SoCon Players of the Week



Stephen Curry

Davidson guard Stephen Curry was named Southern Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 21.

The freshman averaged 21.5 points per game, scoring a game-high 27 points against Illinois-Chicago on Nov. 15. Curry made 9-of-10 shots in the second half including three three-pointers as the Wildcats posted a 100-89 victory.

He also scored 16 points in Davidson's game against Missouri.

Son of former Virginia Tech star and NBA standout, Curry scored double figures in each of Davidson's first five games of the season. The 6-foot-1 guard scored a career-high 32 points against Michigan at the John Thompson Classic. He is also averaging 6.6 rebounds per game.



SoCon News and Notes

Following the Winding Road

Chattanooga is in the midst of a five-game road trip covering 11 days. The trips take the Mocs to East Tennessee State (Nov. 15), Florida (Nov. 18), Ball State (Nov. 21) and Las Vegas, Nev. for two games in the Las Vegas Invitational. Coach John Shulman's team returns home to face Berea on Nov. 30 before departing for games at Kentucky (Dec. 5) and the College of Charleston (Dec. 14).

Lighting It Up

Junior forward Kyle Hines tallied 38 points in UNC Greensboro's season-opener on Nov. 11 at Marshall, the most points for a Spartan since 1986.

Eagles Score 116 Points vs. UC-Davis

Georgia Southern's 116-point outburst against UC-Davis on Nov. 12 in the CBE Classic was the most ever for the Eagles in a season-opener. It marked only the second time in school annals that the Eagles reached the 100-point plateau in the season lid-lifter.

Looking to Turn the Tables

UNC Greensboro will look to avoid its first 0-5 start since 1968 when the Spartans face Gardner-Webb on Nov. 21. Mike Dement's team lost the final two contests of the 2005-06 season, pushing the current losing streak to six.

Moving into the Starting Line-Up

After playing in a back-up role as a freshman, sophomore Nichaeus Doaks has earned three starting assignments for Chattanooga this season. The Trenton, Tenn., native has responded by scoring double figures in each game.

Stepping Up

Georgia Southern's Donte Gennie tallied a career-high 22 points in the 2005-06 season finale against Charlotte. But the senior guard opened the 2006-07 campaign by establishing a new career-best. The native of Tallahassee, Fla. scored 26 points against UC-Davis on Nov. 12.

Eric Webb Reaches the 1,000-Point Plateau

Furman's Eric Webb scored 12 points in a 62-59 victory over Bowling Green to become the 36th player in school annals to surpass the 1,000-point barrier.

30-Point Club

Senior guard LeVonn Jordan set a personal best when he tallied 30 of Elon's 44-points against Wake Forest on Nov. 17. He is one of three Southern Conference players to reach the 30-point plateau this season. UNC Greensboro's Kyle Hines scored 38 points against Marshall on Nov. 11 and the College of Charleston's Dontaye Draper scored 33 points in a 64-56 triumph over Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 20 in the third game of the Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Let Youth Be Served

Freshman Stephen Curry leads Davidson in scoring with a 21.2 average this season. The guard played his scholastic basketball at Charlotte (N.C.) Christian.

The King of Swat

Louis Graham set the Georgia Southern school's career mark for blocked shots. With five rejections against UC-Davis, he tied the mark held by Kashien Latham (1998-02). His two blocked shots against Illinois on Nov. 17 established the new school record of 114.

Doubling Up

Robby Bostain recorded double-doubles in two of Furman's first four games of the season. The 6-foot-6 guard registered 26 points with 10 rebounds against Charleston Southern on Nov. 11 in the season-opener before recording 19 points with 10 boards at Bowling Green on Nov. 19.

Appalachian State in its Own League

Appalachian State improved to 28-6 against non-conference competition and the Mountaineers are 25-1 at the Holmes Center against non-league foes since the 2001-02 season.

On the Road Again

The Citadel is concluding a five-game road trip that includes visits to four states in nine days. The stretch began with back-to-back games at Michigan State and Iowa on Nov. 12 and 13 followed by games at Charleston Southern on Nov. 16, at Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind. on Nov. 19 and at Southern California on Nov. 21. The Bulldogs get some respite with home games against Asbury (Nov. 24), South Carolina (Nov. 27), Army (Dec. 2) and Appalachian State (Nov. 4).

Newcomers Making Their Marks

With a youth-laden roster, coach Bob McKillop continues to find a way to win. His young troops are averaging 9.6 three-pointers this season and Davidson is outrebounding opponents by +8.4 in the early-going.

Out of the Starting Gates

Furman's 3-1 start in 2006-07 is the best beginning since the 2001-02 campaign when the Paladins began 6-1. First-year coach Jeff Jackson's troops play at North Dakota State and Vanderbilt the next two games.

A Brand Name

Kellen Brand finished one-point shy of the Appalachian State record for most points by a freshman when he recorded 19 points against North Greenville on Nov. 13 in the season-opener. The freshman from High Point, N.C. played at Leesville Road High School.

