Last Week

Appalachian State held North Carolina State to just 242 yards including 36 passing yards in a 23-10 loss in Raleigh, N.C. It marked the fifth time in the last 10 games that the Mountaineers held an opponent to fewer than 100 yards through the air. Jeremy Wiggins recorded six tackles for the Mountaineers with an interception and a 31-yard fumble return. Pierre Banks had nine tackles and Titus Howard added eight stops. Buck Buchanan Award candidate Marques Murrell had a sack and two quarterback hurries. The Mountaineers turned the ball over four times in the game. The crowd of 57,583 at Carter-Finley Stadium was the 10th largest to see Appalachian State play.

Game Notes

The game with James Madison will be the home opener for the Mountaineers. The Dukes won the 2004 national championship with the Mountaineers claiming the 2005 title. The 10 points scored by the Mountaineers at North Carolina State was the fewest points by the Mountaineers since a 7-6 loss to Wofford in 2003. Devon Moore led the Mountaineers in rushing with 35 yards on seven totes last week. Richardson finished with 34 rushing yards. James Madison's Tony LeZotte recorded 14 tackles with an interception in a 14-3 victory over Bloomsburg last week while Maurice Fenner scored the 28th touchdown of his career. In the contest at North Carolina State, Walter Payton Award candidate Kevin Richardson scored the 21st touchdown of his career, tying him with Richie Melchor (1986-88) for seventh on ASU's all-time rushing touchdown list.

Furman from a 10-3 third quarter deficit to post a 17-13 victory over Jacksonville State. Brantley Kendall hauled in a 19-yard pass from Jordan Sorrells with :28 left for the game-winning score. Clay Green rushed for 80 yards and Matt Hardin completed 9-of-17 passes for 128 yards for the Paladins. Josh Moten hauled in four passes for 53 yards as the Paladins won their fourth straight season-opener. Gary Nelson recorded nine tackles and Andrew Jones added eight stops while Austin Holmes intercepted two passes and had seven tackles to pace the Furman defense. In the 2005 match-up, the Paladins won another close contest, posting a 37-35 season-opening win.

Game Notes

Furman has won 11 of the last 12 regular-season games dating back to last season. Furman posted a perfect 7-0 mark last season at Paladin Stadium where it averaged 37.7 points per game. Furman is 15-6 against non-conference competition in coach Bobby Lamb's five-plus years at the helm. Furman will induct five former athletic greats into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame prior to kickoff. The group includes Josh Moore (football), Frank Moses (football), Frank Ford (golf), Lee Fidler (track & field), Gerald Glur (basketball). Redshirt freshman Jordan Sorrells was named the SoCon Freshman of the Week after leading the Paladins win over James Madison on Saturday.

Last Week

The coach Pete Lembo Era at Elon began on a positive note with a 23-20 victory at No. 25-ranked Coastal Carolina. The Chanticleers posted a 9-2 record a year ago and had won 10 consecutive home games. Wes Pope completed 16-of-27 passes for 203 yards and Michael Mayers hauled in eight passes including a 22-yard reception for a score, in Elon's victory. The Phoenix forced four turnovers and were led by Buck Buchanan Award candidate Chad Nkang, who finished with 13 tackles including 2.5 tackles for loss. Nkang was named Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his performance. The victory was the first for Elon in a season-opener since 2003. Elon received 28 votes in the Sept. 4 Sports Network Top 25 I-AA Poll.

Game Notes

The victory over Coastal Carolina snapped a seven-game Elon losing streak. The Phoenix had lost four consecutive and 13 of the last 16 games on the road. Elon has a 1-9 record against Atlantic 10 Conference competition. The lone victory was a 25-23 win over Hofstra in 2003. Towson quarterback Sean Schaefer passed for 262 yards and rushed for two scores in a 30-2 triumph over rival Morgan State in the season-opener. Brian Bradford had 10 tackles in the game and Marcus Edwards added a pair of sacks and forced a fumble.

The Kevious Johnson, who sat out last season, returned to rush for 77 yards including a 73-yard TD run, as Wofford opened the season with a 28-21 victory over South Carolina State. Ben Widmyer completed 7-of-9 passes for 101 yards to lead the Terriers to the win. Kyle Home registered q0 tackles including two tackles for loss and the Wofford defense forced four South Carolina State turnovers. The Bulldogs led 21-14 in the second quarter before the Terrier defense shut out South Carolina State in the second half. After losing 23-20 to Elon last weekend, Coastal Carolina plays another Southern Conference team when the Chanticleers take on Wofford.

Game Notes

Wofford has posted a 30-5 (.857) record at Gibbs Stadium since 2000 including a 4-1 mark in 2005. The Terriers opened the season with a 28-21 victory over South Carolina State at home last weekend. Coastal Carolina amassed 213 yards through the air in the season-opening loss to Elon. a year ago, Wofford allowed 202.6 yards per game through the air. South Carolina State passed for 170 yards against the Wofford defense a week ago. Wofford was 3-1 in non-conference tilts in 2005 with the lone loss coming at the hands of West Virginia, 35-7.

