### Quick Hits

- Southern Conference teams are 22-8 at home in non-conference play this season.

- Chattanooga's Keegan Bell recorded the first triple-double in the league this season as he recorded 12 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists at College of Charleston on December 3rd.

- Davidson has made 79.7 percent of its free throw attempts, the third highest average in the nation.

- League play resumes January 5th.

- The Southern Conference Tournament will be held in Asheville, N.C., March 2-5 at the newly renovated Asheville Civic Center. The league's tournament was held in Asheville from 1984-1995.

### Player of the Week

Davidson's Jake Cohen has been named the Southern Conference Player of the Week for all games played November 29 through December 5 the league office announced Tuesday (Dec. 6). The Berwyn, Pa., native averaged 21.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and made 75 percent of his field goal attempts as Davidson beat Wofford (72-69) and Furman (86-65) last week.

Cohen began the week with 26 points and five rebounds as Davidson held on to top Wofford Thursday night. The junior tallied 16 points and seven rebounds against Furman. Cohen made 12-of-16 field goal attempts on the week and was 16-of-18 from the free throw line.

A forward, Cohen ranks second in the league in blocked shots (1.7 bpg) and is fourth in free throw percentage (.875). He has pulled down 2.6 offensive rebounds per game, the seventh-best mark in the conference.

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included Appalachian State's Omar Carter, College of Charleston's Andrew Lawrence, The Citadel's Mike Groselle, Elon's Jack Isenbarger, Georgia Southern's Eric Ferguson, UNCG's Trevis Simpson, Chattanooga's Ricky Taylor, Samford's Tyler Hood, Western Carolina's Harouna Mutombo and Wofford's Kevin Giltner.

**MOUNTAINEERS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Omar Carter scored 18 points and Rodney Milum added 16 off the bench as ASU fell to Minnesota 80-56 Tuesday night in Minneapolis. Milum connected on 5-of-9 attempts from beyond the three-point arc.

Two Mountaineers lead individual statistical categories in the Southern Conference, as Isaac Butts shoots 67.4 percent from the floor, while Andre Williamson blocks 2.0 shots per game.

ASU will host ETSU Saturday afternoon. The Mountaineers travel to face North Carolina December 17.



**COUGARS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

For the fourth consecutive year, CofC has opened Southern Conference play 2-0 with a pair of victories against The Citadel (83-64) on Dec. 1 and preseason North Division favorite Chattanooga in double overtime (87-85) on Dec. 3. The Cougars are one of only 54 NCAA Division I schools with one loss or less on the season with a current 7-1 record. It marks the second-best start in the first eight games of the season in the Bobby Cremins era next to the 2008-09 campaign.

The Cougars rank 31st nationally in three-pointers made (8.4 avg) and have knocked down 10-or-more treys in a single game on three occasions including 12 against UTC on Dec. 3.



**PHOENIX** **NORTH DIVISION**

Elon downed UNCG 80-72 Monday night and is now 6-2. It is Elon's best start to a season since 1991-92.

The Phoenix lead the conference in field goal percentage defense. Elon has limited its opponents to just 36.7 percent shooting through eight games. The Phoenix has held opponents to 27.1 percent from beyond the three-point arc.

Elon hosts Lynchburg College Sunday. The Phoenix travel to Dartmouth December 17.



**BULLDOGS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Barry Smith scored 15 points and grabbed five rebounds as The Citadel fell to Coastal Carolina (80-58) Tuesday night at McAllister Fieldhouse. DeVontae Wright added 10 points for the Bulldogs.

Center Mike Groselle tied Patrick Elmore for the fifth most double-doubles in program history (14) following a 20-point, 19-rebound outing against College of Charleston (Dec. 1).

The Bulldogs are currently 133-100 against teams that comprise the Big South Conference as they face Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern this week.



**SPARTANS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Sophomore swingman Trevis Simpson scored a season-high 27 points in Monday's 80-72 loss to Elon

Sophomore guard Drew Parker currently leads the SoCon in 3-point field goal percentage (.625) after shooting just 30 percent last season.

Junior forward Aaron Bracket averaged 10.3 rebounds in three games last week after moving into the starting lineup.

UNCG travels to face Florida State December 11.



**WILDCATS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

The Wildcats earned conference wins over Furman and Wofford last week. Davidson has won 16 of its last 20 games, dating back to last season.

The Wildcats have won 29 of their last 31 nonconference games at Belk Arena.

