Led the Mountaineers to a 40-7 win over Furman on Saturday. The running back compiled 173 yards on the ground and scored four touchdowns. His four scores were the most by a Mountaineer since Jimmy Watkins ran for four in ASU's opening round playoff game against William & Mary in 2001. His 173 yards marks the second-highest rushing output for his career and was his 10th career 100-plus rushing game. His 27 carries was also the most of his career. Richardson moved to fifth on the ASU all-time rushing list with 2,601 career yards and is the only Mountaineer to have two of the top five scoring seasons in ASU history.

Game Notes

Wofford has won three of the last four match-ups with the Eagles including a 21-17 victory in 2005. The Terriers have won two straight games while the Eagles have dropped back-to-back decisions. Wofford continues to lead the SoCon in rushing with 247.8 yards per game (35.5 yards more than any other league team). Georgia Southern boasts a balanced offense with 182.5 yards on the ground and 193.4 yards through the air. The Terriers rank sixth in total offense while the Eagles are second. During the losing streak, the Flames have been outscored 103-77. Rashad Jennings leads the Flames in rushing with 828 yards (103.5 yards per game) with eight TDs. Western Carolina's Darius Fudge is second in the SoCon in rushing, averaging 100.2 yards per game.
