Notes

- The Southern Conference football season opens Saturday with Mercer playing North Alabama in the FCS Kickoff Classic in Montgomery, Alabama, for a Week Zero game. The remaining eight SoCon teams open their seasons next week.
- The 2023 campaign is the 102nd season of SoCon football. Founded in 1921, the SoCon is the fiftholdest Division I conference.
- The Bears enter the season ranked No. 22 in the AFCA FCS Coaches' Preseason Top 25 and No. 20 in the Stats Perform FCS Preseason Top 25.
- Mercer is one of three ranked SoCon squads this preseason. Defending SoCon champion Samford is No. 9 in both the AFCA and Stats Perform polls, while preseason SoCon favorite Furman is No. 6 in the AFCA poll and Stats Perform poll. Chattanooga received votes in both polls.
- Mercer was picked third in the preseason coaches poll and preseason media poll after going 7-4 overall and 5-3 in the SoCon last season, finishing **tied for third with Chattanooga.** The Bears return nine starters on offense, 10 on defense and two on special teams. Wide receivers Devron Harper and Ty James along with linebacker Isaac Dowling earned preseason All-America honors.
- The Bears finished their 2022 season dropping a twoovertime thriller, 50-44, at Samford. Mercer kicked a field goal with seven seconds left in regulation to force overtime before both teams scored a touchdown in the first extra frame, leading to a blocked field by Samford in the second OT and a touchdown run to win the game and clinch the SoCon title.
- North Alabama was picked ninth in the preseason United Athletic Conference poll. The Lions went 1-10 overall and 0-5 in the ASUN last season.
- Five SoCon players are on the preseason watch list for the Walter Payton Award and four are on the watch list for the Buck Buchanan Award. Furman running back Dominic Roberto, Mercer wide receivers Devron Harper and Ty James, Samford quarterback Michael Hiers and Chattanooga running back Ailym Ford are he initial watch list for the FCS offensive player of the year award. Mercer linebacker Isaac Dowling, Chattanooga defensive back Kameron Brown and defensive lineman Jay Person and Western Carolina Antoine Williams are in the running for the defensive player of the year award. Harper, Hiers, Ford, Person and Williams were all finalists for the respective awards last season.

SoCon Points of Pride

- Since it began competing in FCS, the SoCon has amassed the second-most national championships with eight. Also boasting another eight national championship runner-up finishes, the league has 16 title-game appearances, the most among FCS conferences.
- The SoCon prides itself on quality and depth.
- Eight of the nine current SoCon football members have participated in the FCS Playoffs with seven different schools receiving bids since 2016.
- Overall, current SoCon football members have combined for 49 total FCS playoffs appearances.
- Five of the nine SoCon teams appeared in an FCS top-25 national poll in the 2021 season and four of nine did so in the fall 2022 campaign as well.
- The SoCon has had seven Walter Payton Award winners, two Buck Buchanan Award winners and five Eddie Robinson Award winners.
- Sixty-four former SoCon players and coaches have been enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.
- Two former SoCon players participated in the Super Bowl LVII in February. Kansas City Chiefs running back Jerick McKinnon played at Georgia Southern from 2010-13, while Philadelphia Eagles cornerback James Bradberry played at Samford from 2012-15.
- The SoCon broadcasts all of its home games on ESPN+ or ESPN3 and has an over-the-air television network that will air eight games in five southern states in 2023.
- The SoCon has been playing Division I FCS football since the 1982 season. The NCAA created two subdivisions for Division I football beginning in 1978 with the creation of I-A (now FBS) and I-AA (now FCS). The SoCon was shifted from I-A to I-AA along with the Ivy League and Southland Conference following the 1981 season, joining the Mid-Continent, Big Sky, MEAC, SWAC, OVC, and Yankee conferences, along with a number of independents, as I-AA participants.
- The 2022 season was the 101st of Southern Conference football. The SoCon is the fifth-oldest NCAA Division I college athletic association.
