

Trailing 24-3 midway through the third quarter, the Phoenix rallied to close the gap to 24-17. Elon drove into Towson territory in the game's closing minutes before turning the ball over on downs. Towson quarterback Sean Schaefer completed 25-of-36 passes for 248 yards and two touchdowns. Wofford's T.J. Clegg scored on an 8-yard run in the third quarter and caught a 6-yard pass from Wes Pope in the final stanza. Pope completed 24-of-39 passes for 177 yards for the Phoenix. Elon's Karlos Sullivan was named SoCon Freshman of the Week collected seven tackles including five solo stops.

Game Notes

Elon boasts the Southern Conference's top-rated passer in junior Wes Pope. Pope has completed 57.6 percent of his passes for 187.5 yards per game. Junior wide receiver Michael Mayers (16 receptions for 186 yards) and redshirt freshman wide receiver Terrell Hudgins (8 catches for 109 yards) are Pope's favorite targets. Sophomore place kicker Andrew Wilcox is second in the conference in scoring with 10 points (2-of-3 field goals and 4-of-4 extra points). Senior linebacker Chad Nkang is third in the league in tackles with 22 stops. Junior linebacker Danny Boback has 17 tackles, tying him for sixth in the SoCon.

Richardson finished the day with 79 yards on 24 totes. Linebacker Pierre Banks was named I-AA.org All-Star and SoCon Defensdive Player of the Week after registering 16 tackles and forced two fumbles. Following a James Madison first-quarter field goal, the Mountaineers reeled off 21 straight points before the Dukes responded with a TD midway through the fourth quarter.

Game Notes

Appalachian State senior defensive back Jeremy Wiggins is tied for the conference lead in interceptions with two. Junior running back Kevin Richardson has scored three TDs in the first two games of the season, tying him for the conference lead. Junior linebacker Pierre Banks is second in the league in tackles with 25 (11 primary and 14 assists) while senior lineman Marques Murrell leads the league in sacks with two solos and two assists.

Coastal Carolina's (1-1) Tyler Thigpen connected with Jerome Simpson with a 45-yard scoring strike with 2:35 as the Chanticleers posted a 41-38 victory over Wofford (1-1) before 6,493 fans in Spartanburg, S.C. Coastal Carolina amassed 510 yards total offense and the Terriers rolled up 335 yards on the ground. Wofford's Nick Robinson booted a 46-yard field goal, the longest of his career in the game.

Game Notes

Junior running back Kevious Johnson is third in the Southern Conference in rushing, averaging 98.5 yards per game. Senior place kicker Nick Robinson, who booted 2-of-7 field goal attempts in 2005, has made three of his first four attempts in 2006 including a 46-yarder a week ago. South Carolina has won 14 of the 16 games played in Columbia and the Gamecocks are 6-0 vs. the Terriers at Williams-Brice Stadium. South Carolina has won the last 13 games in the series dating back to 1918. A crowd of 77,922 witnessed the last match-up between Wofford and South Carolina in 2001, the second-largest crowd to ever witness a Wofford football game.

GSU's Erk Russell Passes Away

A crowd of 2,000 people at Paulson Stadium paid their final respects to Georgia Southern's legendary coach Erskine 'Erk' Russell. Coach Russell died Friday morning (Sept. 8). He was 80 years old.

Russell, who coached the Eagles to three NCAA Division I-AA National Championships, led the team from 1981-89, after spending 17 years as one of the nation's top defensive coordinators at the University of Georgia.

The legendary coach's final record at Georgia Southern was a remarkable 83-22-1. He never had a losing record during his tenure at Georgia Southern and took the Eagles to the playoffs each of his final five years. Coach Russell saw his Eagles win the 1985, 1986 and 1989 NCAA I-AA National Championship and advance to the title game in 1988.

"The entire Georgia Southern community is deeply shocked and saddened by Erk's passing," said Georgia Southern President Bruce Grube in a statement Friday. "Just yesterday (Thursday), he spent the afternoon with this year's team, giving our young players a moment they will treasure for the rest of their lives," he added.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Russell held bachelor's and master's degrees from Auburn. He played football, basketball, baseball and tennis for the Tigers, earning 10 varsity letters. Russell was the last four-sport letterman in Auburn history.

Starting with Saturday's game the current Eagles' football team wore a sticker on the back of their helmets with Erk's name on it.
