Quick Hits

- League play resumes January 5th.
- Davidson's Nik Cochran leads the nation in free throw percentage (.943).
- UNCG's Trevis Simpson scored 36 points at Miami Monday night, the highest output by a SoCon Player this season.
- Wofford head coach Mike Young has 145 wins as head coach of the Terriers. Young needs just two more wins to tie Lester Hooker (Richmond, 1952-63) for 15th place on the league's all-time wins list.
- The Southern Conference Tournament will be held in Asheville, N.C., March 2-5 at the newly renovated Asheville Civic Center. The league's tournament was held in Asheville from 1984-1995.

Player of the Week

Appalachian State's Andre Williamson has been named the Southern Conference Player of the Week for all games played December 20 through January 2. Williamson averaged 17.5 points and 6.0 rebounds in two games over the holidays as ASU split a pair of games against Campbell and Miami (Fla.).

The senior scored 16 points and pulled down five rebounds as ASU topped Campbell (77-74) on December 22. With the Mountaineers holding a one-point advantage, the Dayton, Ohio native hit two free throws with four seconds left to give ASU its three-point margin of victory. Williamson scored a game-high 19 points and pulled down

seven rebounds in a loss at Miami on December 30. He connected on 13-of-18 (.722) field goals over the two games and was 3-of-4 from three-point range.

Williamson is tied for the league lead in blocked shots (1.8 bpg) and ranks fifth in rebounding (6.9 rpg).

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included The Citadel's Mike Groselle, Georgia Southern's Willie Powers, UNCG's Trevis Simpson, Chattanooga's Ricky Taylor, Samford's Tyler Hood, Western Carolina's Harouna Mutombo and Wofford's Kevin Giltner.



MOUNTAINEERS

NORTH DIVISION

Andre Williamson scored a season-high 19 points in last week's loss at Miami. The senior shot 8-of-11 from the field and pulled in a team-high seven rebounds. On the season, he is shooting 56.4 percent from the floor and averages nearly 10 points and seven rebounds per game while leading the Southern Conference in blocks 1.8 (bpg).

ASU's Dec. 22 win against Campbell moved the team's home record to a solid 4-1 on the season. ASU is 27-8 at the Holmes Center since the start of the 2009-10 season. Following this week's road trip, Appalachian plays nine of its final 15 regular season games at home.



COUGARS

SOUTH DIVISION

Senior Antwaine Wiggins, who currently leads the Southern Conference in scoring (18.2 ppg) became the 29th player in school history to top the 1000-point plateau as he reached the milestone over the holidays. Wiggins now has 1,048 career points.

The Cougars average 74.2 points per game and are just one of three SoCon teams to have a positive scoring margin (+4.8) for the season.

College of Charleston visits Wofford Thursday and travels to Furman Saturday afternoon.



PHOENIX

NORTH DIVISION

Sophomore Lucas Troutman ranks second in the league with 1.8 blocked shots per game. He also ranks 14th in the SoCon with 5.6 rebounds per contest.

Elon has limited its opponents to just 28.4 percent shooting from three-point range, the 27th best mark in the nation. Conversely, Elon averages 8.3 triples per contest, the 41st best mark in the country.

The Phoenix host Georgia Southern Thursday. Elon will welcome Columbia to Alumni Gym Sunday.



BULLDOGS

SOUTH DIVISION

With a 30-point outing against visiting UVA-Wise, freshman guard Ashton Moore became the first Citadel player to net 30 points in a contest since Cameron Wells accomplished the feat on Feb. 12, 2009 against Appalachian State.

Junior center Mike Groselle, who finished with 19 points and 13 rebounds against UVA-Wise, posted his eighth double-double of the season and 16th of his career to move into a third place tie with Craig Burgess and Matt Newman on The Citadel's career double-double list.



SPARTANS

NORTH DIVISION

UNCG's Trevis Simpson scored a season-high 36 points as UNCG fell at Miami (99-89) Monday night. Simpson's 36 points is the highest single-game output of any SoCon player this season. Simpson is second in the Southern Conference in scoring (16.5 ppg).

The Spartans named 28-year old Wes Miller the interim head coach in December. He is the youngest head coach in the nation.