Jammin' in the U.S. Virgin Islands

After opening the season at Georgia State on Nov. 11, the College of Charleston took on Villanova, Virginia Commonwealth and Middle Tennessee State in the Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The Cougars open the home portion of the schedule on Nov. 26 when coach Bobby Cremins' team takes on UNC Wilmington.



SoCon News and Notes

SoCon Sports Media Pick Charleston, Greensboro

The Southern Conference Sports media Association (SCSMA) has picked College of Charleston and UNC Greensboro to win the Southern Conference's divisional men's basketball titles for the 2006-07 season.

In a vote of the association's membership, the College of Charleston is picked to win the league's South Division title. The Cougars received 112 total votes including 14 of 20 first-place votes. Following the College of Charleston are Furman (88 total votes including three first-place votes), defending league champion Davidson (85 total votes and three first-place votes), Georgia Southern (74 total votes), Wofford (37 total votes) and The Citadel (23 total votes).

UNC Greensboro earned 110 votes including 14 first place votes as the favorite to win the North Division. Appalachian State (87 total votes and one first place vote) is picked to finish in second place with Chattanooga (81 total votes including three first-place votes), Elon (75 total votes and one first-place vote) and Western Carolina (47 total votes and one first-place vote).

A total of 20 sports media from the Southern Conference footprint took part in the annual SCSMA poll. The media are all members of the Southern Conference Sports Media Association.

Coach: Houston Fancher (Middle Tennessee State, 1988)

Record at ASU: 81-97 (six years)

Overall record: 125-138 (nine years)

Scouting Report: Appalachian State returns all five starters from last year's team that finished 14-16 (6-8 in the SoCon). But the Mountaineers finished with a flourish, winning five of their last seven games to advance to the semifinals of the conference tournament. Coach Houston Fancher's team boasts depth, inside and outside scoring and a team leader in senior All-Southern Conference point guard D.J. Thompson (19.1 ppg).

Chattanooga Mocs

2005-06 Record: 19-13

2005-06 SoCon record: 8-6, second in North Division

Coach: John Shulman (East Tennessee State, 1989)

Record at UTC: 39-24 (two years)

Overall Record: 39-24 (two years)

Scouting Report: Chattanooga has advanced to the Southern Conference title game in each of the last four seasons while averaging nearly 20 wins per season over that span. Coach John Shulman has a solid nucleus with the return of guards Ricky Hood (7.1 ppg, 5.0 rpg), Casey Long (9.6 ppg, 5.2 rpg, 107 assists) and Keddrick Mays (11.0 ppg and a school-record 91 three-pointers). Tyler Troupe, a medical red-shirt in 2006-07, is a highly-touted forward. The bench is deep with talented newcomers.

Elon Phoenix

2005-06 Record: 15-14

2005-06 SoCon Record: 10-4, first in North Division

Coach: Ernie Nestor (Alderson-Broadus, 1968)

Record at EU: 35-45 (three years)

Overall Record: 103-136 (eight years)

Scouting Report: The Phoenix were the surprise team of the SoCon last year, winning the league's North Division with a 10-4 mark. Coach Ernie Nestor, the league's 2006 coach of the Year, will have three starters returning including All-Southern Conference senior forward Chris Chalko (12.6 ppg), senior guard Montell Watson (9.7 ppg), senior guard LeVonn Jordan (7.4 ppg). Elon started 2-9 last season but posted a 13-5 record after Christmas. The Phoenix play at Georgia Tech, Wake Forest, Vanderbilt, VCU and Notre Dame prior to Christmas.

UNC Greensboro Spartans

2005-06 Record: 12-19

2005-06 SoCon Record: 4-10, fifth in North Division

Coach: Mike Dement (East Carolina, 1976)

Record at UNCG: 65-73 (five years)

Overall Record: 272-262 (19 years)

Scouting Report: UNC Greensboro got off to a good start last season by winning seven of its first 10 games. But coach Mike Dement's team struggled the rest of the way and finished 12-19, 4-10 in the Southern Conference. The Spartans return all five starters including All-SoCon center Kyle Hines, a junior, who lead the conference in scoring (19.3 ppg) and rebounding (8.2 rpg) while shooting 62.2 percent from the field. Also returning is senior guard Ricky Hickman, who averaged 18.7 ppg and led the league in steals (2.7). Junior guard Kevin Oleksiak averaged 12.1 ppg a year ago.

