Quick Hits

- Larry Hunter has 99 wins as head coach at Western Carolina. With one more victory, he will become the sixth SoCon coach to have at least 100 victories at his current school.
- Georgia Southern won just one league game last season but already has seven victories through 11 conference games this year.
- After dropping 11 straight games, UNCG has won six in a row and leads the North Division.
- The Southern Conference Tournament will be held in Asheville, N.C., March 2-5 at the newly renovated U.S. Cellular Center. The league's tournament was held in Asheville from 1984-1995.

Player of the Week

Derrell Armstrong has been named the Southern Conference Player of the Week for the second consecutive week. The junior averaged 25 points, seven rebounds and three assists in two games last week as the Spartans picked up overtime wins over Appalachian State (77-73) and Western Carolina (89-86).

Armstrong scored 50 points in two games off the bench for the Spartans last week. He tallied a game-high 27 points in UNCG's win over Appalachian State on Thursday night. Armstrong scored 19 points in the second half and overtime against the Mountaineers and was 10-of-20 from the field.

The Mechanicsville, Md., native posted 21 of his 23 points in the second half and overtime against the Catamounts on Saturday. The junior scored 12 of UNCG's 20 points in the extra frame. Armstrong added six rebounds, four assists, three steals and a blocked shot against WCU.

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included Appalachian State's Omar Carter, College of Charleston's Antwaine Wiggins, The Citadel's Mike Groselle, Furman's Brandon Sebirumbi, Georgia Southern's Jelani Hewitt, Chattanooga's Drazen Zlovaric, Samford's Drew Windler, and Wofford's Brad Loesing.

MOUNTAINEERS

ASU improved to 7-2 at home on the season following the team's 81-66 win over Elon on Saturday. Now in its 12th season, the Holmes Center has become one of the best home-court advantages in the league, as ASU is 30-9 at the arena since the start of the 2009-10 season. The Apps are 17-6 in league play over that span.

Omar Carter and Jamaal Trice have found a scoring rhythm over the last three games. In the last three games, the pair has combined for 37.0 points per game in a pair of ASU wins. The pair has also knocked down 82.7 percent of their free throws with a 50 percent shooting mark from the field.



PHOENIX

Sophomore Jack Isenbarger scored a team-high 20 points as Elon fell at Appalachian State Saturday afternoon. Isenbarger has averaged 20.0 points per game in each of his last four outings, almost double his season average of 11.4 points per contest.

Elon is second in the SoCon in field goal percentage defense (.411) and ranks fourth in defending the three-point line as opponents are shooting just 32 percent from beyond the arc.

Elon will host College of Charleston Thursday night. The Phoenix welcome The Citadel to Alumni Gym Saturday evening.



SPARTANS

UNCG stretched its winning streak to six games by winning consecutive games in overtime; the winning streak is the Spartans' longest since the 2007-08 season. A 7-game streak would be the longest since the 1995-96 season.

Sophomore forward David Williams grabbed 18 rebounds against WCU, three shy of the school's Division I record.

Saturday's win over Western Carolina gave the Spartans eight victories for the year, one more than last season.



BULLDOGS

In Saturday's three-point victory against Davidson, true freshman Connor Miller turned in the best game of his young collegiate career as he scored a career-high 12 points and helped lead the Bulldogs to a momentous triumph against the first-place Wildcats. He finished 3-for-3 from the field, 2-for-2 from 3-point range and 4-for-4 from the free-throw line.

The Bulldogs have made at least one 3-point field goal in 616 consecutive games. The last time that Samford did not make a 3-point basket was on Jan. 19, 1991, against UTSA.



MOCS

Senior guard Ricky Taylor (1,145) is now eighth on the Division I era scoring list, just 13 points of sole possession of sixth place behind David Phillips (1,157) and Stanford Strickland (1,153).

Keegan Bell is six assists shy of 500. He is the Mocs all-time leader. Bell leads the SoCon with 6.7 assists per game.

UTC has lost its last three games by a total of five points. The Mocs return to action Thursday when they visit Western Carolina. UTC will travel to Davidson Saturday afternoon.



CATAMOUNTS

Western Carolina leads the conference with 7.9 steals per game. Keaton Cole and Harouna Mutombo both average 1.3 thefts per game.

The Catamounts ranks second in the SoCon with 3.7 blocked shots per game, but do not have a single player ranked among the top 10 for blocks in the league.

Western Carolina hosts Chattanooga Saturday night. The Catawba welcome Georgia Southern to the Ramsey Center Saturday.

COUGARS

The Cougars will participate in their third consecutive ESPN Sears BracketBusters game traveling to Kent State on Feb. 18 in a rematch of the only meeting between the two which came during the 2003 NIT.

The Cougars rank No. 52 nationally in three-point field goals per game (7.8 avg) and No. 29 in personal fouls per game (15.9 avg). They also rank among the top 5 teams in the SoCon in scoring defense (67.1) and field-goal percentage defense (41.8).

CofC will complete a three-game road swing through the SoCon North Division at Elon on Thursday and Appalachian State on Saturday.

BULLDOGS

The Citadel honored the third jersey in program history against Furman, when the school placed Jake Burrows' No. 3 jersey in the rafters alongside Regan Truesdale and Art Musselman's jerseys. Burrows ('40) averaged 11.5 points per game and accounted for 31% of the Bulldogs offense during his playing days.

Junior center Mike Groselle has posted 11 double-doubles this season, moving him within one of Patrick Elmore's single-season school record, 12, that was set during the 1989-90 season.

Groselle and DeVontae Wright have started every game this season.

WILDCATS

Davidson will host Wichita State in a Sears BracketBusters game Feb. 18, at noon in Belk Arena. The game will be televised live on ESPN or ESPN2.

