Kevin Richardson Appalachian State Junior Running Back Elizabethtown, N.C.

Led the Mountaineers to a 40-7 win

over Furman on Saturday. The running back compiled 173 yards on the ground and scored four touchdowns. His four scores were the most by a Mountaineer since Jimmy Watkins ran for four in ASU's opening round playoff game against William & Mary in 2001. His 173 yards marks the second-highest rushing output for his career and was his 10th career 100-plus rushing game. His 27 carries was also the most of his career. Richardson moved to fifth on the ASU all-time rushing list with 2,601 career yards and is the only Mountaineer to have two of the top five scoring seasons in ASU history.

Defense



Corey Lynch Appalchian State Junior Defensive Back Cape Coral, Fla.

Anchored the Mountaineer defense on Saturday,

including a key blocked field goal in the first half. The safety blocked his third field goal in four weeks in the win over Furman. With the game tied 7-7 with less than two minutes left in the first half, Lynch blocked Scott Beckler's 31-yard field goal attempt, recovered the ball and ran it back 79 yards for a touchdown, giving ASU the lead at halftime. Lynch also had four tackles on the day.



James Gonsoulin Wofford Junior Defensive End Jenks, Okla.

Recorded a careerhigh eight tackles against Western

Carolina on Saturday. The defensive end also had two and a half sacks and three and a half tackles for loss in the win. He had a solo sack for a loss of 14 yards in the second quarter and an eight-yard sack in the fourth quarter. He also assisted on a sack for a loss of six yards. Gonsoulin anchored the Terrier defense that allowed only 277 yards of total offense.

Nolan Ward Elon Freshman Strong Safety Brandon, Fla.

Racked up a career-high seven tackles in the Phoe-

nix win over Chattanooga. The strong safety had five solo stops to go along with an interception and a pass deflection. His interception of a Matt Lopez sideline pas ended the final Chattanooga drive on a first and 10 during the final seconds of the game. It was Ward's second career interception.