UNCG hosts Davidson Thursday night. The Spartans travel to College of Charleston January 12.



WILDCATS

SOUTH DIVISION

With their 80-74 win over Kansas Dec. 19, the Wildcats defeated a ranked opponent for the first time since topping Wisconsin 73-56 in the 2008 NCAA Tournament. It was Davidson's first win over a ranked opponent in the regular season since defeating South Carolina Jan. 12, 1974. It was the 'Cats first win over a ranked opponent on the road since defeating St. John's 88-84 Jan. 4, 1972.

The 'Cats have won 30 of their last 33 games against non-conference competition at Belk Arena and are 37-7 since 2003.

The Wildcats visit UNCG Thursday.



BULLDOGS

NORTH DIVISION

The Bulldogs have made at least one 3-point field goal in 607-consecutive games. The last time that Samford did not make a 3-point basket was on Jan. 19, 1991, against UTSA.

Samford true freshman Devin McNeil is currently the only Alabama native on the Bulldogs' roster. McNeil, who starred at Central Park Christin High School in Birmingham, Ala., is also the first Birmingham native to play at Samford in 10 years. Prior to McNeil's arrival in 2011, Will Gardner proved to be the last Birmingham native to play for the Bulldogs since the 2001-02 season.



PALADINS

SOUTH DIVISION

Brandon Sebirumbi scored 10 points and pulled down four rebounds Friday at UNC Wilmington. Sebirumbi has scored in double figures in each of his last four games and is one of five Paladins to average at least 9.0 points per game.

Furman has made 75.3 percent of its free throws, the second best mark in the SoCon and the 19th best average in the country.

The Paladins host The Citadel Thursday and welcome College of Charleston to Timmons Arena on Saturday.



MOCS

NORTH DIVISION

The Mocs are among the nation's leader in field goal percentage defense at 38.6 percent. UTC has limited nine of 15 opponents to less than 40 percent from the field including the last four.

Senior Omar Wattad has been hot from three-point range. He has made three or more threes in six straight games hitting 47.2 percent (25-53) during that span, averaging 4.2 made per game.

Keegan Bell enters the week 4th in the nation in assists at 7.6 per game.



EAGLES

SOUTH DIVISION

Five Eagles scored in double figures as Georgia Southern topped Brewton Parker 88-60 Monday night. Eric Ferguson led GSU with 17 points. Willie Powers III recorded 11 points and 11 assists in the win.

The Eagles have been one of the best teams in the league defending the three-point line. GSU has limited its opponents to just 27 percent from beyond the arc, the lowest mark in the league.

Georgia Southern visits Elon Thursday night. The Eagles travel to Davidson Saturday.



CATAMOUNTS

NORTH DIVISION

Western Carolina went 2-1 during the break including snapping a two-game slide with a pair of wins. WCU edged Bradley by a point on the road before returning home for a 19-point victory over mountain-rival UNC Asheville. WCU's three-game stretch closed at North Carolina State, falling 82-55 to the Wolfpack at the RBC Center.

After opening the conference portion of its schedule with back-to-backs wins over UNCG and Samford, the Catamounts return to SoCon action by visiting SoCon North Division favorite, Chattanooga (0-2) on Thursday night (Jan. 5) before hosting Wofford Saturday.



TERRIERS

SOUTH DIVISION

The Terriers knocked off Wake Forest, 56-52 Monday night. It was Wofford's first win over an ACC opponent since the Terriers topped Clemson in 1999.

Wofford is first in the SoCon in scoring defense at 62.1 ppg, but the Terriers are also last in scoring offense at 61.4 ppg.

The Terriers enter SoCon play with an 8-6 mark. This is the fourth time in the last ten seasons Wofford has a winning record heading into January conference action.

Conference News and Notes

Athlete of the Month

The Citadel's Mike Groselle was named the SoCon Athlete of the Month for men's basketball. Groselle recorded five double-doubles in November. The junior center hit at least six field goals in all five games, including a 9-for-12 shooting performance against VMI. He averaged 18.2 points and 11.2 rebounds per game in November.