Davidson plays host to Vanderbilt Wednesday night. The Wildcats will then travel to face Kansas December 19.



**BULLDOGS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Samford's 2011-12 senior class comprised of Jeffrey Merritt, John Peterson, Kaylin Johnson and Matthew Friday has combined to play in 326 total games, with 120 starts between the four of them. The remaining nine healthy Bulldogs this season have combined to play in a total of 102 games, with 51 starts.

The Bulldogs have made at least one 3-point field goal in 601-consecutive games. The last time that Samford did not make a 3-point basket was on Jan. 19, 1991, against UTSA.

The Bulldogs host Mercer Wednesday night.



**PALADINS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Charlie Reddick scored a game-high 23 points as Furman topped Virginia-Wise 86-66 Tuesday night. Reddick hit five three-pointers in the win while his twin brother Colin added 10 points.

Furman grabbed 23 offensive rebounds against UVA-Wise. The Paladins are second in the league with 14.6 offensive rebounds per game. Furman has pulled down 39 percent of the available offensive rebounds, the highest average in the conference.

Furman welcomes Jacksonville to Timmons Arena Sunday. The Paladins travel to Western Kentucky December 17.



**MOCS** **NORTH DIVISION**

Keegan Bell recorded the third triple-double of the Mocs' DI Era (1977-78) with 12 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists playing 47 of a possible 50 minutes at College of Charleston. The two prior performances were Tim Brooks (16 points, 10 rebounds and 16 assists) at Western Carolina on Feb. 1, 1992, and Gary Robb (13 points, 10 rebounds and 17 assists) against Southern in the opening round of the Dr. Pepper Classic on Dec. 29, 1992.

Bell moved into third-place all-time in assists at Chattanooga passing Casey Long (2004-07). He now has 397 assists and is 18 away from setting a new Mocs mark.



**EAGLES** **SOUTH DIVISION**

The Eagles defeated Appalachian State 73-62 Saturday to move to 2-0 in league play for the first time since the 2005-06 season.

Georgia Southern leads the league in field goal percentage as the Eagles have connected on 47 percent of their shots from the floor. GSU also leads the SoCon in three-point field goal percentage (.397).

The Eagles travel to Eastern Kentucky December 10. Georgia Southern is looking to snap a 21-game road losing streak that dates back to the 2009-10 season.



**CATAMOUNTS** **NORTH DIVISION**

WCU returns to nonconference play this week as the Catamounts travels to Purdue Wednesday night before hosting Kent State on Saturday in Cullowhee. Wednesday's game with the Boilermakers rekindles the 1996 NCAA First Round meeting between the 16th-seeded Catamounts and No. 1 seeded Boilermakers in which the Catamounts nearly pulled the upset.

WCU assistant coach Anquell McCollum was the SoCon Player of the Year on that Catamount squad. WCU is 0-2 all-time against Purdue, falling 10 years after the '96 meeting in 2006.



**TERRIERS** **SOUTH DIVISION**

Senior guard Brad Loesing scored a career-high 24 points as Wofford handed Tulane its first loss of the season (61-50) Tuesday night at the Benjamin Johnson Arena. Kevin Giltner added 16 points for the Terriers.

Wofford has given up just 61.1 points per game, the lowest mark in the Southern Conference.

The Terriers continue their five-game homestand against Virginia-Wise Saturday afternoon. The Terriers will not be back on the road until December 21 at High Point.

## Conference News and Notes

### Familiar Faces

A total of 104 lettermen returned to the Southern Conference in 2011-12. Three of the 12 schools boast at least 10 returnees from last season. League teams average 8.7 returners from 2010-11.

- Conference teams return 33 starters from last year, an average of 2.8 per team. Appalachian State, Davidson, Georgia Southern, UNCG and Chattanooga each return four starters. The Citadel, Furman and Wofford each return just one starter from last year.
- Just two players (Omar Cater - ASU and Omar Wattad - UTC) from the 2011 Coaches All-Conference team return for 2011-12.

### Head Coaches

All 12 Southern Conference head coaches return to the bench in 2011-12. The current head coaches have a combined 71 years of experience within the SoCon.

- Five SoCon coaches have won at least 100 games at their current school. Bob McKillop eclipsed the 400-win plateau at Davidson last season while Samford's Jimmy Tillette has topped 200 wins. College of Charleston's Bobby Cremins, UNCG's Mike Dement, Chattanooga's John Shulman and Wofford's Mike Young all have at least 100 wins at their current school.

