.5 boards per contest. Acox became the first Paladin to lead the league in rebounding since Daniel Quigley in 1999 (8.9 rpg).

Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in June, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 955. It was the seventh consecutive year that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate.

Preseason Honors

Chattanooga was picked to win the 2015-16 Southern Conference championship in preseason balloting conducted by the league's head coaches. The Mocs return four starters and nine lettermen from last season's team that went 22-10.

- Wofford was picked second and earned two first-place votes while Mercer was tabbed third and earned the final first-place vote.
- Chattanooga's Casey Jones was named the league's preseason Player of the Year and was joined on the preseason all-conference team by teammate Justin Tuoyo. Eight of the league's ten teams had at least one player on the preseason all-conference team.

Close Encounters

Southern Conference teams were 7-6 in 2015 in nonconference games that were decided by one possession or went into overtime.

• League teams went 6-13 in nonconference games that were decided by one possession or went into overtime during the 2013-14 season.

Conference Tournament

The 2016 Southern Conference Tournament presented by General Shale will be held March 4-7 in Asheville, N.C., at the U.S. Cellular Center. This year's tournament final will be Monday, March 9 at 9:00 p.m. The oldest conference tournament in the nation, the first tournament was held in 1921 and 2016 marks the 96th year of the postseason classic.

Tournament Triple

The Wofford Terriers have won each of the last two Southern Conference tournaments. The last school to win the league tournament three straight years was Davidson (2006-08). Seven different schools have won the tournament three straight years.