Divisional Play

The Southern Conference established the North and South divisions in men's basketball prior to the 1994-95 season. Nine of the 12 current members have won at least a share of a division championship over the last 17 seasons. The Citadel, Furman and Samford, which joined the league in 2008, have not won their division.

- Davidson leads the league with 10 division championships while Chattanooga has won eight.

Cousy Nominees

Chattanooga's Keegan Bell, College of Charleston's Andrew Lawrence, Davidson's JP Kuhlman and Western Carolina's Trey Sumler have been named to the Cousy Award Watch List. The Cousy Award is given annually to the nation's top point guard.

Making The Leap

The Southern Conference has had four teams improve their win total by a minimum of nine games over the last three years.

- Furman won 22 games last year after posting just 13 wins in 2010.
- Wofford went from 16 wins in 2009 to 26 victories in 2010.
- Both College of Charleston and The Citadel made impressive jumps in 2009. The Cougars went from 16 wins in 2008 to 27 the next year. The Citadel had one of the greatest turnounds in league history, improving from just six wins in 2008 to 20 in 2009.

Repeat Performance

The Wofford Terriers won the conference tournament in 2011 after winning the title in 2010. It was the 16th time a team had won at least back-to-back conference tournament championships.

NBA Draft

College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock was selected in the second round (#46 overall) of the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. Goudelock became the 107th Southern Conference player taken in the draft and the first Cougar to be selected after competing in the league.

- Seven of the league's 12 members have had at least one player taken in the NBA draft.

Southern Conference News and Notes

Turning Two

Wofford won the league's men's basketball championship in 2011 after winning a share of the conference football crown the previous fall, becoming just the fifth school in league history to win both championships in the same year.

- Appalachian State was the last team to win both titles as the Mountaineers accomplished the rare feat during the 1999-2000 school year. Davidson won both championships in 1969-70.
- Duke won both titles in the same year three times during the 1940s, while West Virginia won the SoCon football and basketball championships in the same academic year five different times.

Freshman Honors

UNCG's Trevis Simpson was named to the league's all-freshman team in 2011. It was the third consecutive year that a Spartan was named to the league's all-freshman squad.

- Point guard Kyle Randall was named to the all-freshman team in 2010, while Damian Eargle was selected in 2009.

Making The Grade

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon men's basketball teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 959, seven points higher than the national average of 952 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores October 25. Nine of the twelve SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average for Division I men's basketball programs.

Annual Leaders

Furman limited its opponents to just 64.4 points per game last season. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the SoCon in scoring defense.

- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

Western Carolina's Mike Williams led the league in steals last year (2.0 spg) making it four consecutive seasons that a Catamount has led the Southern Conference in steals.

- Brigham Waginger, now an assistant coach at WCU, led the league in steals three consecutive seasons (2008-10).

College of Charleston led the league in scoring with 76.2 points per game. It was the second straight year the Cougars led the conference in offense after posting 75.0 points per game in 2010. The Cougars' 2,173 points last year was the seventh highest single-season total in league history.

- Davidson led the Southern Conference in scoring four straight seasons from 2006-09.

College of Charleston also led the league with 306 made three-pointers last year, the fifth highest single-season total in league history.

- Elon connected on 285 made triples last season, which tied for the ninth-best single season total.

SoCon Sports Network

This summer the conference office announced a partnership with Public Television to carry an eight-game Southern Conference men's basketball package. The agreement provides state-wide distribution of SoCon games throughout Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina. Additional affiliates in Birmingham, Ala., and Chattanooga, Tenn., have also signed on to carry the league package. The distribution platform will reach more than 12 million homes through 34 affiliates.

- Each of the eight games produced for public television will be streamed online live through ESPN3 as well as the respective public television websites.
- A full list of affiliates and channel locations is available on the Southern Conference website.

SoCon Championship

The 2012 Southern Conference Men's Basketball Championship will be held March 2-5 in Asheville, N.C., at the newly renovated U.S. Cellular Arena. The 2012 tournament will mark a return to Asheville, site of the men's basketball tournament from 1984-95.

The oldest conference tournament in the nation, the first tournament was held in 1921 and 2012 will mark the 92nd year of the postseason classic.