The Wildcats have won 17 of their last 19 SoCon regular-season games, dating back to last season. Davidson has won 15 of its last 16 in Belk Arena with the lone loss coming to Vanderbilt Dec. 7.

Davidson visits Furman Wednesday night. The Wildcats will host Chattanooga Saturday night.

PALADINS

Furman's 69-63 victory at the College of Charleston last Thursday marked the Paladins' first triumph on the Cougars home floor since January 17, 1953.

The Paladins, winners of four of their last five games, have won three consecutive Southern Conference road games for the first time since the 2006-07 season.

Furman plays five of its final eight games at home. The Paladins host Davidson Wednesday night and welcome UNCG to Timmons Arena Saturday afternoon.

EAGLES

Jelani Hewitt's three-pointer at the buzzer gave GSU a 75-72 win over Chattanooga on Saturday night. Hewitt's three gave him 16 points for the game as he was 4-of-8 from beyond the arc.

The Eagles lead the Southern Conference in field goal shooting (.466). Eric Ferguson leads GSU and ranks fourth in the conference from the floor (.571).

Georgia Southern travels to Western Carolina Saturday night. GSU will then host Furman Monday.

Wofford has won six games straight to improve to 15-8 on the season. The 15 wins are tied for the most among SoCon teams this season.

Conference News and Notes

Point Production

Davidson leads the Southern Conference with 78.9 points per game.

- Either Davidson or College of Charleston has led the league in scoring every year since 2006.

Cousy Nominees

Chattanooga's Keegan Bell, College of Charleston's Andrew Lawrence, Davidson's JP Kuhlman and Western Carolina's Trey Sumler have been named to the Cousy Award Watch List. The Cousy Award is given annually to the nation's top point guard.

Athletes of the Month

Antwaine Wiggins was earned December Athlete of the Month honors in men's basketball. Wiggins led College of Charleston to a 5-2 record in the month. He averaged a team-and conference-leading 18.7 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Wiggins tied a career-high with 24 points against his home state Tennessee Vols, including 15 in the second half of play. Wiggins also reached a milestone of his own becoming the 29th player in school history to reach 1,000 career points with his jumper at the 8:32 minute mark of the first half at Louisville on Dec. 20.

The Citadel's Mike Groselle was named the SoCon Athlete of the Month for men's basketball in November. Groselle recorded five double-doubles during the month. The junior center hit at least six field goals in all five games, including a 9-for-12 shooting performance against VMI. He averaged 18.2 points and 11.2 rebounds per game in November.

Making The Leap

The Southern Conference has had four teams improve their win total by a minimum of nine games over the last three years.

- Furman won 22 games last year after posting just 13 wins in 2010.
- Wofford went from 16 wins in 2009 to 26 victories in 2010.
- Both College of Charleston and The Citadel made impressive jumps in 2009. The Cougars went from 16 wins in 2008 to 27 the next year. The Citadel had one of the greatest turnarounds in league history, improving from just six wins in 2008 to 20 in 2009.

Repeat Performance

The Wofford Terriers won the conference tournament in 2011 after winning the title in 2010. It was the 16th time a team had won at least back-to-back conference tournament championships.

NBA Draft

College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock was selected in the second round (#46 overall) of the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. Goudelock became the 107th Southern Conference player taken in the draft and the first Cougar to be selected after competing in the league.

- Seven of the league's 12 members have had at least one player taken in the NBA draft.

Southern Conference News and Notes

Divisional Play

The Southern Conference established the North and South divisions in men's basketball prior to the 1994-95 season. Nine of the 12 current members have won at least a share of a division championship over the last 17 seasons. The Citadel, Furman and Samford, which joined the league in 2008, have not won their division.

- Davidson leads the league with 10 division championships while Chattanooga has won eight.

Turning Two

Wofford won the league's men's basketball championship in 2011 after winning a share of the conference football crown the previous fall, becoming just the fifth school in league history to win both championships in the same year.

- Appalachian State was the last team to win both titles as the Mountaineers accomplished the rare feat during the 1999-2000 school year. Davidson won both championships in 1969-70.
- Duke won both titles in the same year three times during the 1940s, while West Virginia won the SoCon football and basketball championships in the same academic year five different times.

Freshman Honors

UNCG's Trevis Simpson was named to the league's all-freshman team in 2011. It was the third consecutive year that a Spartan was named to the league's all-freshman squad.

- Point guard Kyle Randall was named to the all-freshman team in 2010, while Damian Eargle was selected in 2009.

Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 959, seven points higher than the national average of 952 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores October 25. Nine of the twelve SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for Division I men's basketball programs.

Annual Leaders

Furman limited its opponents to just 64.4 points per game last season. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the SoCon in scoring defense.

- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

Western Carolina's Mike Williams led the league in steals last year (2.0 spg) making it four consecutive seasons that a Catamount has led the Southern Conference in steals.

- Brigham Waginger, now an assistant coach at WCU, led the league in steals three consecutive seasons (2008-10).

College of Charleston led the league with 306 made three-pointers last year, the fifth highest single-season total in league history.

- Elon connected on 285 made triples last season, which tied for the ninth-best single season total.

SoCon Sports Network

This summer the conference office announced a partnership with Public Television to carry an eight-game Southern Conference men's basketball package. The agreement provides state-wide distribution of SoCon games throughout Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina. Additional affiliates in Birmingham, Ala., and Chattanooga, Tenn., have also signed on to carry the league package. The distribution platform will reach more than 12 million homes through 34 affiliates.

- Each of the eight games produced for public television will be streamed online live through ESPN3 as well as the respective public television websites.