### Non-Conference Scheduling

Six of the 12 SoCon teams are scheduled to participate in an exempt tournament this year. SoCon teams will take part in the All-Military Classic (The Citadel), Battle for Atlantis (College of Charleston), Chicago Invitational (Wofford), Hoosier Classic (Chattanooga), Maui Invitational (UNCG) and South Padre Island Invitational (Western Carolina).

### Making The Leap

The Southern Conference has had four teams improve their win total by a minimum of nine games over the last three years.

- Furman won 22 games last year after posting just 13 wins in 2010.
- Wofford went from 16 wins in 2009 to 26 victories in 2010.
- Both College of Charleston and The Citadel made impressive jumps in 2009. The Cougars went from 16 wins in 2008 to 27 the next year. The Citadel had one of the greatest turnounds in league history, improving from just six wins in 2008 to 20 in 2009.

### Repeat Performance

The Wofford Terriers won the conference tournament in 2011 after winning the title in 2010. It was the 16th time a team had won at least back-to-back conference tournament championships.

### NBA Draft

College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock was selected in the second round (#46 overall) of the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. Goudelock became the 107th Southern Conference player taken in the draft and the first Cougar to be selected after competing in the league.

- Seven of the league's 12 members have had at least one player taken in the NBA draft.

## Southern Conference News and Notes

### Turning Two

Wofford won the league's men's basketball championship in 2011 after winning a share of the conference football crown the previous fall, becoming just the fifth school in league history to win both championships in the same year.

- Appalachian State was the last team to win both titles as the Mountaineers accomplished the rare feat during the 1999-2000 school year. Davidson won both championships in 1969-70.
- Duke won both titles in the same year three times during the 1940s, while West Virginia won the SoCon football and basketball championships in the same academic year five different times.

### Freshman Honors

UNCG's Trevis Simpson was named to the league's all-freshman team in 2011. It was the third consecutive year that a Spartan was named to the league's all-freshman squad.

- Point guard Kyle Randall was named to the all-freshman team in 2010, while Damian Eargle was selected in 2009.

### Divisional Play

The Southern Conference established the North and South divisions in men's basketball prior to the 1994-95 season. Nine of the 12 current members have won at least a share of a division championship over the last 17 seasons. The Citadel, Furman and Samford, which joined the league in 2008, have not won their division.

- Davidson leads the league with 10 division championships while Chattanooga has won eight.

### Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 959, seven points higher than the national average of 952 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores October 25. Nine of the twelve SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for Division I men's basketball programs.

### Annual Leaders

Furman limited its opponents to just 64.4 points per game last season. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the SoCon in scoring defense.

- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

Western Carolina's Mike Williams led the league in steals last year (2.0 spg) making it four consecutive seasons that a Catamount has led the Southern Conference in steals.

- Brigham Waginger, now an assistant coach at WCU, led the league in steals three consecutive seasons (2008-10).

College of Charleston led the league in scoring with 76.2 points per game. It was the second straight year the Cougars led the conference in offense after posting 75.0 points per game in 2010. The Cougars' 2,173 points last year was the seventh highest single-season total in league history.

- Davidson led the Southern Conference in scoring four straight seasons from 2006-09.

College of Charleston also led the league with 306 made three-pointers last year, the fifth highest single-season total in league history.

- Elon connected on 285 made triples last season, which tied for the ninth-best single season total.

## SoCon Championship

The 2012 Southern Conference Men's Basketball Championship will be held March 2-5 in Asheville, N.C., at the newly renovated U.S. Cellular Arena. The 2012 tournament will mark a return to Asheville, site of the men's basketball tournament from 1984-95.

### Postseason Play

The Southern Conference tied its league-best mark with four teams in the postseason for 2011. It was the third consecutive year the conference placed four teams in the postseason.

- Wofford made its second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2011. The Terriers fell to BYU 53-49 in the second round in Denver, Colo.
- Furman earned a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. The Paladins fell to former SoCon member East Tennessee State, 76-63 in Johnson City, Tenn.
- Davidson defeated James Madison (85-65) in the College Basketball Invitational but dropped a 102-92 decision at Creighton in the second round.
- After defeating Dayton (94-84) and Cleveland State (64-56) in the NIT, College of Charleston fell at Wichita State (82-75) in the quarterfinals.