Western Carolina Catamounts

2005-06 Record: 13-17

2005-06 SoCon Record: 7-7, third in North Division

Coach: Larry Hunter (Ohio, 1971)

Record at WCU: 13-17 (one year)

Overall Record: 522-241 (26 years)

Scouting Report: Western Carolina made great strides last year under new head coach Larry Hunter. Three starters and four of last year's top six scorers return including junior guard Antonio Russell (13.3 ppg), senior guard Kyle Greathouse (8.1 ppg), junior forward Negus McKenna (6.8 ppg) and junior guard Eric Wilson (6.2 ppg). Western Carolina hasn't posted a winning record in nine years since the 1996-97 squad went 14-13 but a strong freshman class, led by forward Nick Aldridge, give the Catamounts reason for optimism.

College of Charleston Cougars

2005-06 Record: 17-11

Coach: Bobby Cremins (South Carolina, 1970)

Record at CofC: 0-0 (first year)

Overall Record: 454-307 (26 years)

Scouting Report: Expectations are high as legendary coach Bobby Cremins came out of retirement to take over the coaching reins of the Cougars. Cremins began his coaching career at Appalachian State, winning 100 games in six seasons before moving to Georgia Tech. The College of Charleston return four starters from a team that finished with a 17-11 mark in 2005-06. Senior point guard Dontaye Draper averaged 18.5 ppg last season and will be joined by senior Renardo Dickerson (5.7 ppg), sophomore forward Jermaine Johnson (8.9 ppg, 7.5 rpg), junior center Josh Jackson (12.6 ppg) and senior forward David Lawrence (9.3 ppg, 7.0 rpg). Season tickets sold out for the first time since 1998-99 and a new arena, the Carolina First Center (5,000 capacity) is expected to open in 2008.

The Citadel Bulldogs

Coach: Ed Conroy (The Citadel, 1989)

Record at The Citadel: 0-0 (first year)

Overall Record: 41-40 (three years)

Scouting Report: New head coach Ed Conroy, a former player at The Citadel, begins the rebuilding process at his alma mater. Senior forward J'Mel Everhart (10.9 ppg, 7.6 rpg) highlights the three returning starters that include senior guard Donny McLendon (10.2 ppg) and the return of junior guard Travis Smith, who did not play for the Bulldogs last season. The Bulldogs boast more depth than in the past.

Davidson Wildcats

Coach: Bob McKillop (Hofstra, 1972)

Record at DC: 282-213 (17 years)

Overall Record: 282-213 (17 years)

Scouting Report: Davidson lost four starters and seven lettermen from last year's team that finished 20-11, won the Southern Conference Tournament and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. But coach Bob McKillop, winningest coach in SoCon history, is a proven winner. Despite the lack of experience, junior forwards Thomas Sander (6.5 ppg, 6.0 rpg) and Boris Meno (5.6 ppg, 6.6 rpg) will be tough upfront. Junior point guard Jason Richards (4.5 ppg) has experience and will run the team. Rebounding could be a problem but McKillop's over-achieving team surprised the experts a year ago.

Furman Paladins

Coach: Jeff Jackson (Cornell, 1984)

Record at FU: 0-0 (first year)

Overall Record: 21-60 (three years)

Scouting Report: Jeff Jackson enters his first season at the helm after serving as an assistant at Vanderbilt. He inherits a team that posted a 15-13 record and won nine of 12 games in the middle of the season. With the return of four starters and several key reserves, Jackson will have a solid line-up. Senior guard/forward Robbie Bostain (14.1 ppg, 5.7 rpg, 3.4 apg) highlights a line-up that includes senior guard Eric Webb (12.8 ppg), senior guard/forward Gerard Punch (5.5 ppg, 4.4 rpg), senior forward Moussa Diagne (11.8 ppg, 4.9 rpg) and sophomore center Stanley Jones (6.7 ppg). Diagne appears fully recovered from arthroscopic foot surgery last spring.

Georgia Southern Eagles

Overall Record: 258-125 (13 years)

Scouting Report: Only five lettermen, including three starters, return from last year's team that finished atop the Southern Conference's South Division. Led by Player of the Year Elton Nesbitt (21.7 ppg, 3.5 rpg and 89 assists), the Eagles advanced to the NIT. Despite the departure of Nesbitt, the Eagles have solid players in junior forward Louis Graham (11.4 ppg, 7.4 rpg) and senior guard Donte Gennie (12.7 ppg, 91 assists). Georgia Southern has amassed 59 wins in the last three seasons finishing first in the SoCon's South Division twice.

Wofford Terriers

Scouting Report: Wofford boasts a strong perimeter game and coach Mike Young will be looking to fill holes on the inside with the departure of seniors Howard Wilkerson (13.9 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and Tyler Berg (10.9 ppg, 5.9 rpg). Junior guard Shane Nichols averaged 13.8 ppg last season with 93 three-pointers. Matt Estep (4.4 ppg) made 28 treys while playing just 308 minutes in 2005-06. Senior guard Eric Marshall averaged 12.8 ppg and 4.8 rpg a year ago and point guard Drew Gibson (6.8 ppg, 4.0 apg) gives the Terriers a solid nucleus at guard. Young will be looking for a player to step up and solidify the inside game.