The Citadel opened the 2006 campaign on the road at Texas A&M, falling to the Aggies by a 35-3 score. Duran Lawson completed 19-of-28 passes for 128 yards and rushed for 68 yards on 13 totes to lead the way. Ta'Mar Johnson hauled in six passes for 48 yards for the Bulldogs. Defensively, Joshua Lawson (13 total tackles), Andrew Rowell (12) and Jonathan Vest (12) all registered double-digit tackles. Charleston Southern topped Presbyterian 21-13 in its season-opener. The Buccaneers scored on their first two possessions in recording the victory. In recent years, the Bulldogs have played Clemson (200), Georgia Tech (2001), LSU (2002), Maryland (2003), Auburn (2004), Mississippi (2005) and Florida State (2005).

Game Notes

After winning three straight league championships at Lehigh, coach Kevin Higgins accepted the challenge at The Citadel a year ago. The Bulldogs improved to 4-7 in 2005. Improvement continues off the field as well as the west side (home) of Johnson Hagood Stadium reopens after three years as part of a multi-million dollar renovation. In the 2005 match-up, Duran Lawrence completed 14-of-24 passes for 168 yards and three scores. The Citadel has won all three meetings in the series against its cross-town rival including a 28-14 decision in 2005. All meetings have been played at Johnson Hagood Stadium.

Georgia Southern did not play last week. Central Connecticut State opened the 2006 season with a convincing 34-6 victory over Marist. The Blue Devils rushed for 288 yards in the victory over the Red Foxes. It marked the third straight season-opening win for Central Connecticut State. The Blue Devils play the next four weeks on the road with contests at Georgia Southern, Southern Connecticut State, Albany and St. Peter's.

Game Notes

No. 13-ranked Georgia Southern opens the 2006 campaign against non-league foe Central Connecticut State. Both teams boast new head coaches. Coach Brian VanGorder, who spent last season as an assistant coach with the Jacksonville Jaguars, inherits a team that posted an 8-4 mark a year ago. Former Rhode Island assistant Jeff McInerney began his head coaching career with a 34-6 win against Marist last week. McInerney was co-defensive coordinator at Georgia Southern in 1990-91 under head coach Tim Stowers. The 2006 campaign marks the 25th season of Georgia Southern football. Central Connecticut State is ranked fourth in the Sports Network's Mid-Major Poll.

Running back Eldra Buckley was named Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Week after scoring touchdowns on runs of 63, 11 and 76 yards. He finished the game with 204 yards on 18 carries. Buckley earned Player of the Week honors twice in 2005. Antonio Miller completed 10-of-15 passes in the win. BenJarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 127 yards and two scores to lead Mississippi to a 28-25 win over Memphis. Joseph Doss rushed for 112 yards on 23 totes and Martin Hankins completed 21-of-27 passes for 211 yards and two touchdowns for the Tigers.

Game Notes
 Chattanooga opens the season with three consecutive road contests. After defeating Tennessee Tech last week and playing at Memphis this Saturday, the Mocs play at Western Kentucky on Sept. 16. The home opener is set for Sept. 23 against Georgia Southern at Chamberlain Field. Eldra Buckley's 204-yard rushing performance was the most by a runner this season. It marked the 10th time that a Chattanooga runner amassed 200+ yards on the ground. Chattanooga received 39 votes in the first regular-season Sports Network I-AA Poll.

Two-Minute Drill

- The Southern Conference has seven of eight football schools receiving votes in The Sports Network I-AA National Poll. Appalachian State remains the top program in the country. Furman moved up one spot to fourth, with Georgia Southern beginning its season this week at No. 13. Wofford, Chattanooga, Elon and Western Carolina are all receiving votes.
- Chattanooga's Eldra Buckley led the country in rushing yards last week after rushing for 204 yards against Tennessee Tech. In fact, he was the top rusher in Division I football last week, beating out West Virginia's Steve Slaton, who tallied 203 yards rushing, and Ray Rice from Rutgers, who had 201 yards.
- Saturday will be the battle of national champions in Boone, N.C. Appalachian State, who won the 2005 NCAA I-AA National Championship, hosts James Madison, who won the title in 2004.
- Furman redshirt freshman Jordan Sorrells threw a 19-yard touchdown to seal the win for the Paladins on Saturday. The touchdown was named *The Sports Network's* Play-of-the-Week.
- Five players tallied double-digit tackles last week. Returning All-American Chad Nkang picked up 13 as did The Citadel's Josh Lawson. The Citadel's Andrew Rowell and Jonathan Vest each recorded 12, with Wofford's Kyle Horne picking up 10.

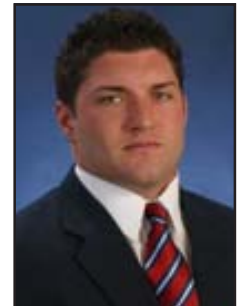
